# WALKER OF THE WEEK

16 year old Queensland walker **Katie Hayward** walked a superb 5000m time of **22:23.87** on the Gold Coast on Saturday. It was a 32 sec PB and must have been a State Record. But more importantly, it is a very significant performance, given that next July sees the 10<sup>th</sup> World Youth T&F Championships in Niarobi, Kenya.

I think that this time may well propel her to the top of the World U18 ranking lists overall; it certainly places her well clear of the local opposition. It's still a long way away but she certainly looks the goods at this stage.

How a young girl took on one of athletics most unusual and demanding disciplines came about by chance.

"I went to the Gold Coast Little Athletics one day and there was a 1100m race walk on. I didn't know there was a sport like that but I jumped in and I won it. I was 10 years old at the time and I had a cross-country background. It's different and something I like to do because I have met a lot of good people through it."

Well done Katie and well done to her Gold Coast coach Steve Langley!

**RACE WALKING MEETING, LISSES, FRANCE, SUNDAY 9 OCTOBER** 

And now off overseas. Emmanuel Tardi was in Lisse, some 30km south of Paris, for their annual racewalking meet on Sunday. There were 50 walkers on the line (2 more than last year) for the 9AM start and they were then off racing on the excellent flat road, over a 1.667km loop.

In the men's 20km, **Gabriel Bordier** (11<sup>th</sup> in the 2016 World Junior champs and contesting his first 20km), **Fabian Fesselier** and **Simon Hurault** started fast and soon cleared away from the rest of the field. Bordier and Fesselier reached the 10km mark in 44:37 and it was not until towards the end of the race that Bordier finally broke clear, to win with 1:28:46, ahead of Fesselier with 1:29:45. With their times, the became the became the 71<sup>st</sup> and 72<sup>nd</sup> French walkers to better 1:30 for the 20km. The women's 20k was won by international junior Camille Aurière (36<sup>th</sup> in the Rome world cup) in her inaugural 20km, her time 1:47:43. Second was super grand mother **Françoise Laville** with 1:57:16, not far outside the W60 world record. In the 10km events, **Benoit Berchebru** 46:02 and **Marine Quennehen** 48:30 won, both beating their PBs. Emmanuel was the chief judge, helped by 5 other judges, including Jean-Pierre Dahm who has judged in the last 2 Olympics.

# GERMAN ROADWALK CHAMPIONSHIPS, ANDERNACH, GERMANY, SATURDAY 8 OCTOBER

The annual German Roadwalk Championships in Andernach last Saturday saw good weather conditions, with cool temperatures and light rain. This helped ensure some fine performances overall.

The 50km event was won by German Olympian **Carl Dohmann**, his time of 3:47:57 over 2 minutes under his previous PB and his third home win after previous golds in 2013 and 2015. Behind him, 20 year old **Karl Junghannß** staked his credentails with an inaugural 3:52:46, despite more than one minute time loss via a toilet break. With **Nathaniel Seiler** the third German in an inaugural 3:58:03, it was an impressive local showing. And they were not the only ones to record good times – add in Italians **Michele Antonelli** (3:53:08) and **Andrea Agrusti** (3:56:17) and GBR's **Dominic King** (PB of 3:55:48 for 2<sup>nd</sup> fastest ever British performance). Overall, 6 under 4 hours – very impressive. In the men's 20km, German champion and Rio 5<sup>th</sup> place **Christopher Linke** (SC Potsdam) won easily with 1:29:27 while in the women's 20km, it was the first time that 3 German women have broken 1:40 for a long time - **Emilia Lehmeyer** (1:36:25), **Teresa Zurek** (1:39:14) and **Saskia Feige** (1:39:25) indicated that in the future with them will be expected. With all the girls still in the U20 ranks and with Zurek the German U20 10,000m walk record holder, it omens well.

- Russian anti-doping authorities have opened an investigation after two banned athletes were apparently allowed to compete
  in the country's biggest marathon. Tamara Shchemerova was listed as finishing eighth in the official results from last
  month's Moscow Marathon, with Yevgeny Khokhlov listed in 10<sup>th</sup> place in a related men's 10km race. However, the
  Russian track and field federation had announced four-year bans for both runners two days earlier. Shchemerova was
  banned for refusing to take a drug test at Russia's national T&F championships, while Khokhlov tested positive for the

  with fake photos taken of a dummy race and presentation ceremony. Swept under the carpet by Russia and let past the
  keeper by the IAAF to which the offense was reported. Pathetic!
- The latest edition of the British based Race Walking Record (RWR852) is now available and contains lots of reading. In
  particular, IAAF walks judge Steve Taylor, who was one of the judges in Rio, has a very interesting article about his time in

### MICHAEL GILLIES SMITH STEPS OUT FOR GOVERNMENTAL ACCOUNTABILITY

Bendigo Walkers Club member and Castlemaine NAB 500 organiser Michael Gillies-Smith is walking 600km from Chewton Town Hall, just down the road from where he lives in the Chewton Bushlands in central Victoria, to Parliament House, Canberra, carrying in his backpack a piece of legislation that would require the government of the day to gain parliamentary approval before going to war. Over to Michael for an explanation:

Currently, Australia's Constitution and defence legislation <u>do not require the government to gain parliamentary approval</u> before going to war or deploying forces overseas. Some Prime Ministers don't even consult Cabinet.

Major General John Cantwell, who was head of Australia's forces in the Middle East, said on Page 24 of his book *Exit Wounds* (Melbourne University Press, 2012), commenting on the 1990-91 Gulf War "Australia's Prime Minister, Bob Hawke, decided it was in 'our national interest' too and committed three navy ships and, later, small groups of specialists, all without consulting Cabinet."

Canadian international lawyer <u>Robert Amsterdam</u> is preparing the legislation. He is based in London and Washington. Bob and I first worked together at the 2007 APEC Summit in Sydney. He is one of the top international lawyers in the world. His defence of African disaster management expert Dr Georges Tadonki at a UN Tribunal won *American Lawyer* magazine's Pro Bono Case of the Year at the 2013 Global Legal Awards.

In 2013 I had a feeling we were heading into a world war situation. I commissioned a poll. Did Australians want a say in whether we went to war. 58.5% said Yes, 26.4% Possibly and 15.1% No. (iView National Omnibus, 1050 respondents, the sample representative of the national voting population.) I asked Robert if he would prepare the legislation. ABSOLUTELY, he emailed back, within minutes. His remittance? A couple of bottles of Australian shiraz.

The legislation is such that it could be adapted for other parliaments around the world. Some countries, such as Germany, Sweden, Denmark, the Netherlands and Finland, do require parliamentary approval. Others, including the UK, USA and Canada, don't. Under the Geneva Centre for Democratic Control of Armed Forces's scale (DCAF), Australia's level of parliamentary involvement is likely to be rated 'very weak' (Parliamentary approval not required for military action, Parliamentary consultation not required under Australian law).

I'm leaving Chewton Town Hall about 10am on Sunday, October 23. I plan to walk about 20 to 30km a day. I should arrive at Parliament House the week of November 21. Both Houses of Parliament are sitting that week and the next. I am writing to all Lower and Upper House MPs, 226 in total, letting them know about the current situation, the walk and the Bill. It is then in their hands and the hands of the Australian people what happens next.
