Here are the fine details:

Chris Erickson might be in hard training for the Australian 50km Olympic Qualification event at Fawkner Park in 3 weeks time but he took time out from his preparation to contest the 5000m walk at the Athletics ACT Interclub competition in Canberra last Friday evening, leading from the front in fine style. With the temperature still very warm after a 30°C day, he powered through to a 1 sec PB time of 19:24.85 and is obviously in the form of his life.

18 year old **Kristie Goznik** is having a wonderful season in Adelaide. On Saturday she took 32 secs off her 5000m best with a fine 24:16.55 and the week before she PB'd over 3000m with 13:59.56. With a 10km PB of 50:59, she will be a serious contender for the 2012 World Race Walking Cup U20 team.

13 year old **Jemima Montag** continues to improve, setting new VRWC 3km Road Walk club records for the U14-U17 divisions with her time of 14:16 on Saturday. This was 6 secs improvement on her 14:22 track time which got her Walker of the Week a few weeks ago and she looks set to challenge the 14 minute barrier very soon.

VRWC SUMMER CHAMPIONSHIPS, MIDDLE PARK, SUNDAY 20 NOVEMBER 2011

After such a wet Saturday, Sunday turned on superb racing weather at Middle Park as the 42 walkers in attendance competed in our Summer championships. With the top end of our usual course under water, we were reduced to the 1km loop at the bottom section but that is a fast course and overall times were good. The 20km events kicked off at 8:30AM and former NZ Olympian Scott Nelson showed the way with a superb performance, racing at 5mins per km pace throughout the middle sections of the race and only slowing in his final 3km. His final time of 1:40:05 saw him just under 5 minutes clear of M65 legend Andrew Jamieson whose time of 1:44:50 was second to none. Simon Evans was the other gun performer, beating his PB by nearly 5 minutes with an excellent 1:51:31 while Michelle Thompson, our lone female entrant, walked a consistent 2:02:29. It was good to see 6 competitors attacking such a long distance.

ATHLETICS VICTORIA SHIELD ROUND 5 - SATURDAY 19 NOVEMBER

It was a wet and threatening Saturday in Victoria but the weather cleared to give us a window of opportunity to run our Athletics Victoria Shield competition in all but one of our six regions. Only the Metro East competition at Ringwood was cancelled.

AV Shield - South East Region - Round 5, Ballam Park Athletic Track, Frankston

First to Frankston where Aaron Tam 15:16.1 easily won the 3000m walk with a 16 sec PB. There is some confusion about the correctness of the times further down the list. Alan Lucas emailed me to say

I was just looking at the times on the AV website for the South East region and there are a number of errors but I don't know how many so you might like to mention this in H&T. Somebody (possibly more than one) must have failed to collect a disc at the finish, meaning everyone after that person has moved up one place on the timekeepers list. When I crossed the line I was given disc 16 but when I look at the results sheet there are only 13 names showing as having finished before me.

I think it means I can take the 1500m times as correct and Aaron Tam's winning time in the 3000m but I can't necessarily guarantee all the 3000m times further down the list.

In the 1500m walk, the pace was on as Nathan Brill, walking by invitation, recorded a very fast 6:03.0. Behind him, Billy Allamby 6:42.7 and Stephanie George 6:59.2 both walked excellent PBs. Great walking!

A group of our elite walkers joined the Athletics ACT Summer Interclub competition last Friday evening with 5000m and 3000m walks on offer. It had been a hot day (30°C) in Canberra but the 6PM start time meant that the track was partially in shade and the men in particular were in fine form. Sean Fitzsimons, Brendon Reading and Adam Rutter led out with a 1:30 first lap (scorching pace) with Chris Erickson starting more conservatively a few secs back. Brendon and Sean were rewarded with 3000m PBs of 11:56.73 and 12:10.55 respectively. Chris had caught them by mid race and then extended his lead over Adam Rutter, powering through to a PB of 19:24.85. Adam also broke the 20 min barrier with 19:52.34.

In the women's events, Beki Lee walked excellently for her 5000m time of 23:14.05 ahead of Rachel Tallent with 23:48.17 while Zuzi Schindlerova of the Slovak Republic (out here for a 6 months training block) walked an excellent 3000m time of 13:19.29.
