INTERNATIONAL WALK MEET, BACÚCH, SLOVAKIA, SATURDAY 28 SEPTEMBER

The fourth and final round of the yearly International Race Walking Tour was held in Bacúch in Slovakia on Saturday. The earlier races had been held in Olomouc (CZE), Katovice (POL) and Ailtus (LTV) and the four meet series is a joint initiative from the Czech Republic, Poland, Lithuania and Slovakia.

In the men's 10km race, victory went to 39 year old Ukrainian walker Andrii Kovenko (40:09), ahead of Russian Piotr Trofimov (40:25) who just held out local walker Anton Kučmín (40:26) for third. Slovak star Matej Tóth (40:56) had to settle for fourth after what has been a big year for him. In the women's 10km race, 25 year old Italian walker Federica Ferraro had a dominant win in the excellent time of 43:55, just two seconds outside her PB which she recorded in winning the third race in the series in Katovice in July. Russian Natalia Seriožkina was second with 45:00 while Hungarian Viktoria Madarasz was third with 45:07. The Italian women's walking team is going from strength to strength and can now boast 4 very good walkers in Rigaudo, Giorgi, Palmisano and now Ferraro.

With the four meet competition now completed, the men's overall points scores saw Andrii Kovenko (Ukraine) and Dawid Tomala (Poland) equal first on 31 points with Anton Kucmín (Slovakia) was third on 23 points while in the women's competition, Brigita Virbalyte (Lithuania) triumphed with 31 points ahead of Frederica Ferraro (Italy) on 30 and Paulina Buziak (Poland), on 28.

It was Tóth's eighth win in a row as the top Slovak walker and comes on top of a great year which saw him win over 20km in Podebrady (a PB 1:20:14 in April), take bronze in the European Cup in Dudince, won in Sesto San Giovanni and race to a fine fifth place (2:41:07) in the World Championship 50km in Moscow.

After a successful year collecting national and international veteran titles and records, Ian Richards timed the 1 Hour track race perfectly to win by almost 200m from Fabian Deuter and Fransisco Reis. Young Portuguese walker Arthur Domingos was a comfortable B section winner from the relatively new and improving Penelope Cummings, who was disappointed to fall just 26m short of her six mile target. It was nice to see Trevor Jones in action again after a lengthy injury lay-off and his distance, nearer 7 miles than 6, must have been very pleasing for him.

SPORTING SHORTS

- A couple of weeks ago, I mentioned that Czeck walking prodigy Anezka Drahotova would be competing in the world cycling championships in Florence, Italy, very soon. Well she did but things did not work out as planned. She was not able to start in the Junior Individual Time Trial when her bike failed its compulsory final test. Apparently, gearing ratios are restricted for the younger riders and the ratio on her bike was outside the designated standards. She did compete in the Junior road race last Friday, her final position of 19th highlighting her relative inexperience at such a level. Fitness is only one factor in such an event positioning, downhill racing, taking corners aggressively and many other finely honed skills are needed to excel in such a technical sport. But I am sure it was a wonderful experience for this multi talented athlete.

A.A.'S NEW NATIONAL ATHLETE SUPPORT STRUCTURE UNVEILED

Athletics Australia has selected the initial groups of athletes to be offered membership in the new National Athlete Support Structure (NASS), with a record number of individuals set to benefit from direct support from Athletics Australia. In total, 62 able-bodied athletes and 42 para-athletes will be offered NASS membership for the 12 months starting on 1 October 2013. The level of support offered to each NASS athlete, and whether they are offered a financial contract, will be determined by their level within the program. There are five levels ranging from 'World Class' down to 'Potential'. For some, it means less money but for some, it means some money where before they had none. 2014 WORLD JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIPS SELECTION CRITERIA ANNOUNCED

The AA Selection Policy for the 2014 World Junior Champs, was posted on the AA website last week. See <u>http://www.athletics.com.au/home/high_performance/high_performance_news/team_information/2013_wj</u>. The champs will be held in Eugene in America on 22-27 July next year. Main points are as follows

- Only athletes born in 1995, 1997 and 1997 can be entered.
- A maximum of two athletes can be selected in each event.
- The qualifying standards for the 10,000m walks are **43:44** (men) and **49:40** (women).
- The selection trials will be held at the Australian U20 T&F Championships on 12-16 March 2014 in Sydney.
- The winner of the walk trial will be an automatic selection provided he/she has attained the AA qualifying standard at

least once during the AA Qualifying period. Any second selection is at the selectors' discretion.

- The AA qualifying period extends from 1 October 2013 to 16 March 2014.
- Any athlete selected in the Athletics Australia team for the IAAF 2014 World Race Walking Cup is ineligible for selection in Athletics Australia's team for the 2014 World Junior Track and Field Championships unless that athlete has been granted exemption in writing by the AA High Performance Manager.
- There are only a small number of nominated opportunities for walkers to attain the qualifying standard. Any other walk competitions organised as qualifying opportunities must meet the specific requirements of the IAAF and must be sanctioned by Athletics Australia. All requests in relation to walk qualifying opportunities must be directed to the Athletics Australia Competitions Manager Andrew Matthews.
- Both road and track walk performances are acceptable for qualifying purposes.
