TIM'S WALKER OF THE WEEK

This week's Walker of the week goes to South Australian Masters walker Colin Hainsworth who won the SAMA 8km Yacht Handicap last week with a time of 1:01:01 (81.07%). Born in 1929 and now aged 82, Colin is an inspiration to us younger walkers as he competes and then emails the weekly results from Adelaide.

The following brief overview of Colin's career is provided from George White's 2010 book Age is an Advantage - A History of Veterans/Masters Athletics in South Australia.

Like many who grew up in the depression years Colin walked and ran rather than rode the bus. At junior school he found that he was able to win running races but at high school, he found that he had began to slow down. He decided to give walking a go and from then on he never ran (voluntarily) again. Eventually with coaching and time he gradually worked his way through the ranks until finally winning the Yorkshire Walking Club Championships. Colin continued with his walking in the RAF and for four years in the RNZAF.

On returning to the UK, Colin took a job at a large printing firm and entered the Annual Printing Industry Athletics Competition. Unfortunately he didn't have any suitable shoes and ended up wearing a pair of old work shoes that his Dad was wearing. The race almost killed him but he managed to win.

Colin married in 1957, came to live in SA and a few years later, met Stan Malbut at Elizabeth and was introduced to the Walkers Club. It wasn't long before he was back competing. Colin was one of the many walkers including Frank Leonard and Peter Fullager who regularly travelled to compete in the Federation events in Canberra. Colin was President of the Walkers Club in 1972 and 1973 but due to work, health and domestic commitments, retired from walking until about 1988.

In the early 1990's, Colin was competing with the Walkers Club again. An alternative walking group was formed in 1995 when Colin, Jack Weber, Geoff Peters, Geraldine Waites and Ruth Weber decided to meet on a Saturday afternoon and arrange their own walks. As the group continued to grow they became concerned by the problem of insurance. The simple solution was for the group to

become part of the 'Vets' Club (some were members already). As a result, in 1997 Colin became a member of the committee, representing the walkers. The walking group ended up as the template for later winter running for the Vets - a format that persists to today.

Colin regards the highlight of his walking career to be in 1990 at the AVAC Championships in Melbourne when he beat Gordon Gourlay in the M60 20k road walk, in 119.09.

Colin served as a Committee Member, vice-president and then in 2000 was elected as President of SAMA, a position he held for five years.

As well as his success at the Nationals - 14 wins, Colin scored two gold medals at the World Masters Games in Edmonton in 2005.


VRWC RUNNERS WORLD AWARDS

ECUADOR NATIONAL ROADWALK CHAMPIONSHIPS, MACHALA, ECUADOR, 13-14 APRIL

Again, thanks to oMarchador (http://omarchador.blogspot.pt/2013/04/saquipay-e-guaman-vencem-20-km-dos.html) for the results of the Ecuadorian roadwalk championships which were held in Machala, the capital of El Oro province in southwestern Ecuador. Some 80 walkers competed in a variety of youth, junior and senior events. The Open Men's 20km was won by Rolando Saquipay with 1.28.38,3 (PB of 1:19:21, set in Lima in 2005) while in the Open Women's 20km, the Guamán sisters dominated the competition with Maritza 1.46.49,4 finishing ahead of Yadira 1.47.25,0. The winner has the personal best time of 1:39:31, set at the 2012 World Race Walking Cup in Saransk. The leading places in each event are shown below.

AFRICAN RACE WALKING CHAMPIONSHIPS, MAURICE, MAURITIUS, FRIDAY 19 APRIL

I am reproducing Paul Warburton's report for the IAAF on last weekend's African Race Walking Championships in Mauritius (see http://www.iaaf.org/news/report/stylish-shange-surprises-to-take-african-race). There was no women's walk by the sound of things only a men's 20km is reported.

The IAAF Race Walking Challenge has been to some unusual places in its 10-year history; but, and with respect to all the other venues, none have been as glamorous as Mauritius, which hosted the African Race Walking Championships on Friday.

The eight men toeing the line in Belle Vue this morning negotiated a 1km loop around the Stade Anjalay stadium in the north west of the island. A group of five soon detached itself from the other three, although the pace still remained modest with 5km reached in just under 23 minutes. Already showing at the front was the South African champion Lebogang Shange, walking his second 20km inside in six days after having won his country's title in Stellenbosch on Saturday. Paying close attention was one of only two African walkers who competed at the London 2012 Olympic Games, Tunisia's Hassanine Sebei, who hadn't finished in London but, with a best of 1:20:19, was looking comfortable in this one. Less so were Algeria's Hichem Medjeber and Mohamed Ameur, who along with Tunisia's 2007 IAAF World Championship bronze medallist and African 20km record holder Hatem Ghoula, were doing their best to make a fight of it.

Shange, Sebei and Medjeber managed to engineer a slight gap at the halfway point, before three became two at 15km. The leading pair then put their heads down, with the experienced Sebei tracking the stylish South African all the way to the last lap. At that point, the 22-year-old Shange dug deep. Hearing the bell, he pushed hard and quickly gained a few steps before increasing it to 30 metres over the final half lap, an advantage he held all the way to the line.

