TIM'S WALKER OF THE WEEK

Last week's Walker of the Week was South Australian **Kim Mottrom** whose 10km time of 44:19 took over 2 minutes off his PB of 46:35. Kim was our walker of the week back in May and he continues to improve as the season progresses.

This week has been one of the highest quality weeks ever in Australian racewalking. Highlights include

- Victorian **Andrew Jamieson** who broke his own **M65 20km World Record** on Saturday at Middle Park with a superb time of **1:40:13** (which ranked at 100.12% on the Masters Graded Tables).
- Western Australian **Lyn Ventris** who broke the **W55 20km World Record** by an amazing 10 minutes in Perth last Saturday her time of **1:43:11** ranked at 99.22% on the Masters Graded Tables.
- 23 year old South Australian **Tanya Holliday** who won her State 10km title in a huge PB time of **43:58**, a time that propels her to fourth in the Women's 10km All-Time Australian ranking list.
- Victorian ultra run champion Barry Loveday who tried himself out as a walker in the Australian 48 Hour Track
 Championships (his first ever walk) at Caboolture in Queensland and finished second overall against the runners with
 283.500km, the longest 48H distance ever walked in Australia and some 3 km further than Peter Bennett's current
 Australian record.
- QRWC president **Peter Bennett** who also walked in Caboolture last weekend, finished 2nd overall and first male in the Queensland 24 Hour Track Championship with **185.293km** to set a new Australian M55 record (and he was only 1km outside his best ever Australian walk).

I also heard there was some superb walking in Queensland over the weekend with **Dane Bird-Smith 38:55**, **Rhydian Cowley 40:16** and **Nick Dewar 42.41** – all big PBs. Alas, no official results yet so I can't include them in this week's voting.

AV AND VRWC CHAMPIONSHIPS, MIDDLE PARK, SUNDAY 29 JULY

Last Sunday morning saw the annual Victorian Roadwalking championships at Middle Park with some 65 walkers contesting events ranging from VRWC U9 2km to AV Open Men 30km. Stuart Cooper tells me it was probably our coldest day so far this winter but luckily the rain held off during the carnival. The Victorian Championships took centre stage with the first event to kick off being the Open Men's 30km championship. Simon Evans won again this year and his time of 2:49:19 was over 5 minutes faster than his winning time from last year. The minor medals went to Terry O'Neill 3:04:54 and James Christmass 3:18:17 in his first walk further than 20km.

Finally to our VRWC Open races which included some significant highlights. We had a 3 Hours Open Walk in conjunction with the Victorian 30km event and Simon Evans went on after finishing his 30km to record a final distance of 31.399km. Karyn O'Neill also finished the 3 hour walk in the tough conditions – her distance a very good 5.000km. Others to do well in the shorter distance events included Josh Kaiser (a 10km PB of 49:40), Jason Kozica (24:26 for 5km) and Jake Keller (a 5km PB of 27:39). But the real highlight was provided by Masters surpremo **Andrew Jamieson** whose 20km time of **1:40:13** bettered his own **M65 World Record** of 1:41:27 by over 1 minute. Mark Donahoo tells me that Andrew's age graded performance comes out at 100.12%! There is no stopping him as he continues to rewrite the record books.

2012 AUSTRALIAN 48H AND QUEENSLAND 24H TRACK CHAMPS, CABOOLTURE, QLD, 27-29 JULY

Last weekend saw the annual Australian 48 Hour and Queensland 24 Hour Track championships which are always held over a 500m road circuit around the Caboolture Historical Village. It is called a track championship even though it is on a road course as ultra rules designate any measured course of 500m or less to be 'track.

The events are principally running championships but we often see walkers in action and this year was no exception with 4 walk participants. Victorian ultra run champion **Barry Loveday** tried himself out in the 48 Hour walk (his first ever walk) and finished second overall against the runners with 283.500km, the longest distance ever walked in Australia and some 3 km further than Peter Bennett's current Australian record. QRWC president **Peter Bennett** finished 2nd overall and first male in the 24 Hour track championship with 185.293km to set a new Australian M55 record (and he was only 1km outside his best ever Australian walk). Victorian **Steve Jordan** also walked in the 24H race, recording a final distance of 115.635km. The final walker was QRWC member **Sarah Vardanega** who finished 12th in the 6 Hour walk with 48.242km. She then continued on to the 50km mark, done in 6:12:40 for a new Queensland record. So it was a good weekend for the small group of walkers.

AUCKLAND ROADWALK CHAMPIONSHIPS DEVONPORT, NEW ZEALAND, SUNDAY 29 JULY

The Auckland Racewalking Road Championships were held on Sunday at Ngataringa Bay, Devonport. The following report was taken from their website:

Three graded events were held; Senior Mens and Senior Womens walk of 8 * 1.25km laps covering 10km's, Masters Men and

Masters Women also competing over 10 km's and Junior Men and Junior Women U/16 and U/19 competing over 5kms. In a stunning performance, **Brooke Cowsill** of Racewalking Auckland produced the 5th fastest time ever recorded by a New Zealand women to win the 10km event in a personal best time of **48:37**, beating the Internationally ranked Men's Master Mike Parker by 1:20. The consistency of her laps was stunning as she walked each lap within 9 seconds of each other and produced a negative split in going through the second 5 km 13 seconds faster than the first to record 24:25 at halfway and finish with an impressive 24:12. Jared Free of Waitakere in his first full season of competitive racewalking won the Junior Mens U16 in an impressive 29:45

LONDON (GBR): In 1990, Serbian high jumper Dragutin Topic broke the world junior record and became the European champion

in his event while still a teenager. Turn the clock forward 22 years and he is preparing to compete in a record-equalling sixth Olympic Games. The only male track and field athlete to have competed in six Games so far has been the Angolan distance runner Joao N'Tyamba, who was on the start line of various events from 1988 to 2008, but is absent from London 2012. Topic and the Spanish walker **Jesus Angel Garcia** are set to match that feat in the coming days.
