WALKERS OF THE WEEK

My Walkers of the Week this time around are two outstanding Ballarat walkers in 45 year old **Kelly Ruddick** and 14 year old **Alanna Peart**. Competing in the Victorian Roadwalk Championships last Sunday in Melbourne, they were the standout performers on a cold and very windy day.

- Kelly won the Victorian Open 30km Championship in a time of **2:37:36**, with a very impressively even paced walk (splits of 52:04, 53:29 and 52:03). It was her first outing over the 30km distance and she set new Australian and Victorian Masters W45 best times, as well as setting a new VRWC club record. She also set a couple of interesting firsts the first woman ever to win this championship, as well as the first walker to get 3 votes from EVERY judge (6 in total) in our VRWC style award competition. If she decides to tackle the Australian 50km in December, it will be very interesting to see what sort of time she can knock out. I think she is capable of a big result!
- Alanna won the U16 5km walk in a big PB time of 23:39. She powered through the first 2km in 9:08 and it was only the very strong winds that prevented an even faster finish time. As it was, it was still a 54 second PB. Coming after her win in the LBG Carnival U16 3km (14:02) last month, and after 2nd place finishes in the Australian T&F Championships U16 3000m and U17 5000m back in March, she is an in-form walker and one of the brightest of a very talented Australia wide pool of young walkers.

This is a combined meet between Athletics Australia and RWA, with AA medals for individual places and RWA medals for winning teams, along with RWA Handicap trophies (just like in the LBG carnival in Canberra). All entries must be made via the AA online panel at https://winterwalks.eventdesq.com/. Cost \$30 per event. This is the last reminder I will be able to give about entering.

AV AND VRWC CHAMPIONSHIPS, MIDDLE PARK, SUNDAY 29 JULY 2018

It was cold and very windy at Middle Park on Sunday morning for our AV and VRWC roadwalking championships, but it did not daunt the 47 hardy souls who turned out to race.

The first events to start were the 30km, 3 Hour and 20km walks, with **Kelly Ruddick** providing the highlight with her 30km winning time of 2:37:36. Both Kelly and third placed **Tracy Feiner** (2:54:21) set new Victorian Masters 30km records in what was the first time over the distance for them both. **Pramesh Prasad** took second place in the event with a 5 min PB time of 2:46:51, setting a new Fijian national record. So well done to all three walkers on top performances. **Kevin Cassidy** also walked well to win the VRWC 20km race with 1:49:22.

TASMANIAN ROADWALK CHAMPIONSHIPS, TUNBRIDGE, HOBART, SATURDAY 28 JULY

Thanks to Wayne Fletcher for the results of the Tasmanian Roadwalk champs in Hobart. Thanks to David Moore for this report.

A perfect, fine, windless sunny winter's day greeted this year's Athletics Tasmania Road Walk Titles held at Tunbridge and some fine performances were well and truly on the cards.

The standout performance of the day was **Will Robertson**'s 23.38 in the U/16 5km Championship which puts him in the upper echelon of his age group peers at the National level. Will has an exceptionally good base fitness as demonstrated by his cross-sport abilities in swimming and cross country and this is really starting to show.

Some serious racing took place in the younger age groups. A battle royal took place in the 3km event between the winner of the U/14 Boys event **Bryce Lawes** and U/14 Girls winner **Chloe Ahern**. These two youngsters were neck and neck for most of the race with Bryce drawing away from Chloe in the last 150 metres to finish in 17.24 with Chloe a mere six seconds behind in 17.31. Finishing 2nd to Chloe in the Girls race was **Demi Petterwood** who finished in an encouraging 20.02.

The youngest of competitors were in the U/12 2km Championship with **Macie Petterwood** winning the Girls event and **Oliver Morgan** winning the Boys event. Both impressed the Walk Judges and onlookers with their concentration on good walking technique and style.

The longest event of the day was a 10km event. Competitors at this distance were **Anna Blackwell** for the U/20 Women Championship and **Steve Ahern, Wayne Fletcher** and **Ron Foster** for the 0/40 Championship. Anna set off at a solid pace and established an early lead which she maintained throughout the event finishing in 57.49. Anna is eligible to compete in the U/18 age group but has shown she is more than comfortable with the longer event. Anna was another athlete on the day who also impressed with solid technique and style.

