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TIM'S WALKER OF THE WEEK

Last week's walker of the week vote went clearly to **Ian Rayson** whose 20 Mile walk in Canberra was a huge breakthrough. He had contested this event since 2008 and had a PB of 2:28:14 (2010) before this year's carnival. His final time of 2:22:00 was a PB by over 6 minutes and shows how he is now stepping up as one of our top 50km exponents.

This week, my attention has been focused on the Sri Chinmoy 24 Hour Championships in Sydney, an annual event to which I normally to help out crewing. This year saw a number of walkers in action and I even dusted off the shoes and had a walk in the 12 Hour championship for a change myself.

But my walker of the week has to go to Victorian **Steve Jordan** for one very simple reason. Steve has been trying to achieve a centurion finish (walk 100 miles in 24 hours) since he started out in ultra walking in 2005. Since then he has walked numerous 6 Hour events and 12 Hour events and an amazing eleven 24 Hour events, never once qualifying. But he never gave up and last weekend his persistence was rewarded when he walked a total distance of 164.478km, passing the 100 mile mark along the way in around 23:18. If he was ever going to do it, it was going to be this year - he took 7 months of long service leave from work so that he could train exclusively. He worked on his technique, racing with VRWC at Middle Park and changed his diet, shedding around 7km as the year progressed His single minded approach paid off and he has now become **Australian Centurion Number 64**.

In 2009 at Coburg, he was on target for around 14 hours but could not maintain his pace in the second half. In 2012, once again at Coburg, Willy Vermeulen of Belgium and Steve both found themselves just a few laps short of the required distance in the dying hours of the race. Try as they might, they could not maintain the required pace over the final stages and were going to miss out on the 100 mile mark by only a few laps. Willy called it quits with about 40 mins to go with a distance of 155.927 km while Steve slowed down and just walked it out, finishing with 157.232 km. They were indeed gallant efforts. This year, his centurion finish was never in

doubt as he passed the 12 Hour mark with just under 90km, a huge PB in itself. With only 71km to complete in the second 12 Hours of the race, only a disaster could prevent him from his goal. He is indeed a worthy winner of my walker of the week.

SRI CHINMOY 24 HOUR TRACK CHAMPIONSHIPS, BLACKTOWN, NSW, 15-16 JUNE 2013

I returned home from Sydney evening in wonderful spirits after the annual Sri Chinmoy 24 Hour Track Championships at the Blacktown International Sports Park. There are always a few walkers in this event but this year, the walk numbers were up and the quality of walking was superb. The walk highlights read as follows

- As mentioned at the start of the newsletter, Melbourne walker **Steve Jordan** passed the 100 mile milestone in around 23:18 and went on to walk 164.478 km in the 24H. It was around his 12th 24 Hour walk attempt over the last 8 years and he has finally achieved it. There was much celebration and it was definitely the highlight for all the walkers present.
- Last year, Wangaratta based ultra distance runner **Justin Scholz** became a Centurion with a 100 mile walk time of 22:09:03. This time he and his wife **Sharon** both competed and both walked superb races. Sharon competed in the Australian team in the World 24 Hour Running Championships in Holland only 4-5 weeks ago and has been flat out walking since then on what must have been one of the shortest preparation periods ever. It was an extraordinary walk for each of them. Justin passed the 100 mile in around 19:40 and went on to record 189.678km, the second longest ever 24 Hour walk distance in Australia. Sharon went through the 100 mile in under 22 hours and broke Michelle Thompson's Australian records for 12 Hours, 100km, 100 miles and 24 Hours. Her final distance was 187.653km.

To give some idea of the quality of their walks, here are the Australian all-time top-10 rankings for 24 Hour walks done in Australia. Justin and Sharon have gone straight to the front of the bus!

• Sydney based Sri Chinmoy running legend **Anyce Melham** tried to qualify as a centurion in this race last year but finished well short of the 100 miles. This time he reached the 100 mile mark in around 23:50 and went on to walk 162.031km.

So 4 finishers and 3 first time centurions (Sharon, Steve and Anyce) who become Cent number 63-65.

I was going to let my own walk in Sydney go quietly past the batter to the keeper but I have been inundated by people telling me that it must be acknowledged. Australian Centurions President Terry O'Neill has written the following piece for the newsletter

We all know Tim for his work as Secretary of RWV and VRWC, and for those of us involved, as Secretary of the Australian Centurion walkers. Tim is always there to encourage others, and praise them for outstanding performances. This is my turn to write something about him after his great effort in Sydney over the weekend.

Tim retired from competitive race walking many years ago but always has a hand in helping others. He started training

Michelle Thompson to great success and at the same time Steve Jordan. This must have reignited his hunger for more because he walked 102.330km in 12 hours on the weekend, reaching 100km in around 11hr39. His distance over 6 hours was 56 8km

In 1975 Tim walked 50 miles in 8hrs 14min 46sec to set a then Australian record which was broken 2 years later by his training partner Clarrie Jack.

In 1976 Tim become Australian Centurion 13, walking 100 miles in 22hr 10min 27sec. His efforts in achieving these times and distances some 37 years after his last ultra-event is an outstanding achievement.

I write this because knowing Tim he would not write something about himself.

As briefly reported in last week's newsletter, Australian walker **Peter Bennett** was in Rouen, France, on the weekend of 8-9 June for the annual 24 Heures de Rouen ultra distance walking classic. This was Peter's 7th appearance in this event and he notched up a 5th win with a superb 213.0km. He emailed me during the week to briefly discuss proceedings.

The two days before the race were very hot (28 degrees at 7pm) but it was cloudy and cool for the race with a very cold wind during the night and early hours of Sunday morning. I kept waiting for the sun to come up but the race was over (5pm) before that happened. This was the 45th edition of this race and as a gesture I was given race number 45. The race started at 5pm on Saturday so we had over five hours of daylight before night fell. It makes for a short night but Sunday was a long day.

The morning after the race I had to get up at 6am to get ready to go to an international seminar where I gave a brief speech on the environmental challenges facing the Great Barrier Reef. This did not finish until 5pm so I was pretty weary by the time we got home. Since then I have spent many hours walking around the Armanda Tall Ships Festival which has attracted millions of visitors to Rouen. I think it is a 7.5km walk from one end of the festival to the other (and then you have to walk back). That is why many people just take a boat cruise of the festival site. My tourist activities have been curtailed by the train strike and the air traffic controllers strike. Hope all is resolved by tomorrow as my flight home is scheduled for Saturday.

In the men's race, Jean Marie Roualt became the first French male winner since 1993 with his final time of 54:10:59, beating Ossipov by a whopping 48 minutes. In the women's race, Irina Poutinseva of Russia (former winner in 2000 and 2003) won in 40:28:42 ahead of Italian Nicoletta Mizera while Alvernhe failed to finish. It is indeed a brutal race.
