TIM'S WALKER OF THE WEEK

Last week's Walker of the Week Victorian runner/walker **Barry Loveday** who won the walk division in the Victorian 6 Hour Track Championship in Moe on Sunday. His distance of **57.090km** was the third best ever by an Australian and was an excellent performance for such a new walker. The sky is the limit for this talented ultra athlete, whether it is in walking mode or running mode.

This week, there were a number of outstanding walks at the Australian All Schools in Hobart and I have decided to focus on two walkers who have not featured before in my Walker of the Week. They were the winners of the U16 titles and both are relatively new to racewalking at this level. They are my joint winners for this week.

- Victorian **Emmet Brasier** won the Boy's U16 3000m walk in Hobart in a 19 sec PB time of 13:28.56. He has been walking seriously for only 2 years and has yet to do a winter season. Last December, in his first national walk at the Schools champs in Brisbane, he was second in the U14 3000m in 14:52. This summer, he has been blitzing the fields in Melbourne Shield competition and his fine walk in Hobart is not unexpected.
- Queenslander **Clara Smith** is similarly placed. She has been walking at the State level for less than 18 months and, like Emmet, her first national walk was in Brisbane at the All Schools a year ago. On that occasion, she was also second in the U14 3000m, her time of 14:48. Her time last weekend of 13:22.87 was also a huge PB and set a new meet record.

Both these walkers are currently U15 so unfortunately they are not eligible to represent us at next year's World Youth Champs (they are still a year too young) but they, like Jemima Montag, will get their opportunity in 2015. I can hardly wait!

AUSTRALIAN ALL SCHOOLS T&F CHAMPIONSHIPS, HOBART, 30 NOV - 2 DEC

First a few words of explanation about the Australian All Schools T&F Championships were held last weekend in Hobart. This meet used to be the biggest youth meet on the yearly calendar and included all age groups from U14-U18. The fields used to be huge as anyone could enter provided they met the entry standard. The last time it was held in this format, over 1400 children converged on Hobart and over 130 walkers contested the various walk events. After the 2009 meet, Athletics Australia decided to significantly reduce the footprint of this meet, reducing the number of age groups from 5 to 3 (U14, U16 and U18) and generally allowing a maximum of 2 entrants per event per State (although in some circumstances you can have more than 2). So now it's a much smaller affair - still highly competitive but now with reduced fields and less participation. Such is life!

This year, the U14 and U18 walks were held on Saturday, day 2 of the 3 day meet. The weather was tough with very strong and blustery winds, and it was always going to be hard going for the walkers. The standout was 16 year old Nathan Brill (Vic) who was exceptional in the Boy's U18 5000m race walk, crossing the line in 21:05.75 to eclipse the meet record of Dane Bird-Smith. He walked early with Jesse Osborne but was able to break clear, finishing some 40 secs ahead of his 2012 World Cup teammate. The Girl's U18 walk was won by Zoe Boldiston with 25:01.00 ahead of Tayla-Paige Billington with 25:49.86.

The U14 events saw wins to Jasmyn McDonald 14:43.69 and Alix Harlington 15:23.35 but not before some drama as Kyle Swan, who was first to cross the finish line in the Boy's event, was disqualified.

The U16 walks were held on the Sunday afternooon and this time the weather was much better and the times reflected this. The race was very fast from the start with Emmet Brasier (13:28.56) and Adam Garganis (13:40.50) leading the boys out and Jemima Montag and Clara Smith doing the same for the girls. The results below show that well over half of the walkers recorded PBs, some quite significant. In the Girls' race, Clara (13:22.87), Jemima (13:38.63) and Katya Martin (14:13.53) all bettered the existing meet record. I am told that Jemima led the girls through the 1500m mark in a fast 6:38 with Clara close behind and positions remained unchanged until the last lap when Clara stormed past to take the gold with a blistering finish. Jemima's time of 13:38.63 breaks her own Victorian U15 3000m record by 21 secs and I am sure that Clara's time must also have been a new Queensland record. Emmet, Clara and Jemima are all born 1998 so are in the bottom half of this age group (ie they are still U15 this year) so it omens well for the future of the sport.

Last Weekend saw the National All Schools Championships in Hobart Tasmania, with U14 and U16 walkers racing over 3000m on Saturday and U18 walkers racing over 5000m on Sunday. The weather was certainly contrasting - Saturday was particularly trying with winds of 30-45 km/hr across the track whereas Sunday saw generally sunny conditions.

The clear highlights from the weekend's racing were two outstanding efforts - the first provided by Nathan Brill in winning the U18 championship in a Meet record against strong competition from both Jesse Osborne and the gusting and difficult wind, the second the brilliant match racing by Queenslander Clara Smith and Victorian Jemima Montag, with Clara winning clearly in a hugh PB and Meet Record in the U16 event.

Victorian Zoe Boldiston walk very consistently to win the girls U18 5000m and Emmet Brasier and Adam Garganis (who had also completed in the Pole Vault in the windy conditions the day before!) were first and second in the U16 boys championship. Kyle Bird and Lucas Taylor also raced well in the U16 event as did Jasmine Irshad who didn't disappoint with another consistent 14:30 for 3000m. Rachel Guy was perhaps a little off her usual form in the U16 event while Amanda Heard and Stephanie George both raced well in the trying conditions. The biggest disappointment personally was the single disqualification of the weekend - Kyle Swan after finishing first in the U14 boys' 3000m event. I suspect this result will in retrospect be a hiccup on his record!

The keen competition saw medallists from Queensland, NSW, Victoria, and South Australia and good numbers from Tasmania and WA, indicating the health of the sport at the moment. The numbers racing the U18 championships in particular were a highlight.

Michelle Laufer 9:56.2 and Sandra Geisler 10:00.1 were the top women as usual in the high quality field.
