TIM'S WALKER OF THE WEEK

There were plenty of good performances at the Australian 20km Summer Championship meet in Hobart on Sunday but none better than those of **Jemima Montag** and **Jesse Osborne** who won the Junior 10km events so it was an easy task to decide on them as joint winners of this week's Walker of the Week.

- 15 year old Jemima Montag was dominant in the Junior Women's race, going straight to the lead and passing through the 5km mark in just over 22 mins for a big 5km PB. She did understandably slow from there on but her finishing time of **47:00** was a 2:22 PB. It is a shame that she is too young for this year's World Junior Champs but she is eligible to contest the World Cup and, like Jesse, is an automatic selection as winner of the trial.
- 19 year old Jesse also strode straight to the lead in the Junior Men's race and was on target for a sub-41 at the 6km mark before fading slightly in the warming morning conditions. His final time of **41:27** was a 51 sec PB and saw him finish over a minute clear of second place. It was a dominant performance and omens well for World Cup and World Juniors later this year.

OCEANIA & AUSTRALIAN 20KM ROADWALK CHAMP S, HOBART, TAS, SUNDAY 2 FEBRUARY

The Australian Summer 20km roadwalk champs were contested on Sunday morning in Hobart. The races also doubled as Oceania Championships and as the official Australian World Cup trials. 10km Junior invitational events were also on offer and doubled as the official Australian World Cup trials for that age group. To round out what was a big morning's racing, the carnival also featured the Oceania Racewalking Challenge, an Australia vs New Zealand challenge event contested every second year.

First to the men's 20km championship which was a great race but which ended in rather controversial circumstances. The race pace was quite slow early (8:48 first lap) as a large lead group formed. As expected after such a conservative start, the pace gradually quickened over the next few laps as Chris Erickson took up the role of pacemaker. By 6km, only Dane Bird-Smith, Jared Tallent and Rhydian Cowley were still there with him. The group was down to 3 by the time that Chris, Jared and Dane passed the half way mark (42:43). At that stage, Jared surged to the front and put in a sub 8 minute lap with Dane on his shoulder and Chris now dropping back. Jared continued to apply the pressure and eventually, with around 3km to go, the vital break occurred. Jared surged on, opening up a significant gap to Dane with 1km to go. Dane came back at him but could not bridge the gap as Jared crossed the finish line in 1:22:34 with Dane 5 secs in arrears - see the finish on facebook at https://www.facebook.com/photo.php?v=10152158573945600. Both walkers had walked under 40 minutes for their second 10km, an indication of just how hard Jared came home. Jared was soon advised that a third red card had been put in against him in the final lap and so he was disqualified, meaning that the title now went to Dane. And this is where it gets interesting. Never before have I seen so many red cards recorded in this standard of meet. The pile was so big that at one stage it looked like the DQ board would fill and the recorders would be looking for a second one! It is just lucky that the cards were so well shared out amongst all the walkers or we might have had many more DQs than we saw. I was not impressed! To get to this standard, you have to be a good walker. I could see no possible justification for the huge number of reds submitted and I hope that this will be reviewed to ensure that in future championship meets, the judging is more in line with international expectations and standards.

Chris Erickson walked strongly to take second in 1:25:23 ahead of Rhydian Cowley 1:26:49 and Adam Rutter 1:27:31. The first 4 all bettered the Australian World Cup standard of 1:28:00 so Rhydian and Adam will be hoping for good news in the next week or so. Chris and Jared have already been selected in the 50km event so the race was not as significant for them from a WC perspective. Special mentions to Nick Dewar 1:29:29 and Kyle Malone 1:31:04 both walked PBs in taking the next 2 places

The women's race was one of changing fortunes. Like the men, the opening lap was very slow (around 9:45) and a large group formed. A rejuvenated and super fit looking Nicole Fagan was right up there with them and doing a fair bit of the lead work, along with Rachel Tallent and Tanya Holliday. By the time the halfway mark was reached in 47:55 the lead pack had been reduced in size to our two top ranked women - Kelly Ruddick and Tanya Holliday, with Rachel Tallent a few seconds behind and with the others stretched out behind them on ones and twos. Side by side, Kelly and Tanya ticked off the remaining laps until, around the 16km mark, Tanya had what looked like a winning break. But Kelly was not to be denied and worked her way back and then passed Tanya as they entered the final 2km lap. Sensationally, Tanya was then flagged off the course by the chief judge, having taken a third red card, so it was left to Kelly to come home for her second National Open Championship (she won in Launceston in September). Her time of 1:34:44 guaranteed her a World Cup spot - at 40 years of age! What a wonderful achievement.

