TIM'S WALKER OF THE WEEK

This week I go across the Tasman for my Walker of the Week and focus on New Zealand's top walker **Quentin Rew**. Quentin, now based at Leeds in England, won the Naumburg 20km roadwalk on Sunday in a time of 1:22:16, a 40 second PB and yet another A qualifier in the leadup to this year's IAAF World Championships in Russia.

Quentin has made huge inroads into his times over the past 18 months and was one of the big improvers in the Olympic 50km where he finished 30th in a PB of 3:55:03. Since then, he has been racing superbly over the shorter distances, recording 19:52.43 for 5000m in Athlone in Ireland and 1:22:56 for 20km in Lugano last month. Now he has improved even further with his first New Zealand record.

Sunday's performance took four seconds off Craig Barrett's national record set in Adelaide in 1998. Quentin went through the first 5km mark in 20:44 and then walked each subsequent 5km faster, recording 20:41, 20:27 and 20:24, to win the race by 21s. He has already been named in the New Zealand team for the world championships in Moscow in August, in the 50km race walk event but has now shown his all round talent with his two 20km A qualifiers.

AUSTRALIAN LITTLE ATHLETICS U13 CHAMPIONSHIPS, CANBERRA, SUNDAY 28 APRIL

Little Athletics ACT hosted teams from around Australia last Sunday with U13 athletes competing in the Teams event and U15 athletes competing in a multi-event style competition. The challenge for each State is to try to cover all the U13 events with a team that has a maximim size of 22 (11 boys and 11 girls). This means that States do not necessarily send their best specialist athletes but may well choose to send athletes who can score points in more than one event. Hence while the U13 competition featured a 1500m walk, it did not necessarily see the top U13 walkers from around Australia competing. The medallists are always top knotch but when you look further down the results list, you see those athletes for whom walking is very much a second string in the bow. NSW scooped the walks pool with wins to Raquel Roukos and Kyle Bedford with very good times.

Sadly Victoria left its two State racewalking champions (Hayley George and James Burren) at home and the Victorians who contested the walks were non-walkers who had to train up quickly for the events in the context of a few team training sessions. This is very disappointing from a State racewalking perspective and highlights the somewhat artificial nature of this particular championship. From a personal perspective, I would prefer to see this meet dropped in favour of a real Championship that actually brings together the top athletes from each state in each Track and Field discipline. Further, U13 is really too young for such an event I would much prefer to see a real championship meet focusing on the U15 age group. Full walk results below.

NAUMBURG INTERNATIONAL RACEWALK MEET, NAUMBURG, GERMANY, SUNDAY 28 APRIL

Last Sunday saw the 44th edition of the Naumburg International Racewalking meet (see http://www.racewalking-naumburg.de) in Naumburg, Germany. A city in the former East Germany, Naumburg was their racewalking centre and has a proud history as does this annual event. And this year, it had an Australasian flavour as New Zealand ace Quentin Rew won the men's event in a PB time of 1:22:16. The German 20km championship went to second placed Hagen Pohle in a time of 1:22:37 (also a PB) and third place went to 50km specialist Christopher Linke with 1:23:37. Australian Brendon Reading was also competing in the men's 20km but unfortunately failed to finish. Anne Halkivaha from Finland won the non-championship women's 20 km in 1:35:17.
