As mentioned in last week's newsletter, with 13 women and 23 men entered in Sunday's 20km championships, we look set for some fantastic racing. For the Australians, it is the official Olympic and World Race Walking Teams Championship trial. For the many other international walkers (3 women and 12 men), it is one of only a small number of ratified opportunities to get an Olympic or World Teams Championship qualifier on the boards. And for our juniors, the 10km roadwalk is the official IAAF Teams Championship trial so will also be very competitive. The forecast is for 39 °C so it will be hot but hopefully the early start time will help. The timetable reads as follows

20km Open Men/Women 7AM start 10km U20 Men/Women 8AM start 5km U18 Men/Women 9AM start

- The Victorian Open T&F Championships will be held at Lakeside Stadium on the weekend of 26-28 February. Entries
 closed with AV on Sunday evening.
- If you are interested in competing in the **Melbourne Track Classic 5000m walk** on **Saturday 5 March**, you had better be quick **entries close this Thursday 18th Feb ruary.** Also, if you want to apply for a travel subsidy, Athletics International may be able to help if you meet their performance grid. GERMAN INDOOR T&F CHAMPIONSHIPS

Christopher Linke shot to the top of the 2016 world 5000m indoor ranking list with a big PB of 18:x44.32 on Sunday at the German Indoor 5000m Championships in Erfurt. Yet, he was pushed the whole way by his Potsdam team mates **Nils Brembach** (18:46.77) and **Hagen Pohle** (18:54.32), all three performances pushing the Olympic candidates into the German All-Time top 10 for that distance. Interestingly, the top ranking spot is held by national coach Ron Weigel. The walkers used a home-stay between two South Africa-training camps for their 5000 speed test and the results show that their road to Rio is right on course. Their next outing will be in the international 20km in Podebrady in the Czech Republic on 19th April.

The women's 3000m title was won by 17 year old Potsam walker **Teresa Zurek** (13:46.95) ahead of W45 **Nicole Best** (14:15.80) and last year's winner **Lea Dederichs** (14:16.45). The race was also expected to see the comeback of three-time Olympian Melanie Seeger (SC Potsdam) but the 39 year old did not make it to the start line.

Nowadays, there is no such thing as a quite week in the world of drugs in sport!

Tuesday 9 February

- Is Russia really cleaning up its act? The suspended Fifa president Sepp Blatter and the UEFA president Michel Platini will be invited to the 2018 World Cup in Russia, the Russian sports minister, Vitaly Mutko said. Blatter and Platini, the two men at the top of the world's most popular sport, were banned by the world governing body for eight years in December over a spate of corruption scandals on their watch that, among other things, raised questions about Russia's right to host the tournament. - Spain's Sports Council has stripped runner Marta Dominguez of her status as a Spanish athlete after the Court of Arbitration for Sport banned her for three years for blood doping and removed her 2009 world steeplechase title. The CAS on Nov. 19 upheld appeals by the IAAF and World Anti-Doping Agency that challenged Spain's Athletics Federation's decision to clear Dominguez of irregularities in her biological passport. Consequently, the CAS panel annulled all of Dominguez's competitive results from August 2009 to July 2013, including the period when she won the 3,000-meter steeplechase gold at the 2009 Berlin world championships. - Was Sebastian Coe's rise to the position of president of world athletics aided by the use of secret, coded emails from inside the IAAF that would appear to be at odds with the governing body's code of ethics? The email refers to 'Nick' (disgraced IAAF Official Nick Davies) when in fact he is a recipient via a secret email address under the pseudonym 'Manolo Yanes'. This same email alias will appear in further revelations on Saturday so read on! Why am I not surprised! - Nestlé has decided to terminate its sponsorship deal with the International Association of Athletics Federations (IAAF), the food and beverage company announced on Wednesday. The news follows reports last month that Adidas was planning to end its sponsorship deal with athletics' world governing body almost four years early. "We have decided to end our partnership with the IAAF Kids' Athletics programme with immediate effect," read a statement from Nestlé, which became the main sponsor of the programme in 2012. This decision was taken in light of negative publicity associated with allegations of corruption and doping in sport made against the IAAF.

Friday 12 February

- Kenya is being investigated for breaching the world anti-doping code, WADA said Thursday, and could be declared noncompliant in a matter of weeks. WADA said an independent compliance review committee will now evaluate Kenya and make a recommendation to WADA's board. It's also possible that Kenya could instead be given a deadline and a final chance to honor commitments it made to WADA regarding its anti-doping program. The investigation relates to the Kenyan government's failure to set up and properly fund a working national anti-doping agency, and also its failure to finalize new anti-doping legislation. - The Telegraph puts is a lot more strongly. Kenya is facing the threat of an Olympic ban after moving to the brink of being put on probation by the World Anti-Doping Agency over its failure to get to grips with its drugs problem. The country has been given until the end of Thursday to prove to Wada it was tackling cheating in athletics before being placed on a watchlist of nations at risk of being in breach of the agency's code. Failure to confront its issues within a two-month window would see it declared non-compliant with the code, something that has already led to Russia's track-and-field athletes being banned from competing. Saturday 13 February

There is new evidence that indicates Sebastian Coe did breach the IAAF's code of ethics on his way to becoming the president of world athletics. A document seen by Sportsmail appears to back earlier claims that the most powerful man in athletics did seek help from at least one IAAF employee during his election campaign — a clear contravention of the rules. The document is an email sent in June 2015 by a senior member of Coe's bid team which asks Nick Davies, deputy general secretary of the IAAF, for his assistance. The email reads: 'Nick, Seb also asks that you have a final sense check on the bullets to see if there is anything there that might "startle the horses" in the office or with PD re the commercial bullet.' And of course the email copies in the now infamous alias 'Manolo Yanes' which seems to stand for Nick Davies.
