In Round 1of AV Shield competition 2 weeks ago, he recorded a 2000m time of 8:41.2., A week ago in Round 2 of AV Shield, he won the 3000m in a PB 12:50.9. What a great start to the season – he has shown that he will be in the mix come the 2015 World Youth trials next year.

In the 3km walk, it was great to see 16 year old Jemima Montag back on the road after a big competition break after this year's World Cup in Taicang, way back in May. She recorded a time of 23:39, just outside the 2015 World Youth standard, and is expected to fight out the trial with Queenslander Clara Smith next March.

The women's 50km saw a good win to Myriam Nicolas in 5:36:59, ahead of Virginie Barthelemy 5:45:16 and Emilie Courgoureux-Auge 5:48:16.

17TH ST PETERSBURG 6 HOUR WALK, RUSSIA, SATURDAY 12 OCTOBER

I missed this one completely so thanks to omarchador blogspot for their report on this year's St Petersburg 6 Hour walk (see <u>http://omarchador.blogspot.pt/2014/10/6-horas-de-marcha-em-sao-petersburgo.html</u>). The event, which was held on the island of Krestovski in St. Petersburg, is a traditional event which is now in its seventeenth year and honors the figure of Yuri Shulgin, a 50km walker in the 60s and 70s and the first Soviet athlete to participate in the Lugano 100km classic which he won. This year's event was organized by St Petersburg walks coach Mikhail Sokolovskiy.

Sergey Lukiyianov won the men's event with an impressive 63 km, covered in 6:01:21, while Olga Borisova won the women's event with an equally impressive 62 km, completed in 6:05:40. Note that Borisova was the women's winner in this year's Paris-Colmar classic.

The program included endurance tests for younger walkers, with the 2 Hour U18 women's event won by 15 year old Kseniya Ivanova, (20 km, 2:04:18) and the U16 10km going to 11 year old Denis Macafeev (1:11:43) and 13 year old Viktoria Banit (57.20).

NATHAN DEAKES WINS THE 2014 EDWIN FLACK AWARD

Athletics Australia acknowledges distinguished service to the sport by athletes through the Edwin Flack Award. Named in honour of Australia's first ever Olympian and gold medallist, it has been awarded annually since 1982. At last Saturday evening's Athletics Australia gala awards dinner in Melbourne, the 2014 recipient was announced - it was **Nathan Deakes**. Well done to Nathan whose feats in the world of walking are known to all. A bronze medal in the 1996 World Junior championships marked the start of his stellar international career. His ongoing excellence saw him rarely outside the top 5 in major competition and his resume included 4 Commonwealth Games gold (2002 and 2006) and one bronze (1998) medals, a Goodwill Games gold medal (2001), a Racewalking World Cup bronze medal (2004), an Olympic bronze medal (2004) and an IAAF World Championship gold medal (2007) - a grand total of 9 medals in major international races. His 20km PB of 1:17:33 stands far ahead of any other Australians and his 50km World Record of 3:35:47 (2006) was an astonishing performance on a tough Geelong course and adverse weather. The ultimate competitor!

Both **Jared Tallent** and **Dane Bird-Smith** were also in the mix on the night, being finalists in the Male Athlete of the Year. Alas, they both missed out to marathoner Michael Shelley but it is a great honour to make the short list.