Stephanie Stigwood held on well to take second in a PB time of 1:37:39 but Nicole Fagan, who was walking so strongly and definitely in medal contention with 5km to go, faded badly and eventually retired. Rachel Tallent took third with 1:38:38 ahead of Swedish walker Mari Olsson whose time of 1:38:58 continued her improvement since her win at Fawkner Park in December. Special mention to 19 year old Kirsty Klein who signalled her arrival in the Open ranks with a very good 1:42:17

The two Junior 10km races saw some serious times recorded by the younger walkers. 19 year old Jesse Osborne strode straight the lead and was on target for a sub-41 at the 6km mark before fading slightly in the warming morning conditions. His final time of 41:27 was a 51 sec PB and saw him finish over a minute clear of 17 year old team mate Nathan Brill who was only 13 secs outside his PB with a fine time of 42:46. The biggest improver in the boys' race was 16 year old Adam Garganis whose time of 46:19 was him take 4th place behind 15 year old NSW walker Tyler Jones who recorded 45:39. All 4 boys were under the Australian World Cup qualifying standard of 46:30.

The girls' event saw 15 year olds Jemima Montag and Clara Smith take the first two places. In fact, Jemima went through the 5km mark in just over 22 mins for a big 5km PB. She did understandably slow from there on but her finishing time of 47:00 was a 2:22 PB. For Clara, it was her first ever 10km and her time of 48:17 was also outstanding. 17 year old Jasmine Dighton walked a huge PB to take third with 49:11 to also better the Australian World Cup qualifying standard of 51:00. So we seem assured of full junior teams in Taicang later this year.

Hobart marked the end of the Australian qualifying period for the 2014 World Racewalking Cup and we have plenty of walkers in the mix. Some places are already filled. Any athlete who finished in the top 24 at the 2013 IAAF World Championships is automatically selected for that event. This means Jared Tallent and Chris Erickson (50km) and Dane Bird-Smith (20km) are automatics. Kim Mottrom won the 50km trial and has already been named in the 50km team alongside Jared and Chris. Finishing first or second in the trials in Hobart and having a qualifier also guarantees a spot - thus Kelly Ruddick, Jesse Osborne, Nathan Brill, Jemima Montag and Clara Smith are also automatics in their respective events. PONDERING THE NEW AIS LOGO

The Australian Institute of Sport has done away with its current logo of over 30 years and has adopted a new logo - see <u>http://www.smh.com.au/sport/ais-adopts-new-logo-20140203-31vlh.html</u>. To quote from the newspaper article:

Gold was chosen to signify the pursuit of increased success under the Winning Edge program, a 10-year strategic plan that was instigated after Australia's poor performance at the London Games in 2012. Australian Sports Commission chief executive Simon Hollingsworth said the new logo was more relevant to the organisation's goals. "The analysis told us that the current brand was not contemporary and lacked relevance for our key stakeholders, including potential sponsors and commercial partners," Hollingsworth said. "This new brand takes into a new age for Australian high performance sport."

Unfortunately, while it might be a new age for Australian High Performance Sport, it is is a poor 'brave new world' for Australia's walkers. After 30 years of consistent success on the international stage, where almost all our medal winning walkers were on an AIS scholarship program, which has offered a performance driven daily training environment to provide a long term investment in our best walkers, we are expected to continue to deliver with little or no support to reach international level - any monetary help from AA only kicks in once you get there! The AIS based walkers have left, and are now back to the old days of amateur athletics, working part time or full time and training when they can. If you want to see what this means, compare the results for the Open 20km walkers in Hobart in 2014 compared to any of the previous 5 years. The standard has already dropped considerably, barely 12 months after the AIS residential program was closed.

And talking of Hobart last weekend, Jesse Osborne is probably ranked 3rd in the world with his U20 10km PB but is currently unfunded under the Athletics Australia National Athlete Support Scheme, and no financial support (other than family) to help him prepare for the World Walking Cup in early May. 15 year old Jemima Montag won her Junior 10km race in a time better than the world best U18 last year (a world youth championships year) and has her 16th birthday next week. Like Jesse, she will be preparing for her World Walking cup appearance unfunded and without support.

Victoria again demonstrated its dominance of the walks events with wins in 3 of the 4 events on offer and 4 World Cup Junior 10km qualifying performances yet no Victorian walks coaches receive any support from AA. Victorian coaches do it hard without any funding or recognition by AA but they produce the goods anyway - against the odds!

This is the sad reality of the new age for Australian high performance sport.