Shange trains with South Africa's 50km national record holder Marc Mundell on occasions, and they plan to make it at least a pair of walkers wearing their country's green-and-gold vest in Rio come 2016. Sebei, coached by his compatriot Ghoula, who is now 39 and finished fifth on Friday, had one of his better races in the last year. In an all-Algerian battle for the final place on the podium, Medjeber was a comfortable and isolated third ahead of Ameur. Spare a thought also for Eritrea's determined Yohannes Issei, who was making his debut in the IAAF Race Walking Challenge. Issei has no coach; he has only

caught fleeting glimpses of races elsewhere on TV, but persevered in making it to the competition on a Friday, which had been postponed from 6th April when Mauritius suffered devastating floods. Issei lasted only 19 minutes as Kenya's respected IAAF judge Joseph Ochieng was forced to show him the disqualification disc due to his ragged technique, but the latter was certain the Eritrean would be back for more. "He has no coach," said Ochieng, "but plans to go away and work on his style and come back stronger."

It says much for the future of the IAAF Race Walking Challenge that even the world's furthest outposts of the discipline are showing progress. It would be no surprise to Ochieng if there were soon to be some major contenders coming from the continent better known for its distance runners. "With a little more promotion and one or two more coaches, walking could eventually produce major medallists like other distance events," reflected Ochieng.

14TH BALKAN WALKING CHAMPIONSHIPS, AYVALIK BALIKESIR, TURKEY, SATURDAY 20 APRIL

Turkey was the leading country at the 14th Balkan Walking Championships, held last weekend in Ayvalik Balikesir, amassing 46 points and 7 medals (2 gold, 3 silver and 2 bronze). Romania followed with 39 points and 6 medals (2 +2 +2) ahead of Greece with 19 points and 4 medals (1 +1 +2), Serbia, with 18 points, and Bulgaria, with 4 points.

The Open 20km events saw wins for Vladimir Savanovic of Serbia (1:28:42) and Adriana Enache or Romania (1:39:17) while the Junior events went to Ionut Dragomir of Romania (42:45) and Gamze Ozgur of Turkey (49:28). In the Youth men's 10km, Muratcan Arapinar walked a new Turkish Youth record of 42:29 and was faster than the top junior men. In the Youth girl's 5 km, Athanasia Vaitsi of Greece clocked 24:43 to win.

STAN VICKERS (1932-2013)

Last week, 1960 Olympic 20km bronze medallist Stan Vickers died, aged 80. The following short profile will let our younger readers learn a little more about this champion English walker.

Stanley Frank Vickers was a tall and lanky athlete who, in his competition days, stood 1.85m tall and weighed in at a slight 60 kg, He was born on 18th June 1932 in Lewisham, on the outskirts of London, and raced for Belgrave Harriers. He died on Wednesday 17th April 2013, aged 80.

He came to national prominence in 1956, aged 24, taking second place in the AAA 7 Mile Track Championship, winning the Southern Counties 10 Miles 'Garnet' Championship and doing well enough to gain selection in the 20km event at the Melbourne Olympics. There, he walked outstandingly, taking fifth place with 1.32.34, just over 1 minute behind the Soviet winner Leonid Spirin (1.31.27) and only 20 secs behind the bronze medallist Bruno Junk (1.32.12).

The next few years saw him dominate short distance walking events in Britain, both on the track and on the road. On the track he won the AAA 2 Miles and 7 Miles Championships in 1957 and 1958. He also won the RWA 10 miles roadwalk championship in both these years. With this form he was considered a good chance in the 20km walk at the 1958 European Championships in Stockholm and his performance there proved to be the highlight of his career. He won in 1:33:09, beating silver medallist Spirin by almost two minutes. He probably would have also won the walking event at the Commonwealth Games held that year in Cardiff if he'd been given the chance, but walking wasn't added to the Commonwealth Games program until 1966.

By 1959, he was facing fierce competition on the local front from a young Ken Matthews who took his titles from him that year. But just when it looked like a changing of the guard, Vickers bounced back in 1960, winning both the AAA 2 Miles and the RWA 20 Miles championships. In fact, the 1960 AAA 2 mile walk is considered one of the greatest contests in the history of the championships. Vickers and Matthews duelled virtually neck and neck for the first seven laps, until Vickers powered away in the last lap to win in a new UK record of 13:02.4. Peter Lovesey described it as follows in his book *The Official Centenary History of the AAA*:

In spectacle, excitement and sheer athleticism, the 1960 AAA 2 Mile duel between Stan Vickers and Ken Matthews stand comparison with any of the great races in the history of the Championships. Scrupulously fair, yet at the fastest pace ever seen in Britain, the two kept within a yard of each other, Matthews leading until the bell, when Vickers powered past to cut 9 sec from George Larner's 56-year-old record, with 13:02.4 and Matthews 13:09.6 also inside the old figures.

Both Vickers and Matthews were considered strong contenders for the 20km walk at the Rome Olympic Games, held later that year.

The race was held on a very hot day and Matthews, weakened by recent flu, started to wilt in the oppressive conditions. Concerned for his teammate, Vickers eased his pace until Matthews urged him on. Vickers then took off, finishing strongly to win the bronze medal (1:34:56) behind Russian Vladimir Golubnichiy (1:34:07) and Australian Noel Freeman (1:34:16).

After the race, Vickers sat down to rest and was carried off by ambulance crew who thought he was sick. The crew didn't speak English and several hours passed before officials discovered what had happened. A member of the London Stock Exchange, he was carried shoulder high round the trading floor on his return.

With the death of Vickers, the racewalking world has lost one of the protagonists of the golden age of British racewalking, a gallery that includes names such as Don Thompson (1933-2006), Ken Matthews (b. 1934), George Williams (n. 1935), Paul Nihill (b. 1939) and Ray Middleton (b. 1936).
