This week's newsletter is coming out early (Sunday afternoon) as I fly out on Monday morning for China and the 2018 IAAF Race Walking World Cup. Whatever news is missed, I will catch up with in next week's issue.

Just as this week's newsletter is early, next week's may be delayed a day, as I will be travelling back from China on the Monday/Tuesday. So don't worry if next week's newsletter does not appear in your in-tray next Tuesday.

WALKER OF THE WEEK

My Walker of the Week this time around is 61 year old Western Australian masters walker Lyn Ventris. After suffering a severe hamstring injury in 2012 and eventually opting for major surgery, it has been a very long road to recovery. She did not return to racing until 2015 but recurring injuries since then postponed her return to her World Record breaking form for which she was renowned.

Finally, in the Australian Masters Championships in Perth last Friday, she scorched around the track in the women's 5000m walk, her time of **25:41.58** bettering the **W60 World Record** by an amazing 28 seconds. Lyn currently holds 11 Masters World Records ranging over the W45, W50 and W55 age groups. With her first W60 age group, she has announced her return to the world stage in the best possible way. Congratulations and well done Lyn. It has been a long battle but you never gave up.

ACTRWC advise that there has also been a change to the fee structure, with there being no fees cap. This has implications for those families who enter their walkers for multiple events. RWA events are \$35 per event, AACT \$20 & Fitness Walk \$20. Note also that to enter more than one event you will have to "enter another registration" where some registration details will have to be entered again.

With the World Race Walking Team Championships scheduled for next week in Taicang, China, here are some snippets that have hit the presses in the last few days

- While **Jared Tallent** won't be racing at the IAAF World Race Walking Team Championships in China next week, he will be stepping atop of the podium twice! The IAAF will present his Gold medals from the 2012 and 2016 editions of these Championships. He finally receives these rewards after so many years!
- Commonwealth Games 20km silver medalist Tom Bosworth stayed on in Brisbane after the Commonwealth Games, training with teammate Callum Wilkinson. AUSTRALIAN LITTLE ATHLETICS CHAMPIONSHIPS, RUNAWAY BAY, GOLD COAST, 28-29 APRIL

The 2018 Australian Little Athletics Championships were held on the weekend at Runaway Bay Sports Super Centre on the Gold Coast. The meet concentrates on the U13 division and includes 1500m walks for boys and girls in that age group. Field sizes are limited in all events, walks included, as each State has a strict quota of athletes overall. Up to two athletes can be selected per State per gender in the walks but not all are necessarily walkers. It may be that a good runner may double and be entered in to the walk as well as in the run. This was certainly the case for Victoria where only 1 of the 4 reps was a specialist walker. Queensland won both walks, compliments of **Jayda Anderson** (6:42.31) and **Kris Hayward** (6:32.43), Both are coached by Steve Langley so well done Steve! It was also great to have Commonwealth Games 20km walk silver medallist Tom Bosworth presenting the medals.

The Australian Masters T&F Championships are being contested at the moment in Perth, and it is the usual huge meet with athletes from all over Australia and the wider Oceania area (see <u>http://www.mastersathleticswa.org/perth2018/</u>).

The 5000m track walks were contested in Friday and the 10km road walks were held this morning at 9AM. Unfortunately, the results are very slow to come up, so I can only report at this stage on the track walks.



- The IAAF last week issued new Eligibility Regulations for Female Classification (Athlete with Differences of Sexual Development) for events from 400m to the mile, including 400m, hurdles races, 800m, 1500m, one mile races and combined events over the same distances. This has big implications for athletes like Caster Semenya whose career will suddenly get a lot harder now. - It was announced yesterday that Ukranian international Ruslan Dmytrenko has pulled out of the IAAF World Race Walking Team Championships. Apparently, he has received a letter from WADA advising him of an abnormal biological passport reading. Although not yet a guilty verdict, it does raise serious questions about him and he has taken the correct course of action. If true, he stands to lose a lot, depending on how far back it goes. His results include gold in the 2014 World Team Championships and silvers in the 2012 World Team Championships and the 2013 World University Games. Stay tuned! - It was announced recently that 7 Russian walkers would be allowed to compete as Neutral Athletes in the IAAF World Race Walking Team Championships in Taicang. The list of names read as follows

Olga Yeliseyeva Yuliya Lipanova* Yana Smerdova Klavdiia Afanaseva* Vasiliy Mizinov Sergei Shirobokov* Sergey Sharipov*

The walkers with *s against their name deserve closer attention as they are part of a photo, taken recently in Karakol, Kyrgyzstan. This city is where disgraced Russian walks coach Viktor Chegin lives, and where RUSADA alleges that "athletes from the Russian national walking team" have been working with Chegin who is banned for life. This is not the first time that it has been alleged that Russian walkers have been continuing to work with Chegin. German sports documentary company ARD produced a video expose in 2016 purporting to show Chegin hidden in a van while coaching athletes in a closed Russian city. Should any Russians be allowed to compete in Taicang? I say get them all out while this is investigated.
