WALKER OF THE WEEK

My Walker of the Week is 19 year old Western Australian walker **Declan Tingay**. Competing in WA Interclub competition last weekend in Perth, he won the 1500m track race in a big PB time of **5:37.3**. This pushes him up the Australian All-Time ranking list to position 10 (see below) and caps off what has been a wonderful year, which included 4^{th} place in the World U20 Championships 10,000m track walk in a new Australian U20 record of 40:49.72.

PAN PACIFIC MASTERS GAMES, GOLD COAST, NOV 2-11, 2018

The Pan Pacific Masters Games on the Gold Coast (<u>https://mastersgames.com.au/ppmg/</u>) were completed last weekend, after a successful 10 days of competition in a wide range of sports. The stats read impressively - just on 16,000 people from 40 countries competed in 42 sports at 45 venues. The racewalks were contested on Friday (5000m), Saturday (3000m) and Sunday (10km).

The highlight of the 5000m walks was provided by 91 year old NSW walker **Heather Lee** who scored an age graded 100.43% with her time of 42:06.13. And a special note for VRWC walker **Pramesh Prasad** who set a PB with his time of 23:50.74. Fastest times overall to **Ignacio Jimenez** (23:24.51) and **Nyle Sunderland** (29:56.43).

GRAND PRIX DE NOGENT SUR MARNE, NOGENT SUR MARNE, FRANCE, SATURDAY 10 NOVEMBER

To say it has been a huge last few days in France would be an understatement. With the 100th anniversary of Armistice Day on Sunday, the eyes of the world were on the country as world leaders gathered there. And it was also a busy time for French walkers with races scheduled across the country. Thanks to Emmanuel Tardi for his many race reports and photos.

First to the Parisian suburb of Nogent-sur-Marne on Saturday afternoon for 20km and 10km races. Emmanuel tells me it was a trying day for officials (he was the chief judge) due to the ever present dark skies and rain. The races started at 2:30PM and were contested over a 1km lap in the parklands surrounding the local track. There was lots of roots and dead leaves on the road surface, but it was a pleasant course.

Some 60 walkers were on the start line, including international walkers **Aurélien Quinion** and **Marine Quennehen**. Marine had initially entered her name on the 10km, but after the warm up, she felt good and decided to race the 20km, only 5 minutes before the start! Aurélien walked with **Dimitri Durand** to pace him through to a good 10km mark (Dimitri won in 49:01), then he chased down **Fabian Fesselier** in the 20km race, going on to win with 1:37:43. Marine easily won the women's 20km with 1:41:29. The women's 10km was won by **Adèle Duclos** with 58:44.

LE GRAND PRIX DE LA VOIE SACRÉE, BAR LE DUC TO VERDUN, FRANCE, SUNDAY 11 NOVEMBER

November 11th is a public holiday in France because it marks the end of the First World War (100th anniversary this year). Two walking races have been organised on this date for many years. The first is the Grand Prix de la voie Sacrée which is a 57.7km race between Bar le Duc and Verdun. The race has been held each year since 1980. In even years, it goes from Bar le Duc to Verdun and in odd years, it goes from Verdun to Bar le Duc.

The road used is a memorial road. It is the only road in France who don't have number, it's only named "La Voie Sacrée". It was along this road that some one million soldiers travelled to the famous Battle of Verdun in 1916. Most of them never came back. Memorial milestones, each with a soldier's helmet on it, are placed every kilometre.

Emmanuel was there to lend support and to take photos. There were 23 starters this year for the 9AM start, with the temperature around 12°C, very good for walkers. By the 10km mark, the lead group had whittled to **Florian Letourneau**, **Mathieu Olivares**, **Christer Svensson** (the 2015 winner), **Christophe Erard** (the 2016 winner) and **Gérard Guétat** (the 2017 winner). By the 21km mark, the pack had been reduced to Guétat, Olivares and Svensson, with Letourneau 500m further back. At this point, Letourneau changed gear, catching the leaders by 30km and then going on to win in 5:35:45, just over 6 minutes ahead of Gerard Guetat (5:4136). Zbigniew Klapa, one of the Paris-Colmar legends with 5 victories in the 1990s, finished 6th with 6:11:37. In the women's race, **Dora Jakob-Brière** from Switzerland won easily with 6:32:41, her 5th win.

The ancillary events of 21.5km were won by **Philippe Bibet and Sonia Demon**. Now aged 90 years, **Robert Schouckens**, the winner of the 1977 Paris-Strasbourg, finished the race with time of 3:22, after passing the 20km mark in 3:11.



ASCENSION DU MONT SAINTE ODILE, KLINGENTHAL, FRANCE, SUNDAY 11 NOVEMBER

And that is not the only French race held each Armistice Day. Every November 11th, there is also a walking race in Klingenthal in Alsace, in the east of France. In fact, this is the oldest racewalking event in France, having been held since 1935. The goal is to climb to the summit of Mont Sainte-Odile, a peak in the Vosges Mountains, where there is a convent. The race is only 8.55km long, but it is a hard walk, with the starting altitude at 280m and the finishing altitude at 750m. The field size is restricted to 100 and there are divisions for racewalkers and for nordic walkers, with separate rankings.

This year the race was won by **Florian Mayer**, the 2018 50km national champion, in a time of 45:56. This was just outside the 1981 race record of 45:37, set by Gérard Goujon from Belgium 1981.
