TIM'S WALKER OF THE WEEK

There are a number of fine walks at the National Roadwalk championships in Tasmania last Sunday but two stood out to me.

- 40 year old **Kelly Ruddick** won the Open Women's 20km championship in a huge PB of **1:33:15**. It was a PB by over 3 minutes and saw her finish nearly 5 minutes clear of second placed Rachel Tallent. It is also the top ranking time in Australia this year and catapults Kelly to 12th on my Australian women's all-time list. Needless to say, it's another W40 record for Kelly! It seems she PBs every time she steps onto the track nowadays. Kelly is now very nicely placed to press her claim for a spot in the 2014 World Cup team.
- 15 year old **Tyler Jones** was eligible to contest the U16 5km walk but chose to go up an age group and race in the U18 10km. It was a great decision as he finished 2nd to Nathan Brill, his time of **46:01** being a PB by nearly 40 secs. Further, it clearly places him third in the Australian U20 10km ranking list in the leadup to the 2014 World Cup trial in Hobart next February.

RUSSIAN WALKER IGOR EROKHIN BANNED FOR LIFE

It was only a small report on a local Russian sporting webiste but it was big news in the world walking community with yet another Russian banned - see http://hotsport.ua/ru/athletics/rossiiskii-atlet-igor-erokhin-pozhiznenno-diskvalifitsirovan_1377948003.html.

The Russian Athletics Federation Anti-Doping Commission (ARAF) has disqualified racewalker Igor Erokhin for life after he returned abnormal hematological parameters in his Biological Passport earlier this year. Since it was his second offence, the automatic life disqualification was enforced.

Erokhin first tested positive in 2008 and was banned for two years. Ending his suspension early in 2011, he was quickly back in favour in Russia and represented in the following three competitions

 2011 European Cup, Alhao, 50km
 2nd in 3:49:05

 2012 World Cup, Saransk, 50km
 2nd in 3:38:10

 2101 Olympic Games, London, 50km
 5th in 3:37:54

Now he has failed further tests with regard to his biological passport and he has been banned for life, retrospective to February 2011 (when he returned from his last ban). All results from 25th February 2011 have been cancelled.

This should now mean that all those who finished below him in the above 3 competitions will move up one place. From an Australian perspective, it should mean that **Jared Tallent** gets his bronze medal in the 2012 World Cup 50km in Saransk upgraded to a silver medal, making his wonderful international record even better!

The oMarchador website (see http://omarchador.blogspot.pt/2013/09/igor-erokhin-erradicado-do-desporto.html) discusses this more fully and goes on as follows:

The list of sanctioned Russian walkers is big. Among the most high profile names are Olympiada Ivanova, Vladimir Andreev, Valeriy Borchin, Viktor Burayev, Vladimir Kanaykin, Tatyana Mineeva, Sergey Morozov, German Skurygin (who died of a heart attack in 2008), Aleksey Voyevodin, Dementiy Cheparev and now Erokhin. Almost all were winners of Olympic events, World Championships or European or the World Cups. Some were banned while still in junior ranks.

This continuous stream of doping convictions raises doubts about the legality of the training methods of places like the Saransk School of Walking as well as the validity of records and titles won individually or collectively by Russian walkers. And with so many of these walkers under the watchful eye of Russian coach Viktor Chiogin, you really have to ask - how does he keep his job!

Alas, it's not just Russians. The walking blacklist includes high profile athletes from other countries: Silviu Casandra (Romania), Alex Schwazer (Italy), Liu Yunfeng (China), Song Hongjuan (China), Erik Tysse (Norway), Claudia Stef (Romania), Athanasia Tsoumeleka (Greece), Recep Celik (Turkey), Andriy Yurin (Ukraine), José Bagio (Brazil) and Francisco Fernández (Spain).

AUSTRALIAN ROADWALK CHAMPS, SYMMONS PLAINS, TASMANIA, SUNDAY 1ST SEPTEMBER

Our RWA/AA Roadwalk Championships were successfully staged at Symmons Plains raceway, just outside Launceston, last Sunday morning. Conditions were good for the early races but as the day progressed, the wind became very strong, making racing a very tough endeavour, especially for the younger walkers who were on later in the morning.

We also shared the venue with School Sport Australia who were running their annual Schools relays at the same time. That meant that we were somewhat overwhelmed by the sheer volume of runners and running spectators. Further, the walks were held on the outside of the racing barriers, partially hidden from the grandstand area. This meant that to watch the walks, you had to walk around behind the barriers to watch from the other side, away from the loudspeakers and away from the main area. But that being said, it was a good relatively flat racing course and the venue facilities overall were good. It was just the wind!

Athletics Australia has published the overall walks results at http://www.nswathletics.info/liveresults/2013/aa_rw/index.htm. From our own Racewalking Australia perspective, I have now published the results of the various Teams Races, the RWA Handicap

winners and all other RWA awards from the meet. I have also calculated the Brennen Points for 2013 and can announce that NSWRWC has won from RWV (a close second) with SARWC third. I was not in a position to announce this on Sunday so apologies and congratulations to NSWRWC! And now to a quick discussion of some of my highlights. The blue riband events have to be the Open 20km championships and they were won by **Dane Bird-Smith** (1:25:43) and **Kelly Ruddick** (1:33:15). Dane followed up his 11th place in Moscow with a good win here but towards the end he was definitely losing ground to **Brendon Reading** whose 1:27:51 was his best finish for some time. Fellow Moscow walker **Rhydian Cowley** had to be content with third place in 1:29:31 in what was perhaps an anticlimactic walk after the Worlds. Further back, Nick Dewar 1:31:02, Kim Mottrom 1:31:14 and Justin Hill 1:37:53 all walked PBs. In the women's race, Kelly walked with fellow Victorian **Rachel Tallent** for the first 8km before clearing away for an easy win. Rachel held on for second with 1:38:06 and **Lauren Bourke** took third with 1:43:40. Behind them, Natalie Laurie walked superbly in her first ever 20km, finishing fourth with 1:46:47.

