**SECRETARY'S REPORT**

When I joined the Victorian Amateur Walkers Club in 1966, it was a predominantly male club with most walkers being in the Open age group. The membership was less than 100 and most racing days saw 30-40 walkers in attendance. To give a comparison, over the last 6 years, our membership has been as follows

This year, our membership was split between 141 competitive members and 14 non-competitive members who were in various categories – general supporters, officials and life members. The 141 competitive members were split into age groups (as based on our age cutoff date of 1 October 2005) as follows

Nowadays we have slightly more female than male competitive members and numerical strength in most age groups. A number of these members are country based walkers who join us as a 'second claim' walking club and compete with us when they can. Our weekly racing numbers varied between 50 and 70 competitors throughout the winter and

this means that races are always keenly contested. Additionally, many of our top walkers compete regularly with the club, providing strong role models for our younger walkers.

This year, the Committee oversaw the purchase of some necessary items of equipment – 6 new stopwatches, a digital clock and a PA system. I am pleased to report that these have all been put to good use throughout the year. We also unveiled a new Commonwealth Games Honour Board. This board was made by life member Bob Gardiner, with funds donated by some club members, and is a fine addition to our other Honour Boards.

Our club archives continue to grow and this year, we have been able to add some further biographies of former club members and oversee the creation of quite extensive all time ranking lists (special thanks to Brent Vallance for doing much of the research for these lists). Also, I took on the official role of historian for Racewalking Australia and now look after much of the archival material collected by the late Peter Waddell. The foresight of people like Bert Gardiner and Peter Waddell means that now we, as a Track & Field discipline in Australia, have a rich historical base on which to develop our sport.

Our winter season was shorter than usual due to the late scheduling of the Australian Grand Prix - we could not schedule our first races at Albert Park until mid May. We scheduled races at Braeside Park and East Burwood in the interim but a collective sigh of relief was heard by all when we finally returned to our home turf. I meet regularly with the Parks Victoria Albert Park staff, being our representative on the Albert Park Sports Users group. We continue to have a very constructive relationship with the Parks Victoria staff and are grateful for their support and understanding.

As usual, VRWC hosted its usual share of championships during the course of the year. These included

- Four of the Five days of Athletics Victoria roadwalking championships
- The Athletics Victoria Schools Roadwalking championships
- The Victorian Masters Association Roadwalking championships
- Our own VRWC club championships.

We also scheduled the second of the two annual Racewalking Australia carnivals in August 2006. Some 160 competitors raced over the set distances in what was deemed to be a very successful day. We also participated in the annual Racewalking Australia Carnival in June and over 60 walkers (our largest team for many years) made the trip and competed with distinction. In these carnivals, we combine with Ballarat, Barwon and Geelong Walkers clubs to field a strong unified Victorian front.

VRWC also won, for the third year in a row, the annual Racewalking Australia Challenge in July. Overall, the Racewalking Australia honours for the year were split between VRWC and NSWRC with whom we have a strong but friendly rivalry.

Our Masters walkers led by example and we are privileged to have more than our fair share of champions in the club. A number of new World and Australian Masters Records were set during the year by Brenda Riley, Heather Carr and Andrew Jamieson.

We are also privileged to have as club members some of Australia's current top walkers, including Nathan Deakes, Duane Cousins, Jared Tallent, Chris Erickson and Kellie Wapshott. These 5 walkers all represented Australia with distinction during the year in the Commonwealth Games and/or the Racewalking World Cup.

These elite club members are backed up by a large pool of talented youngsters who will hopefully provide the next generation of champions. Our challenge is to provide a nurturing environment in which they can continue to develop and hone their walking skills until they are ready to take over the mantle.

And, of course, there are the many club members who race for the love of the sport and to maintain their health and well being in a constructive and enjoyable way. All are vitally important to the club.

Communication continues to be well handled. This year, the Heel & Toe newsletter was published 44 times in 52 weeks, probably some sort of record! With Ray Smith providing photographs and with a number of people providing input, it was circulated to an ever growing distribution list of some 200 email addresses. Stuart Cooper also fed our results to the Press each week and it was great to see the Monday morning stats in the Age and Herald-Sun newspapers once again.

It takes many people working together to run a successful club like ours. It is always difficult to single out particular people but I would like to mention

- Harry, Bob, Ross and the others who set up and dismantled the equipment each week
- Barb, Joyce and Kate who provided for us all in the canteen and kitchen

- Michael and Ron who took the race entries and look after all money matters
- Paul, Lou, Ian, Stuart, Harry, Mike, David, Bob, Mark and the many helpers and parents who looked after the timekeeping and recording
- Mark who did the handicapping and ran the coaching sessions
- Ray who manned the camera, showed the results after the race and forwarded me photos for the newsletter
- Gordon, Peter, Lloyd and Michael who formed the backbone of our judging panel and who were on deck every week

My apologies to anyone I have missed. There are so many people who make our club tick.

It would be remiss of me if I did not single out for special comment the fine work being done by AIS walks coach Brent Vallance. He has worked hard to nurture walking in the wider Australian community. This year has seen a number of Victorian walkers benefit from his help

- Kellie Wapshott taking up an AIS scholarship
- Duane Cousins, Tom Barnes and Chris Erickson being provided the opportunity to train at Threadbo
- Jessie Palfreyman being part of the Youth Camp in Canberra

Thank you one and all for making this year such a successful one. I look forward to returning next year and helping us become an even better club.

<b>TREASURER'S REPORT 1/10/2005 – 30/9/2006</b>
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Welcome to the Treasurer's Report for the year ended 30/9/2006. It has been a very busy year with large increases in both revenue and expenses.

Due to a shortened year by four to five weeks, there were potential losses of revenue of \$800.00 from race fees and \$400.00 from the canteen. Despite this loss in revenue, the club still managed an increase in race fees over last year's figure while the Canteen managed a surplus of \$632.00. Congratulations to the ladies in the Canteen for their outstanding efforts. Subscriptions also showed a very commendable increase. Let us keep our fingers crossed that we can maintain or increase subscriptions, race fees and the canteen and the club will continue to be financially sound.

The stock of vests and beanies is gradually decreasing. At present, if all stock were sold, a profit of \$100.00 would be realised. These items have been selling for four years.

The club did not receive any money for running a major event this year. The revenue from the Federation Carnival on 6/8/2006 was \$2065.00. Expenses (Medals, Trophies, First Aid, Catering, etc) totalled \$1700.79, which means a profit of \$364.21. Not to mention all the hard work behind the scenes in organising this major event.

For the first time, all interest from our bank accounts and term deposits has been included in the accounts, as requested by the auditor. Without all the interest listed, the accounts would show a loss of a few hundred dollars.

As for expenses, some will balance against various revenues. During the year, several items of equipment were purchased. A Stop Clock (\$770.00) and a Microphone/PA Audio (\$759.00) were purchased out of Canteen Funds accumulated over the years. Many thanks to the Ladies in the Canteen for their marvellous efforts.

Although the figure for Trophies/Medals/Engraving is high, \$1012.00 relates to the Carnival on 6/8/2006 and there are medals in stock for future use. No cause for concern.

All other regular expenses like rentals, gas, telephone, affiliations, stationery, etc remain constant, which is good news. Hopefully, there will be no increases in the near future.

I look forward to serving another term as Treasurer.
