# TIM'S WALKER OF THE WEEK

Last week's Walker of the Week was Lyn Ventris for her W55 World Best time of 49:15, done the previous Sunday in Perth. It is now the fourth time Lyn has rewritten this record. She set the original record at the Australian Masters Games Adelaide in October last year with 50.32. She then broke it again at the World Masters Indoor Championships in Finland in April with 49.59. She then broke it again on July 15 in Perth with 49.34 and then last Sunday she bettered it again with a time of 49.15.

And Lyn was one of the walkers to excel again this week. Here is the shortlist for voting - since there were so many top performances in Adelaide, I had to restrict the nominations by focusing on those walkers who did either a PB or a record along the way.

- 55 year old WA walker Lyn Ventris took bronze in the Australian Open Women 20km championship in Adelaide in a time of 1:40:41, bettering her own W55 World Record of 1:43:11 (done in July) by an extraordinary 2:32. Her Masters Age Graded calculation comes out at 101.67% wow! Along the way, Lyn powered through the 10km mark in 49:32, not far outside the W55 10km World Record she set last week.
- 13 year old NSW walker **Jasmyn McDonald** won the U14 Girls 3km in convincing style, her time of 14:31 a 12 sec PB. She also won the U14 2km in the LBG carnival in Canberra in June and is the outstanding U14 girl walker in Australia.
- 14 year old NSW walker **Tyler Jones** won the U16 5km in a 26 sec PB of 23:33. He also won the U16 3km walk in Canberra and, like Jasmyn, has also had a fantastic winter.
- 15 year old Victorian walker **Zoe Boldiston** bounced back from 12 months out of the sport with back problems, winning the U16 5km walk in a 49 sec PB time of 24:38. She was our top U13/U14 age group walker from 2010 to early 2011 before being sidelined and she has emphatically announced her return to top flight competition.

With around 150 walkers in attendance, it was a successful carnival in every way. And now onto the results. The first events to kick off at 8PM were the Open 20km championships. We were very excited to see Olympians Jared and Claire Tallent on the start line but on this occasion it was Claire who provided the highlight, winning the women's title with an excellent 1:31:12, some 7 minutes ahead of Cheryl Webb with Lyn Ventris taking the bronze with 1:40:41 and breaking her own W55 World Record. Jared was happy to just participate, racing in third place for some 12km before stepping off the track. By that stage, Dane Bird-Smith and Rhydian Cowley had cleared out and they stormed home to take first and second places with excellent times of 1:23:28 (just outside Dane's PB) and 1:24:34 (a big PB for Rhydian). Behind them the next generation of young walkers showed their potential with a whole string of times in the low 1:30's while M65 World Record Holder Andrew Jamieson showed he still has it with his 1:41:52 (98.52% age graded performance).

The final events, the U16 and U18 5km championships, provided the morning's dramas. First in the U16 Boys' event, Tyler Jones, Tom Doyle and Billy Allamby were locked together for the first half of the race until a knee injury forced Billy to slow. Tyler then applied the screws, forcing a winning break to his NSW teammate, 23:33 as against 23:36. It was yet another win for Tyler who dominates this age group. Then in the U18 5km race, Stephanie George was well in front and looking set for victory, only to slow and surrender the lead to Jasmine Dighton - the final result Jasmine first in 26:05, Stephanie second in 26:34. Finally in the U16 Girls' event, Zoe Boldiston and defending champion Jemima Montag surged to a big lead and looked set for a great battle when, at the half way mark, Jemima lost contact, withdrawing soon after. This left Zoe a long way in front and assured of victory. She slowed considerably in the last 2km but her winning time of 24:38 was still a big PB and a big comeback after a horrible last year of injuries. Clara Smith took second in 24:46 and was closing rapidly on Zoe. She too walked an excellent race. It was a fitting way for the championships to end.

# SAMA ROADWALKS, ADELAIDE, SATURDAY 25 AUGUST

## 2013 FISU SUMMER UNIVERSIADE FORMAT CHANGES

Next year sees the 27<sup>th</sup> Summer Universiade which will be held in Kazan. Russia, in early July. These championships, held every two years, always include 20km road walks but next year the racewalks (and half-marathons) will be extended from individual to teams events. This is a major change and does raise the possibility of more walkers getting the chance to represent Australia in major international competition.

As yet, Athletics Australia has not put out its own Selection Policy but the Kazan website (see <u>http://www.kazan2013.com</u>) does spell out the basic details from a FISA perspective. To quote:

The athletics qualification period starts at 01/01/2012 and ends 10 days before the first competition day.

Each country is authorised to enter in:

• an individual event: two (2) athletes, both of whom have achieved the entry standard for the event in the year before the Universide or one (1) athlete who has not achieved the entry standard;

- a team event: one (1) team
- For 10.000m for men and women, a maximum of three (3) athletes, all of whom have achieved the entry standard of the event in the year before the Universiade or two (2) who have not achieved the entry standard.
- For the half-marathon and 20-km walk for men and women, a maximum of five (5) athletes, all of whom have achieved the entry standard of the event in the year before the Universide or three (3) who have not achieved the entry standard.
- Each delegation entering a race walk or half-marathon team shall take part with a minimum of three (3) and a maximum of five (5) athletes.

It has set 20km roadwalk qualification standards at 1.26.30 (men) and 1.43.00 (women). Of course, AA may choose tougher standards so stay tuned for further news as it becomes available.
