WALKER OF THE WEEK

Wow, it was hard to choose my Walker of the Week this time around as we had some great performances that deserve attention.

- Melbourne based New Zealand walker **Alana Barber** was in fine form on Saturday, storming through in a VRWC 8km race at Middle Park in a huge PB time of **35:39**. Extrapolating based on her laptimes, she was on schedule for a U45 minute 10km time. Given that her 10km PB currently stands at 46:49 (done at Middle Park in February), she is in superb shape and will be pushing hard for a spot in the New Zealand team for this year's IAAF World Championships.
- USA based Canberra walker **Ashleigh Resch** walked with distinction in the historic Penn Relays 5000m walk in Philadelphia on Saturday. In the field of 27 athletes covering Olympic Development, women's Masters, Junior Women's and High School Girls divisions, 18 year old Ashleigh placed 2nd in the Junior Women's and placed 3rd overall in a time of **23:31.20**. This was a 66 second PB for her and continues her fine form during her 2 year stay in the States.
- At the Queensland Racewalkers club meet in Brisbane on Sunday morning, 15 year old Luke McCutcheon won the 5km roadwalk with a 12 sec PB of 23:03. Luke, who will be competing in the Australian team at the Oceania T&F Championships in Cairns next month, is steadily chipping away at his times and seems to PB just about every time he races.

Looking further afield, this Friday sees the next IAAF Challenge Series event which will be held in Taicang in China. The big news is that there will be 10 Australian walkers in action - Jared Tallent, Brendon Reading, Rhydian Cowley, Dane Bird-Smith, Chris Erickson, Rachel Tallent, Kelly Ruddick, Beki Smith, Tanya Holliday and Nicole Fagan. And to cap it off, Alana Barber will also be in action and looks in the sort of form to do a big PB. And NSW Judge Kirsten Crocker will be on the judging panel. Talk about a strong Australasian presence.

Some other matters to discuss.

- The AV Country Roadwalk Championships will be held at Middle Park on Sunday 23rd May, along with the Victorian Open 10km roadwalk championships. AV has now opened online registration panels for all the winter season walking championships see http://athsvic.org.au/events/calendar/. Remember you need to renew your AV registration for the new AV financial year (staring 1st April) if you wish to compete in these champs.
- Looking further ahead, entry forms for the **Lake Burley Griffin Carnival** on **Sunday** 7th **June** are now available at the VRWC signin table. An online copy of the entry form is found at http://vrwc.org.au/documents/2015%20LBG%20Entry%20Form.pdf. Entries close with me on Sunday 17th May so chat with me on Saturday if you have questions. It is a huge carnival and not to be missed.

VRWC ROADWALKS, MIDDLE PARK, SATURDAY 25 APRIL

After a morning that threatened, our VRWC races on Saturday at Middle Park ended up being held in good racing conditions – cool, relatively still with only the occasional spot of rain. We had 53 walkers in total competing in a range of events from 1km to 8km, with our new Kiwi members Quentin Rew and Alana Barber well out in front. We welcomed first time VRWC walkers Gunther Ilgoutz, Josh Jensen, Eden Morgan, Heath Beveridge and Chelsea Karagiorgos and we also welcomed back former Australian inernational representative Wendy Muldoon who had her first race in many years – and did pretty well, completing the 4km event in 22:39. And special mentions to U12 walker Ruby Paten who powered through the 6km in 36:49 and to Kyle Swan and Adam Garganis who walked the 8km together, both finishing in an excellent 38:35.

It was a major change for us with U15, U12 and U9 races no longer scheduled. From now on, walkers can compete in any of the events on offer, regardless of their age. Thus our young walkers can choose a longer distance and our older walkers can choose a shorter distance. It worked well on Saturday and the feedback was positive.

The ASICS Australian Little Athletics Championships were held last Sunday in Perth. HUNGARIAN RACE WALKING CHAMPIONSHIPS, BÉKÉSCSABA, SATURDAY 25 APRIL

Our unstoppable European correspondent Emmanuel Tardi was in Bekescsaba (200km in the south of Budapest, near the Romanian border) on Saturday afternoon for the Hungarian racewalking championships. The meet was IAAF sanctioned so there were 3 international judges in attendance and a number of foreign walkers who came to try to qualify for Beijing or other championships. The lap was a flat 1km circuit (500m out and 500m back) with wide turns at either end – perfect for fast walking. Unfortunately the weather was very hot (probably around 27°C) and there was little shade to protect competitors.

