WALKER OF THE WEEK

My Walker of the Week this time around is 80 year old **Margaret Beaumont**. Since turning 80 in February, Margaret has been breaking new ground and has set two VRWC W80 records:

Margaret Beaumont W W80 5000m Track Walk 46:14.0 VMA 5000m Track Championship, Mentone 18/02/2017 Margaret Beaumont W W80 5km Road Walk 46:07 VRWC Races, Middle Park 12/05.2017

Of course, this is just the proverbial tip of the iceberg for Margaret. She has the rest of the winter season ahead of her to gradually tick off records for the other distances.

I asked Margaret about when she and husband Ian started racewalking: Here is what she had to say:

We started walking at Mentone in 1995. Neither of us had any background in Athletics, but I had retired, and was looking for new interests. A friend suggested we walk the Milford Track in N.Z., so after some serious training along the bayside tracks with bricks in our backpacks, we did that. We didn't want to lose this newfound fitness, and by chance, at a Christmas Eve church service, met Pam Mews whom I had worked with earlier at Bentleigh High School. She suggested that we come to Mentone Athletics Club, assuring us that we would not have to run!

We loved it at Mentone – still do – but were unable to pluck up the courage to come to VRWC till April 1999. We both started that day, and in my diary I wrote: "First time and we were very nervous. I came second last, and Ian last, but we did our best."- Nothing has changed much!

Tim, this is all very trivial, but we are constantly grateful for the wonderful times we have had, and are still having with our favourite sport!

Just within Victoria, we have 8 other octogenarians still dusting off the walking shoes on a regular or semi-regular basis: Colin Silcock-Delaney (85), Bill Lotherington (85), Pam Mews (83), Jim Crawford (82), Harry Summers (82), Bob Gardiner (82), Ian Beaumont (82) and Geoff Major (82). What other sport can boast such lifelong enjoyment for its devotees.

WHAT'S COMING UP

- Next Sunday will be one of our biggest racedays for the season, with VRWC, Victorian and Victorian Country roadwalk championships to be held at Middle Park. Registrations for the AV and AV Country Championships close with AV on Friday 25 May. See http://athsvic.org.au/event/2018-av-10km-av-country-walks-championships/. AV championship events include
 - Open 10km Men/Women Victorian and Victorian Country Championships
 - U20 10km Men/Women Country Championships
 - U18 5km Boys/Girls Country Championships
 - U16 3km Boys/Girls Country Championships
 - U14 3km Boys/Girls Country Championships

A few people have asked how it all works on this sort of day. To compete in an AV Championship, you must be a paid up AV member for the current financial year that started on 1st April 2018. You may be a member of one of the AV clubs like Collingwood Harriers or Knox or Coburg, etc. But registering with AV is via a separate payment to AV. This then gives you access to the AV online panel to complete your AV Championship entry. The fee for entering an AV championship is \$15.

On Sunday, there are also VRWC championships which normally cost \$10 to enter (the slightly higher cost is to cover the cost of medals). But if you have entered the concurrent AV or AV country championship race, you will only have to pay an additional \$5 to register for the VRWC club championship. You enter the VRWC races via http://vrwc.org.au/wp1/. I hope that helps – it's clear as mud to me!

 held in the Spanish city of La Coruña on Saturday, With the Europeans chasing spots for the European Championships later
 this year, I expect the fields to be packed with quality walkers.
- On-line entries for the 2018 Lake Burley Griffin Walking Carnival (Sunday 10 June) are now open and may be accessed via link https://www.registernow.com.au/secure/Register.aspx?E=29858. ACTRWC advise that there has also been a change to the fee structure, with there being no fees cap. This has implications for those families who enter their walkers for multiple events. RWA events are \$35 per event, AACT \$20 & Fitness Walk \$20. Note also that to enter more than one event you will have to "enter another registration" where some registration details will have to be entered again. Entries close on Friday 1st June. Paper entries are not possible. Online entry is the only option this year.

XVI EUROPEAN MASTERS ROAD ATHLETICS CHAMPIONSHIPS, ALICANTE, SPAIN, 18-20 MAY

The Spanish city of Alicante hosted the 16th European Veterans' Road Athletics Championships (EMACNS) last weekend, with road runw and walkw on offer. An impressive 225 walkers represented 22 countries, with 124 entries in the 10km men, 80 entries in the 10km women, 81 entries in the 30km men and 53 entries in the 20km women. As expected, the home country dominated the entry list with 81 walkers, ahead of Italy 46, Germany 26, Great Britain 18 and France 5. All walk races were held on a 2 km circuit on the Paseo del Puerto, alongside the harbour. See more at http://www.emacnsalicante2018.online/.

My results below are restricted to the first 10 in the bigger age groups.

