WALKER OF THE WEEK

My Walker of the Week this time around is 13 year old NSW walker **Allanah Pitcher**. Walking in the NSWRWC roadwalks a week ago, she recorded an inaugural 10km time of **51:31**. Now I don't know of any comparable U14 10km performance in Australia so I am assuming it is an age group best ever.

Allanah took all before her nationally last year in the U13/U14 age group category and was in my 2016 Top Ten Women list. She is continuing on in 2017 right where she left off at the end of 2016 – from the front! She was my Walker of the Week back in February, when she walked 14:19.11 to win the U15 3000m walk at the NSW Junior T&F Championships. She recently won the LBG Carnival U14 2km and U18 5km championships, and now has upped the ante with her fantastic 10km time. She is a truly exciting prospect.

ITALIAN T&F CHAMPIONSHIPS, TRIESTE, ITALY, 30 JUNE - 2 JULY

The Italian T&F Championships, held in the renowned Grezar Stadium in Trieste, saw walk wins to Eleonora Giorgi and Federico Tontodonati. Excellently reported by http://www.marciadalmondo.com/eng/dettagli_news.aspx?id=2837.

For **Eleonora Giorgi**, it was a welcome return to racing after surgery in December, following her Rio Olympic walk. She won the women's 10,000m walk championship, held on Friday evening, with a 37 sec PB time of 43:56.95. **Valentina Trapletti**, also selected for London, was second with 44:04.9, while 21 year old **Nicole Colombi** recorded a big PB of 46:28.34 to take third. The men's 10,000m, which was held on Saturday morning, saw **Federico Tontodonati** win for a fourth time (previous wins in 2011, 2012 and 2015) with 40:34.09. The minor placings went to **Leonardo Dei Tos** (41:17.49) and **Vito Minei** (41:27.67).

HARRY JEROME INTERNATIONAL TRACK CLASSIC, VANCOUVER, BC, CANADA, WEDNESDAY 28 JUNE

Canadian Olympians **Ben Thorne** (5:41.89) and **Evan Dunfee** (5:42.87) finished first and second in the Harry Jermone Track Classic 1 Mile Track Walk in Vancover last Wednesday evening, recording what are probably the two fastest one mile walk times ever done by Canadians. "I believe those are record times," said Evan, who warmed up for the race with a 25 miles training session on Wednesday morning. USA walker **Katie Burnett** was the only female walker in the field and she walked well, recording 7:01.14.

HYDE PARK HARRIERS SUMMER MILE MEET, LEEDS, WEDNESDAY 28 JUNE

England also saw a very fast 1 Mile Walk last Wednesday evening, as part of a night of time graded mile runs put on by the Hyde Park Harriers in Leeds. The race walk was scheduled at 7:30PM, right in the middle of the programme. With several athletes in Leeds for a week as part of an IAAF funded Race Walking Biomechanics Research Camp, some raced in this meet and others raced in the World Trials 5000 m races at Birmingham on Sunday (see separate report below). Some like Callum, Bethan, Alana and Gemma did both meets.

As for this one, Callum Wilkinson won with 6:00, ahead of Cameron Corbishley (6:04), Bethan Davies (6:37), Alana Barber (6:43) and Gemma Bridge (6:46). Now to put that in context, 1 Mile translates to 1609m. So to translate those times to 1500m, probably take off 23-26 secs.

BRITISH ATHLETICS TEAM TRIALS, ALEXANDER STADIUM, BIRMINGHAM, 1-2 JULY

And now to Sunday when **Tom Bosworth** stormed to the British 5,000m track walk title, breaking the British record in the process. Stopping the clock at 18.43.28 he sliced over 15 seconds off his old record set two years ago, earning £2500 in the process. Chasing him home was his training partner and World Junior champion **Callum Wilkinson** who was also inside the old record with his 18.56.96 performance. Callum was rewarded with a new U/23 National record. Tom commented: "No Brit has ever gone inside 19 minutes, so to get two in one race is pretty special going into London (World Championships). I've felt a lot of pressure this year to back up my result from Rio, so to go 17 seconds quicker than I did last year is really exciting."

Bethan Davies was an easy winner in the women's 5000m, breaking the British 5000m track walk record with a stunning 21.21.52 and also earning £2500 record breaking bonus. **Alana Barber** also starred with a PB of 21:59.14 in second place. Her conqueror last week over 20km, Gemma Bridge was shoulder to shoulder with her but was disqualified mid race. The walks were the only events

where foreign competitors are able to compete and, as can be seen from the results, they had a big impact and helped contribute to a high standard event. They were ineligible to take medals.

FRENCH UNDERAGE T&F CHAMPIONSHIPS, DREUX, FRANCE, 1-2 JULY

Thanks to Emmanuel Tardi for the results of the track walks at the French U20 and U18 T&F Championships last Sunday in Dreux. He tells me that it was wet but still good conditions for racewalkings, with the temperature around 15°C.

In the U20 Men's race, **David Custer** lead early but had to slow after a number of yellows and reds. He was caught at the 8000m mark by **Justin Bournier** but cleared away again in the final 1000m to win with 2:34.95.

In the U20 Women's race, the top two girls had failed twice this year to achieve the required standard (48:35) for the European Championships in Grosseto. They walked 48:36 and 48:44 in Podebrady in April. Sunday was their last opportunity to succeed so they decided to walk together. They swapped the lead regularly before finishing well under the necessary mark, with **Camille Aurriere** first with 48:20.98 and **Eloise Terrec** second with 48:22.07.

In the U18 Boys' race, the best walker, Ryan Gognies, was an absentee, being on an altitude training camp in preparation for the World youth Championships in Kenya. In his absence, **Valentin Chaumette** (22:13.36) just held off **Matteo Duc** (22:13.41).

