56TH LITHUANIAN WALKING CUP, ALYTUS, LITHUANIAN, SATURDAY 14 SEPTEMBER

Some 80 walkers, representing 7 clubs, took part in the annual Lithuanian Walking Cup in Altyus on Saturday 14th September. Genadyj Kozlovskij won the men's 10,000m with a PB 42.19,25 while Agne Klebauskaite won the women's 10,000m with 50.53,51. Svencionis was the winning city, followed by Kedainiai and Druskininkai. In the club competition, PSEK won with 50 points ahead of Vaivorykste with 134 points and Druskininku EK with 141 points

BALTIC COUNTRIES RACWALKING MEET, TUKUMS, ESTONIA, SATURDAY 21 SEPTEMBER

Lithuania, with 44 points, won the annual Baltic Countries racewalking meet ahead of Sweden (39), Latvia (34) and Estonia (22) last Saturday in Tukums, Estonia. Swedish walkers Perseus Karlström 1:24:55 and Ato Ibáñez 1:26:56 dominated the men's 20km while Latvian walker Agnese Pastare 46.41 won the women's 10km ahead of Swedish walkers Mari Olsson 48.17 and Siw Karlström 50.31 (born 1957 so W55) Lithuania sealed their overall victory in the junior women's teams event with with the Vaiciukevičiūtė sisters -Gintare (23.41), Živilė (23.56) and Monika (24.44) - taking the first 3 places.

CHINESE WALK CHAMPS, CHANGBAISHAN NATURE RESERVE, JILIN PROVINCE, 19-20 SEPT

Changbaishan Nature Reserve, in the Jinin province in north-eastern China on the border with North Korea, hosted this year's Chinese Race Walking Championships. There were not many of the stars in attendance given the Chinese Games in May and the World Championships last month but 2012 Olympic champion Chen Ding was there. At 1600m altitude, times were never going to be fast but this is China, after all, and the depth of racewalking is always impressive.

The men's and women's 20km events were held on the second day of the championships (Friday 20th September). With his national teammates Wang Zhen and Li Jianbo both skipping the tournament, the 21-year-old Olympic champion Chen Ding, who collected a silver at the IAAF World Championships in Moscow last month, enjoyed an easy victory for Team Guangdong in 1:23:33, ahead of Yu Wei 1:24:17 and Liu Jianmin 1:24:47. "After the World Championships I took a break and only trained for several days in the build-up for this competition," said Chen. "Yesterday is the Mid-autumn Day, I think this title is a wonderful holiday gift for my family." The women's 20km event, which started 5 minutes after the men, saw Huiqin Ding 1:32:56 win ahead of He Qin 1:33:29 and Wang Di 1:35:02. - The IAAF has revealed that 7 athletes tested positive for banned substances at the IAAF World Championships in Moscow. Amongst them was one finalist - Roman Avramenko of Ukraine who finished fifth in the men's javelin competition - and two walkers - Ayman Kozhakhmetova of Kazakhstan (women's 20km walk) and Iran's Ebrahim Rahimian (men's 20km walk).
- The Athletics Victoria winter cross country and road running season finished last Saturday morning with the traditional Tan Relays. A record 307 teams tested themselves out over the hilly 3.8km course around the Botanical Gardens in inner Melbourne. VRWC RUNNERS WORLD WINTER SEASON AWARDS

Neil Ryan of Runners World Kew (see http://www.runnersworld.com.au/) approached VRWC early in the 2009 winter season with an offer of some club sponsorship. While we have our Points and Handicap awards, the awards are not necessarily won by our BEST walkers as they are influenced by participation rates. At the end of each season, our VRWC Committee votes on a short list of candidates in each of 4 categories. This voting has now been completed and I am pleased to announce our four winners of the 2013 Winter Season Runners World Awards. I will now be arranging a suitable presentation time with Neil and our four winners.

Open Men - Chris Erickson

31 year old Chris Erickson, who has been back in Melbourne for nearly 12 months since relocating from Canberra, had a great winter season. He won the Victorian 10km, 15km, 20km and 30km championships as well as the Alf Robinson Trophy (VRWC 20km championship) and he recorded PBs in the LBG 20 miler in Canberra (2:21:10) and the IAAF 50km World Championships in Moscow (3:49:41).

Open Women - Kelly Ruddick

Kelly Ruddick had an amazing season - 6 PBs (all of them W40 records) out of 7 races, topping it off with a National Open 20km Championship win and a 3 min PB! Her time in Launceston (1:33:15) propels her to the number one spot on the Open Women's National 20km ranking list for the year and sets her up nicely for a World Cup berth next year.

Junior Men - Kyle Swan

Kyle has had to wait for a few years before we could nominate him and it is only this year, now that he has turned 14, that he becomes eligible for the winter season Junior Men award. He raced most weeks, was rarely beaten and recorded some very impressive PBs. His season culminated with a win in Launceston - U16 5km national champion!

Junior Women - Emily Hamilton

15 year old Emily was one of the big improvers this winter, winning both U16 Victorian Roadwalk Championships and taking bronze in the U16 5km National Championship in Launceston last month. She also tested herself out over the longer 10km distance (57:57).