In the U18 and U20 Men's 10km events, the fastest 3 walkers all bettered the 2014 World Cup Qualifying standard and are all young enough to be eligible for team selection next year - **Nathan Brill** 43:34, **Jesse Osborne 44:32** and **Tyler Jones** 46:01. **Jessica Pickles**, who won the U20 Women's 10km was also under the qualifying standard with her 49:55 but this is her last year in the junior ranks and she will be looking to start her Open 20km career next year.

There were lots of other great walks but I will leave you to read about them yourselves.

GUERNSEY CHURCH TO CHURCH 19.4 MILES WALK, SUNDAY 1 SEPTEMBER 2013

All of us old timers have heard of the Guernsey Church to Church walk which is held annually on the island of Guernsey, one of a number of islands in the English Channel between England and France. First to a potted history of the event

A challenge in the local newspaper in September 1936 to walk between the Parish Churches of Guernsey in less than 3 hours 20 minutes was made by Mr Eve D Le Page who claimed to have done it over a course from Town to St Martins, the Forest, St Peters, Upper Parishes and the Lower Parishes. This led to the first walking race for what is now known as the "Church to Church "originally organised by the Guernsey Wanderers Sports and Social Club, using the same route as taken today, with the only difference being the start and finish point which until 1950 was at the White Rock. The start and finish were then moved half a mile along the route, both having the same distance of 19.4 miles. An early feature of the walk was the touching of each Church, nowadays walker's usually only touch the statue at St Martins Church gates.

Over the first ten years of the walk until 1946, the event was held on only five occasions as it was interrupted by the German Occupation, with a shortened version taking place in 1945 for the same "1945 Guernsey Walking Race Victory Cup" that is raced for today, replacing the lost Joybell Trophy. The current ladies trophy, the "Highway Sports Circle Star Perpetual Trophy "goes back even further to 1938.

Organisation of the walk was passed over to the Guernsey (Island) Amateur Athletic Club in 1946 and was indeed their first promoted event. The walk continued into the mid 50's until it stuttered in 1956 when the walk didn't take place, but from 1957 until the present day it has remained in the Guernsey calendar, organised since 1966 by the Sarnia Walking Club.

It is 67 years since that first race and it is still going strong, attracting teams from the mainland (England) to battle it out with the locals. It is a tough walk with hills galore so time is not of the essence - the challenge as always is to finish! Thanks to Rob Elliot for this year's results which are reproduced below.

This year, 20 year old Ashford AC walker Jonathan Hobbs, an established race walker at shorter distances, stepped into the unknown, winning a close race against local walker Jason Le Noury. Angela Martin, a recent convert to race walking walked a solid 3.46.52 to take the women's title from Jayne Le Noury. You can read a full race report at http://churchtochurch.wordpress.com/

2014 RACEWALKING WORLD CUP SELECTION CRITERIA ANNOUNCED

Last week, Athletics Australia released the Selection Criteria for the 2014 Racewalking World Cup. It is very similar to the 2012 Selection Criteria. See http://www.athletics.com.au/home/high_performance/high_performance_news/team_information/wwc. The salient points are as follows:

- AA will select up to 5 walkers for each of the 50km men, 20km women and up to 3 walkers for each of the 10km Junior men and 10km Junior women.
- AA recommends that junior walkers do either the World Junior championships or the World Racewalking Cup but not both. A special exemption is required from AA to do both events.

- Any athlete who finished in the top 24 at the 2013 IAAF World Championships will be automatically selected subject to compliance with clause 4 and the athlete having nominated for that event. This means Jared Tallent and Chris Erickson (50km) and Dane Bird-Smith (20km).
- The first two eligible athletes (excluding any athlete selected by clause 3.2.1) in each 20km selection trial will be automatically selected in the team provided that the athlete has nominated for selection and in the case of the 20km events,

[&]quot;A person who was born or has been resident in Channel Islands for 12 months immediately prior to walk"

the athlete has achieved the performance standard. Further selections may be made at the discretion of the selectors. This discretion is absolute and it need not be exercised.

- The first two eligible athletes in each 10km Junior selection trial will be automatically selected in the team provided that the athlete has nominated for selection and has achieved the performance standard outlined in appendix 1. 3.3.2 If positions remain in the event after the operation of clause 3.3.1, further selections may be made at the discretion of the selectors. This discretion is absolute and it need not be exercised.
- Performances must be achieved during an official competition organised in conformity with IAAF Rules. Performances achieved in Australia must be achieved in a competition sanctioned by Athletics Australia as an Athletics Australia "National Permit Meeting". Athletics Australia operates a sanctioning process across all meets that involves the issuing of a permit "National Permit" or "Recreational (State) Permit". A current list of all "National Permit" meetings will be available on the Athletics Australia website.
 - Effectively, this means that you must ensure that you must make AA aware of any qualification attempts and ensure that your race gets the appropriate AA permit and has the proper count of officials, judges and that it is on a certified course.
- Athletics Australia may not provide financial support for the 2014 World Race Walking Cup and therefore participating athletes, selected according to the terms of this policy, may be required to cover costs in addition to any assistance provided by the IAAF and the local organising committee in Taicang. The allocation of any financial assistance offered by the IAAF or the local organising committee will be by the Director of High Performance, whose decision shall be final. Junior athletes in particular should anticipate a levy to offset some of the costs of the trip will be imposed.
 This is new and brings WWC in line with World Half Marathon Championship and WCC as similar events.
