TIM'S WALKER OF THE WEEK

With the Lake Burley Griffin Carnival last Sunday in Canberra, there were many fine performances across the board and it is a daunting task to pick out the best so I am going back to history to decide where to focus my attention. The carnival started out as a single 20 mile event in 1967 with 14 walkers from across Australia testing themselves out over the hills around Lake Burley Griffin. It was a tough race which began in heavy rain, adding to the hazards of a dug up road and another section of wet tar, all in the first three miles. On that occasion, NSW Olympian Frank Clark won with 2:54:57. Since then, a whole carnival has grown up around the 20 mile championship but it remains, at least to me, the central lynchpin on which the carnival hangs.

This year saw one of our closest 20 mile races ever with Jared Tallent, Chris Erickson and Ian Rayson all in the lead at various stages. Ian headed out like a man possessed, passing the 5 Mile mark in around 35 minutes (and it is a very hilly first 5 miles), some 20 secs ahead of Chris with Jared 10 secs further back. By the 10 mile mark, he had extended his lead to 30 secs and he was motoring. Eventually caught by Chris and then by Jared, he had to settle for third place but only 80 secs separated the three at the end. Let's consider each performance in depth as these will form our voting block this week.

- **Jared Tallent** came through when it counted, in the last 5 miles, eventually winning in 2:20:42. It was his 7th win in a row and his 8th overall. He was tired after his La Coruna race and then the long trip home but he was determined to keep his winning streak intact and that he did. Jared just never gives up and he chased down both Ian and Chris in the second half of the race
- For **Chris Erickson**, it was his 10th Canberra 20 miler (he first did it in 2002 as a 20 year old) and this year was a new PB, his time of 2:21:12 taking 1:35 off his previous best time, set in 2009. His 10 mile splits of 71:12 and 70:00 show how he chased Ian down in the second half. A strength walk befitting a 50km specialist.
- Ian Rayson's walk was a huge breakthrough. He has contested this event since 2008 and had a PB of 2:28:14 (2010) before Sunday. His final time of 2:22:20 was a PB by nearly 6 minutes and shows how he is now stepping up as one of our top 50km exponents.

47TH LAKE BURLEY GRIFFIN CARNIVAL, CANBERRA, SUNDAY 9 JUNE 2013

The 47th Lake Burley Griffin Racewalking Carnival last Sunday was a huge success in every way - big fields (over 200 walkers all together), exciting races, great performances and good weather - it was foggy and cool in the morning but cleared to a fine sunny day.

First to my pick of the performances - not in any particular order, just highlighting the best of the best

• Jared Tallent, Chris Erickson and Ian Rayson put on a great performance in the blue ribband 20 Mile event around the lake. Ian led out and held a 30 sec advantage at halfway before being reeled in first by Chris and then by Jared. The final times show just how close they were at the finish - Jared 2:20:42, Chris 2:21:12 (PB) and Ian 2:22:20 (PB). It was Jared's seventh win in a row and his 8th overall, equalling Willi Sawall's win record. The times of Chris and Ian propel them right up the all-time lists for this prestigious event:

- Tanya Holliday took the tough double, winning the women's 10 Mile (1:14:03) and the women's 5km (23:07) later in the day. She did this last year also. Quality act!
- Rachel Tallent took second in the Open Women's 10 Mile walk with a big PB time of 1:16:45. Aged only 20, she is improving quickly and will walk in this year's World University Games.
- 18 year old **Jesse Osborne** won the Open Men's 10 Mile walk with a superb 1:10:57. Walking with Chris Erickson for the first 8 miles, he broke clear in the final couple of miles before the turn and finished strongly. What a future he has!
- 15 year old **Tyler Jones** took a very tough double, winning the U16 3km (13:36) and the U18 5km (23:33) shortly after. Wow!
- 17 year old **Jay Felton** was 4th in the Open 10 Mile in the morning (1:22:39) and then 2nd in the U18 5km in the afternoon (23:58). Now that is also a very tough double for a young walker.

- **Brad Simpson** walked his first ever Canberra 20 Miler, finishing a very creditable 5th with 2:49:17
- Adam Garganis took silver in the U16 3km (13:46) and bronze in the U18 5km (24:16)
- Corey Dickson competed in 3 events 3rd U12 2km 9:57, 5th U14 2km 10:20 and 8th U16 3km 15:55 and won teams medals in all three races
- Kathleen O'Mahony also competed in 3 events 6th in U12 2km 10:56, 10th in J14 2km 11:08 and 12th U16 3km 17:08 and won teams events in both U12 and U14 divisions.
- Michelle Laufer was 6th in the Open Women's 10 Miles (1:27:57) and 4th in the Open Women's 5km (26:20)
- **Kyle Swan** (just turned 14) was 3rd in the U16 3km (14:09) and 4th in the U18 5km (25:17).
- And of course so many of our walkers walked second events to help out teams in higher divisions.

SPANISH WALKS TEAM ANNOUNCED FOR THE 2013 IAAF WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Spanish Athletics Federation (RFEA) has now announced the composition of its walks team for this year's IAAF World Championships in Moscow.

20 km Women: Beatriz Pascual, Julia Takacs Luaces and Lorraine
20 km Men: Miguel Ángel López, Francisco Arcilla and Álvaro Martín
50 km: Jesús García, Claudio Villanueva and José Ignacio Díaz

It is indeed a strong team but the highlight has to be the selection of 43 year old **Jesús Angel García** who will be competing in his 11th straight IAAF World Championships 50km walk. His first was in Stuttgart in 1993 when he was victorious. Since then he has competed in 6 Olympic Games and 9 World Cups, not to mention 10 World Championships and a similar number of European Championships and European Cups. His IAAF World Championships appearances include 6 top-six finishes, an amazing tally.

RUSSIAN ROAD WALK CHAMPIONSHIPS, CHEBOKSARY, 8-9 JUNE 2013

The Russian Road Race Walk Championships were held last weekend in Cheboksary, on the same course that was used for the 2003 European Cup. Attended by over 150 athletes from all over Russia as well as walkers from Belarus, Kazakhstan and Colombia, these championships were the final selection opportunities for walkers aiming for the World Championships (Moscow), the World Youth Championships (Donetzk), the Universiade (Kazan), the European Under-23 Championship (Tampere) and the European Junior Championships (Rieti).

Russia will be represented in each of the IAAF World Championship walks by 4 athletes as Olga Kaniskina, Valery Borchin and Sergey Bakulin are wild card entries as defending champions. Yelena Lashmanova (20 km) and Sergey Kiryapkin (50 km) have also been pre-selected as Olympic Champions. The winners of these Open championships also come under serious consideration.

The Men's 20km was won by 27 year old Andrey Ruzavin, a former World Junior and European champion, with 1:19:08 while the Women's 20km was won by Lina Bikulova with 1:28:42. The 50km was won by the very experienced 41 year old Yuriy Andronov with 3:43:54.
