- · With regard to who walks what distances at AV Shield, David Armstrong has clarified it all as follows

U14/U16 do either 1500m or 2000m 40+ do either 2000m or 3000m U16/18/U20/Open do 2000m, 3000m or 5000m.

• The 2018 Australian 10,000m Race Walk Championships will be held at the AIS track in Canberra on this coming Sunday 14th January. Unofficially I have heard that the women's 10,000m race is on at 8AM and the men's 10,000m race is on at 9:25AM. Still waiting to see the entry lists and some sort of official timetable. I believe that there are also 3000m/5000m walks on at 11:30AM but know nothing more. The lack of timely information is very frustrating with the championships only 5 days away.

With that being said, the 10,000m races are going to be absolutely fantastic, with over 20 international walkers in Canberra for a study/camp and all entered. Nearly all of our better walkers have also entered. To have held these races in conjunction with the National T&F Champs in the week following the National 20km in Adelaide would have been a disaster. I can't personally understand how anyone could seriously espouse this position. Well done Athletics Australia.

ATHLETICS VICTORIA SHIELD, ROUND 10, SUNDAY 7 JANUARY

Athletics Victoria Shield competition was due to restart for the new year last Saturday but a horrendously hot day saw all sport cancelled throughout Victoria. AV managed to get the Shield competition rescheduled to Sunday afternoon but numbers were down, due to the late change, due to the school holidays when many families are away from home and due to the fact that most of our better walkers are currently in Canberra for the AIS study/camps.

The metropolitan walks which has been scheduled for the Aberfeldie track on Saturday, were moved to Albert Park on Sunday. PORTUGUESE 50M AND 35KM CHAMPIONSHIPS,, PORTO DE MÓS SUNDAY 7 JANUARY

Inês Henriques and João Vieira were crowned Portuguese 35km Champions last Sunday in Porto de Mós.

Henriques, the 50km world record holder, completed the distance in 2:45:51, taking almost 5 minutes off her current Portuguese record which she established in this same race last year. **Mara Ribeiro** finished in second position with 3:02:29, a time which qualifies her for the IAAF Race Walking World Teams Championships 50km, while **Sandra Silva** completed the women's 35km podium with a time of 3:28:21. Sandra Silva went on to with the 50km championship with 5:08:13.

Vieira was the first to cross the finish line in the men's 35km, his time of 2:38:18 taking 22 seconds off his own national best, set in 2017. **Miguel Carvalho** took second with 2:41:36 and **Miguel Rodrigues** rounded out the podium with 2:43:39, all 3 qualifying for the IAAF Race Walking World Teams Championships 50km. In the men's 50km championship, **Pedro Isidro** won with 4:11:25, followed by **Cristiano António** with 4:39:56 and **Luís Silva** 4:44:11.

In the U20 women's 10km, **Joana Pontes** won with 50:27, also qualifying for the IAAF Race Walking World Teams Championships, while **Paulo Martins** won the Men's U20 10km with 45:45, just 45 secs outside the World Team Champs qualifying time.

ENGLAND ATHLETICS INDOOR RACE WALKING CHAMPIONSHIPS, SHEFFIELD, SUNDAY 7 JANUARY

Thanks to Mark Wall for his report from the first of the major English indoor walking races, which were held in conjunction with the English Senior & Under 20 Combined Events Champs in Sheffield last Sunday.

The England Athletics Indoor Championships (along with guests) was conducted on Sunday 7th January at the EIS Indoor facility at Sheffield.

The Senior women's race saw three Commonwealth Games athletes toe the line. The England Selection, **Gemma Bridge, Erika Kelly,** one of only two athletes selected by the Isle of Man and **Bethan Davies** of Wales (the Principality is yet to announce their team but she remains a probable selection. Bethan was well inside the UK record toward the conclusion of the race when she disqualified, having lapped the entire field and still going away. This left Gemma Bridge a comfortable winner with Erika Kelly breaking the IoM record in second. Erika will be basing herself in Leeds for the coming weeks in preparation for the Gold Coast. The Leeds based Polish Junior International, **Agata Kowalska**, almost charged her down but had to settle for third athlete home. Agata is studying Journalism at Leeds Beckett and is thriving in the atmosphere there. **Ana Garcia** (born May 2001) had been targeted for a far better time however despite hurting herself in warm-up she was still able to secure the bronze medal. She is now aiming for the European Under 18 Titles later in the year (24:30 UKA qualifying time but the team has a limit of 33 athletes with an expectation those selected are top 8 prospects).

The Men's race was smaller than one would hope but the exciting prospect was that the field in its entirety were all under 21 at the present moment. With Tom Bosworth away training with other UKA funded athletes in South Africa, the reigning World Junior Champion, Callum Wilkinson lapped the entire field to record an Indoor personal best. He too will be on the Gold Coast so he is preparing well. Leeds training partner Cameron Corbishley had another business-like performance. He should be in China with the British team for the World Teams event and then will be aspiring for the European Championships later in the year in Berlin. Tom Partington continues to progress and deserved his 3rd place. Tom is also

Leeds based and is the son of multiple Commonwealth Games representatives Steve and Cal Partington but is now making a name for himself in his own right.

LATEST AIS STUDY CAMP GETS UNDERWAY

I am currently in Canberra helping out with the latest AIS based training camp which will go for a 4-5 week period leading up to the National 20km in Adelaide in early February. The camp is funded by a sports science study grant, in a similar way to the last two years, and is being run under the direction of Dr Louise Burke of the AIS.

Like the last two camps, this one studies the effects of diet on performance and training, and it brings together a large number of top overseas walkers along with many of our top senior and underage Australian walkers. Up to twenty of the men are funded as part of the study. Our top juniors are funded as part of the Junior Development plan. The rest of the Australian and overseas walkers are self funded and have made the necessary financial sacrifice to come to Canberra to train and be part of the group. The benefits that they will get from this intensive camp environment are incalculable.