In the U18 Girls's race, **Manon Lefresne** and **Sarah Ali** walked together early on, before Ali was forced to slow due to yellow cards, ensuring an easy victory for Lefresne with 24:18.12.

2017 SWEDISH FOTRALLY, SWEDEN, FROM THURSDAY 29 JUNE FOR AS LONG AS IT TAKES!

The Long Walk is a novel by Stephen King, published under the pseudonym Richard Bachman in 1979. It was collected in 1985 in the hardcover omnibus The Bachman Books, and has seen several reprints since. Set in a dystopian present, the plot revolves around the contestants of a gruelling walking contest, held annually by a totalitarian version of the United States of America. In 2000, the American Library Association listed The Long Walk as one of the 100 best books for teenage readers published between 1966 and 2000. According to Stephen King, it is the first novel he wrote, begun eight years before his novel Carrie was published in 1974, when he was a freshman at the University of Maine in 1966–1967. It's a ripper yarn that I first read many years ago and which I still have on my bookshelf. Of course, in the book, once you dropped behind, you were shot. Luckily that does not happen with Fotrally—you are simply out of the race but live to fight again another day!

So, just how far can a person go before he/she can go no further? Well, in 2009, Pontus Kylberg (pontus.kylberg@fotrally.se) decided to put the concept to the test and organised what is perhaps the ultimate ultra challenge. The walkers walk day and night, without rest until there is only one left standing. Around 300-400 people start but only a few get beyond the 24 hour mark. From then on, it's a brutal war of attrition as, one by one, they fall by the wayside. All contestants walk together as a group at a speed of 5km/h. In the front there is a leading vehicle which the contestants may not pass and in the back there is a portable toilet which the contestants may not be passed by. Each contestant gets 25 minutes per 24 hours for toilet breaks (all the contestants are timed). You must carry what you need, with support zones only once every 6 hours where you can supplement drinking water and food stocks. But the race itself never stops, even for such refreshment points. You must get going before the rear vehicle passes. There is also a national team competition with Swedish and Norwegian walkers normally putting teams in.

Wow! What a concept. The 2014 event was fought out between Swedish walkers **Silvio Cannavá** and Lena Jensen. Lena eventually had to call it quits after 55 hours of walking, leaving Silvio as the last man standing. In fact, Swedish walkers filled the first 25 places that year. Then the 2015 staging really upped the ante on what was possible with winner **Fredrik Forsström** walking for an amazing **87 hours and 45 minutes**, just over 32 hours above the previous record. Jonas Davidsson took second place in the same time (but obviously could no longer continue) while Silvio Cannavá, Pia Rosvall, PerOla Axelsson and Niklas Grebäck also shattered the 2014 record of 55 hours. For 44 year old Forsström, it was his 4th Fotrally – his previous placings had been 20th (2012 24:20), 3rd (2013 33:26) and 5th (2014 48:18). 5km/hr for some 88 hours comes out at around 440km of continuous walking. In 2016, it came down to another two person duel, with **PerOla Axelman** eventually winning with 72 hours 12 minutes, after Robert Jonsson had to stop, total distance 361km! Obviously Axelsson could have gone on but he called it quits at that stage, content with being the last person standing. It was his sixth attempt and gave him his first victory after 5th, 4th, 3rd and 2nd placings in previous years.

The improvement in the event can be traced with the winning times from the 8 annual stagings held up till and including last year.

And what do you get for your efforts – the Fotrally medal – bronze for more than 12 hours, silver for more than 24 hours and gold for more than 48 hours of walking.



So the big question was – how far could they go this year? The 2017 race saw a record 327 entrants starting in the Stockholm suburb of Gärdet and hoping to complete the huge lap around Lake Mälaren, taking in as many cities as possible before returning to the starting point at the end of 3 days, ready to go into a second lap if required. Last year 30 walkers lasted 24 hours or more. This year, 57 walkers made it to the 24 hour mark. By 30 hours, the field had been reduced to 21 walkers. By 40 hours, it was down to 9. By 48 hours, it was down to 5, then 4, then finally to 3 as last year's winner PerOla Axelsson called it quits at 56 hr 44 min. It would be another 20 hours before one of the final 3 cracked, with **Fredrik Holst** stopping at 76 hr 10 min, a new PB and the same placing as in 2016. Then it was two first timers 50 year old **Richard Andersson** and 39 year old **Ange Truss**. A further 5 hours and Agne Truss could go no further, stopping at 81 hr 00 min. That left Richard Andersson as the last person walking. He had been non-stop for 81 hours and had covered 405km! Here are those who walked for 24 hours or more. The women's walk, at 9:10PM, was the last event on the program and what a way to finish, with Hungarian **Viktória Madarász** breaking one of the oldest national records on the books (Mária Rosza-Urbanik, 1990, 21:24.76) with her time of 21:02.72. This is in fact a world leading time for 2017. Fellow Hungarians **Rita Récsei** (23:11.43) and **Anett Torma** (24:02.75) completed the podium with their best times of the season. Ahead of the main events, an U16 3000m for women was held, with victory going to 14-year-old **Tiziana Spiller** with 15:58.24.

The Bad and the Ugly:

- USA Olympic gold medallist Gil Roberts has been cleared of any wrongdoing and will not face a ban after an arbitrator from the American Arbitration Association (AAA) ruled he had not deliberately taken a banned substance. Roberts, a member of the United States team which won the men's 4x400 metres relay title at last year's Olympic Games in Rio de Janeiro, tested positive for probenecid, a diuretic and masking agent, in an out-of-competition test in March. However, the AAA has ruled that the 28-year-old from Oklahoma had "ingested a prohibited substance without fault or negligence". Hmmmm....perhaps one set of rules for some people and another set for others.