In the men's 20km event, Hungarians Máté Helebrandt and Sándor Racz led from the beginning, but when Sandor stoped after half an hour, it was left to Helebrandt to finish things off, winning in 1:23:04. Second place went to 21 year old Slovakian walker Peter Tichy. For Tichy, it is his second qualifier in a couple of weeks for the 2015 European U23 walk champs in Talin (see Slovak article http://atletikasvk.sk/Articles/Detail?ArticleId=2567).

In the women's 20km, Olympian Viktória Madarasz win very very easily with 1:31:31, well ahead of Swiss walker Marie Polli from Switzerland whose time was 1:37:19.

MOULINET TESTS POSITIVE

French walker Bertrand Moulinet announced last week on his facebook page that he had tested positive for prohibited substance FG4592. He has waived the right to have his second sample tested and has decided to accept the penalty and 'plead guilty'. He now faces a mandatory 4 year ban under the new WADA codes. 28 year old Moulinet, who competed in both 20km and 50km at the London Olympics in 2012, came second to Johann Diniz in March when Diniz broke the World 20km record, his time on that occasion a PB of 1:19:18. Presumably he was already on the drug at that time and that may be perhaps where his failed drugs test comes from. The timeframe is about right.

So what does FG4592 actually do? Here's the lowdown from a sports scientist

The FG-4952 molecule is classified as a hypoxia-inducible factor (HIF) stabilizer. The HIF proteins are positive regulators of EPO production in adult kidneys. By stabilizing the HIFs proteins (making them less susceptible to natural degradation), you will increase your endogenous EPO production and therefore the oxygen carrying capacity of your blood. This is a relatively smart doping process as it is undetectable by an EPO anti-doping test. Indeed the extra EPO you produce is endogenous, and therefore cannot be differentiated from your natural EPO. However smart people have recently developed tests to target the FG-4952 molecule itself, and that is what happened to this French race walker. To my knowledge he is the first one to be caught with this molecule, but the test was already being discussed as early as 2009.

So in summary, it produces a similar effect to taking EPO but it is potentially better in several ways. Not only can FG-4592 do almost everything EPO can do, clinical trials have suggested that it may have a better "safety profile" than EPO. More specifically, no heart or blood pressure issues have been observed in trials thus far. Furthermore, FG-4592 is available in a pill form and does not have to be injected into the body. This new compound has another advantage too, relating to iron absorption, as HIF promotes the body's own EPO secretion from the kidneys and other non-renal sources (e.g. the liver) and up-regulates EPO receptors in the bone marrow to produce more red blood cells. HIF also activates factors that improve iron absorption from the gut, that mobilise iron from storage sites within the body, and that effectively transport all the needed iron to the bone marrow for red blood cell production. As such, FG-4592 has an advantage over EPO injections in that athletes need not also supplement themselves with iron at the same time as EPO administration.

So welcome to the new world of drugs taking where the stakes are high and new products are coming to the fore all the time. Presumably Moulinet did not just stumble onto this goldmine himself so the next big question is – who is his source and who has been advising him?

It was a bad week for France as this announcement coincided with the news that the International Equestrian Federation had stripped France of its spot in team eventing at next year's Olympics because of a doping violation.

- Russia will not be barred from major athletics competitions because of allegations of systematic doping according to IAAF President Lamine Diack said Tuesday. Separately, new Russian athletics coach Yuri Borzakovsky defended controversial race walking coach Viktor Chegin, who has seen more than 20 of his athletes banned for doping. "He's a professional in his field, even though people are slandering him with doping scandals," Borzakovsky said, praising Chegin's record in producing medal winners. "I have a lot of respect for any coach with that kind of experience." With the world championships coming up this year in Beijing and the Olympics next year in Rio de Janeiro, Borzakovsky said Chegin will remain on the Russian team "until there's an official piece of paper saying he's accused of something or other."