In the O/40 event Steve Ahern hung onto the coattails of Anna Blackwell for as long as he could and won the O/40 Championship in 61.25. Steve is hoping to crack the 60 minute barrier and is getting close to achieving it. Wayne Fletcher was next to finish in a Season Best 80.53. Wayne is having a great season and is enjoying his lifetime journey in athletics as much as ever. Ron Foster took the bronze in 88.41, Ron has been sick over the last few weeks and we look forward to when he bounces back to his more formidable form.

A notable absente from these Championships was Alice Randall who is trekking the wilderness of the Overland track, but Alice will join with many of those who competed at Tunbridge to put their best feet forward in the Walk Championships and Federation events on the Gold Coast in August.

A Life Member of both Richmond Harriers and the Victorian Marathon Club, Neil has also been a significant club man helping to organise races including the many years that Richmond Harriers hosted the Burnley Half Marathon on behalf of Athletics Victoria.

In 1976 Neil opened "Runners World" in Melbourne providing a specialised athletics gear store covering the full range of Track and Field footwear and is renowned for his generous support of athletes through sponsorship, gift vouchers, discounts and advice.

Neil's generosity and commitment to the sport, continues through Runners World, as Neil has also sponsored countless events. A major partner of Athletics Victoria for 25 years, Runners World provides significant sponsorship as the official bib partner for which the sport and Athletics Victoria is extremely grateful.

As a competitor, Neil showed talent as a distance runner from an early age and went on to regularly place in Australian and Victorian Marathon Championships in the 1960's as well as placing in multiple international races over various distances, including placing second to Ron Clarke in the 1968 Emil Zatopek 10,000m race, second in the 1969 Australian Marathon Championships in 2:24:08 and setting a marathon personal best of 2:17:59 in 1974 in New Zealand.

This is but a small example of Neil's achievements and career highlights provided in support of Neil's nomination.





FROM THE ARCHIVES - THE GLOVER SHIELD, AUSTRALIAN WALKING'S OLDEST SHIELD

With entries closing next Monday for the Australian Winter Roadwalking Championships, it is timely to review the teams event associated with the Open Men's 20km Championship race in that meet. This is called the Glover Shield and it is our oldest and most historical perpetual trophy. Here goes!

There had been a number of specialist racewalking clubs in existence for some time in the early 1900's and Australia's first Olympic walker Bill Murray (1912) had been a member of the Victorian Walkers and Field Games Club, formed in 1911. The Sydney Amateur Walkers Club had also been formed in 1911 and racewalking was also strong in South Australia and Queensland.

The First World War put everything on the backburners with the Melbourne based walking club actually ceasing activities in 1915 as all of its Executive had enlisted. It was not until 1921 that the Victorians reformed, now calling themselves the Victorian Amateur Walkers' Club (VAWC).

Late in 1921, officials from the NSW and Victorian walking clubs met with a view to instigating an interstate walking race. There had been 1 Mile and 3 Miles track races which were held annually as part of the Australian Track and Field Championships, but no longer walks were officially sanctioned.

An offer was made by Footscray jewellers *Mr T. Glover and Son* (the son was a sprinter with the Footscray Harriers) to donate a Shield, to be known as the *Glover Shield*. The proposed championship date was October 1922 and N.S.W. requested A.A.U. to hold a postal vote amongst member States to validate the championship.

Whilst the majority of States voted in favour of the concept, a number of V.A.A.A. officers were opposed to the event and voted against the motion. Thus it did not win the day. With the A.A.U. refusing to sanction the event, the walking clubs continued with their own planning, targeting a date of 14th July 1923 and billing the event as the *Australasian 7 Mile Walk Championship*.

In 1939, the distance was changed from 7 miles to 10,000m, with VAWC winning the shield.

After 1958, major changes were made by the newly formed Australian Federation of Amateur Walking Clubs. The Glover Shield became once again a senior event under the auspices of AFAWC and a separate Federation shield (the Robinson Shield) was contested for juniors, also over 10 km. The Glover Shield was now alternated bi-annually with the Alexander Cup which was contested over a 50 km distance. The winning teams continued as documented below.

Over time, the Shield outgrew its design and a second tier was added in the background, to enable further results to be added.



After 1991, the Alexander Cup (now held over 20 km) was retired and the Glover Shield was changed to the 20 km distance. Since then, the event has been contested annually over the distance of 20 km.