10km Road Walk Men, Friday 18 May, 9AM and 11:30AM

The men's 10km was contested in two heats, such were the overall numbers. The first of the two heats was for walkers aged M55 or older and saw 53 competitors face the starter's gun. M55 **Francisco Reis** of Portugal was fastest overall (50:01), ahead of M70 **Ian Richards** of the United Kingdom (54.01) and M55 **Jose Muñoz** of Spain (55.04). The second heat, for walkers aged M35 to M54, started at 11:30AM, with 45 walkers in attendance. Fastest time overall to M40 Italian **Vincenzo Magliulo** (46.56) ahead of M45 Spaniard **Juan Antonio Porras** (47.19) and M45 German **Steffen Borsch** and M50 Spanish **Miguel Angel Carvajal** (both with 47.41). As expected, the Spaniards dominated at home with wins in the M35, M45, M50, M60 and M65 divisions, ahead of Italy with a win in the M40 and GBR with a win in the M70.

BRITISH NATIONAL 10KM AND YAG CHAMPIONSHIPS, WARWICK UNIVERSITY, COVENTRY, SUNDAY 20 MAY

Last Sunday saw the British Athletics/County Athletic Union/Race Walking Association Roadwalk Championships at Warwick University in Coventry. FRENCH INTERCLUB CHAMPIONSHIPS ROUND 2, VARIOUS VENUES, FRANCE, 18-20 MAY

The French Interclub Championships were held in around 60 different cities around France and, in every meet, 5000m walks for men and 3000m walks for women were contested. Overall, around 1000 male and 1000 female walkers were in action. In his city of Reims, **Yohann Diniz** produced an M40 world best of 18:57.13. **Gabriel Bordier** also produced a very strong PB in Nantes on Saturday with 19:03.04. In the women's competitions, **Emilie Menuet** walked 12:36.89 in Laval, and Tunisian **Chahineze Nasri** walked 12:53.97 in Reims. I have reviewed the results and extracted the best marks. I hope I have not missed out on anyone.

CONTINENTAL CENTURIONS 24H QUALIFIER, SCHIEDAM, NEDERLANDS, MAY 19-20

One of my most eagerly anticipated ultra walks has now been completed, with the annual Continental Centurions 24 Hour Qualifying walk held in Schiedam in the Nederlands last saturday and Sunday. Organized by the Rotterdamse Wandelsportvereniging Club (RWV). It is a huge smorgasboard of events, with the traditional 100 Mile race one of a large number of events on offer. It was held in the Beatrixpark on a course around 4km in length and saw huge numbers overall.

And now onto the results, with a bit of explanation. First to the 100 Miles results which saw 18 walkers reach the centurion mark within the requisite 24 hours. Of them, 10 were first time Continental Centurions and are now awarded badges C462-C471. With the first 5 under 21 hours, it was a high quality affair, with the overall win going to **Birger Coulier** with 20:16:40. **Wilma Driessen** was the first woman wih 21:32:35, just ahead of the amazing English walker **Sandra Brown** with 21:55:25. This was Sandra's fourth hundred this year and her 190th overall, a record that will never be matched. Sandra, who recently turned 69 years of age, shows no sign of slowing or reducing her demanding yearly schedule (in 2017 she completed 10 hundreds). Sandra remains the only person with all 7 Centurion badges. 50KM 2018 WORLD RANKING LIST UPDATES

With the latest 50km walks in Schiedam (see above) on the weekend, Paul DeMeester has rejigged his 2018 50km Ranking Lists.

We now have 239 male walkers representing 37 member federations from all six Areas, and we have 136 female walkers represent 28 member federations from all six Areas. In particular, the women's list shows 3 women under 4:10, 17 women under 4:30, 27 women under 4:40 and 48 women under 5:00. What a huge improvement in quality and quantity in the last 12 months since the event was added.

Let me reiterate that these lists are only for 2018. They do not include the many fine 50km walks from last year, meaning that Ines Henriques and others are not even in the mix yet. And we have the European Championships 50km races still to come.

Rather than reproduce them in the newsletter (which would take around 4-5 pages, I have uploaded them into web file http://www.vrwc.org.au/documents/2018%2050km%20Ranking%20Lists.pdf which is now available online.

OUT AND ABOUT

- WADA confirmed last Thursday that it has maintained the suspension of RUSADA as the body has still not met two outstanding reinstatement criteria. These concern access to the Moscow Laboratory and their acceptance of the findings of the McLaren Report, which says that an institutional doping scheme was in operation at events including the Sochi 2014 Winter Olympic Games. WADA director general Olivier Niggli confirmed there was no change in the status of RUSADA, first declared non-compliant in November 2015. From now one, the official IAAF rankings will be based on multiple performances (as in sports like tennis) and spots in these major events will be based on this ranking.
