WALKERS OF THE WEEK

My Walkers of the Week are two of our most promising underage walkers, Alanna Peart and Corey Dickson, who were officially awarded their VRWC Runners Awards as our top two walkers from the recently completed summer season. Runners World Kew proprieter Neil Ryan was on hand to present each with \$500 in cash and \$500 in goods from the store. For any young walker, such a boost is always appreciated.

- 15 year old Alanna, who had her first race way back in November 2010 (age the grand old age of 6!), has had a great last 12 months, including golds in the 2018 LBG U16 3km Roadwalk and in the 2018 Winter Roadwalks U6 5km and silver in the 2019 Australian T&F Championships U17 5000m walk. With PBs of 6:36 (1500m), 13:44 (3000m), 23:39 (5000m) and 51:02 (10,000m), she looks set for a great winter season, with her first big engagement being at next month's LBG Carnival in Canberra. And she was in action on Sunday morning at Middle Park, winning the Victorian Country Championships U18 5km roadwalk in a time of 24:00.
- 16 year old Corey Dickson has been walking with VRWC since early 2012 (starting at age 9) and has been in the forefront of his age group right from the start. His last 12 months has also been superb, with gold in the 2018 LBG U16 3km, silver in the 2018 Australian Schools Championsips U18 5000m and a big double in the 2019 Australian T&F Championships silver in the U20 10,000m and bronze in the U18 5000m. With PBs of 12:53 (3000m), 22:03 (5000m) and 44:53 (10,000m), the sky's the limit. He will be in action again in next month's LBG Carnival in Canberra and will then represent Australia 2 weeks later in the U18 5000m walk at the Oceania Championships in Townsville. He also walked on Saturday, winning the VRWC U18 5km Championship with 23:26.

The AV AV Country 10km championships started proceedings, with **Rhydian Cowley** (41:09) and **Jemima Montag** (44:38) walking superbly to take the golds and **Kyle Swan** (44:17), **Daniel Walters** (46:08), **Kelly Ruddick** (47:39) and **Sarah Brennan** (57:43), taking the minor medals. Special mention for **Pramesh Prasad** who set a Fijian national record with his 4th place finishing time of 49:27.

The National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) is a college athletics association for small colleges and universities in North America. As of right now, it has 251 member institutions,3 of which two are in Canada, one in the U.S. Virgin Islands, and the rest in USA. The annual T&F Outdoor Championships are one of 26 national championships that the organisation sponsors annually and were held over 3 days leading into last weekend.

The 5000m walks were held in the Mickey Miller Blackwell Stadium in Gulf Shores just after 4PM last Friday on a very hot and humid afternoon. **Alger Liang** of the University of British Columbia took the lead in the men's race just before the 1000m mark, going on to win comfortably with 21:54.55. The women's race was also an easy win, with **Anali Cisneros** of Judson University in Illinois lengthening her lead throughout the race to win comfortably with 25:06.98.



- I can hardly wait for **Hajo Seppelt**'s book on his 30 years of investigation into doping in high level sport. Due to be published on 27th September, it will raise the lid on the whole can of worms that is modern sport. I just hope an English language version is also published. Hajo is of course the face behind the German TV Sports channel ARD who broke the Russian racewalking scandal, centred around the now disgraced Saransk school of walking.



PRAGUE TO HOST THE 2021, 2023 AND 2025 EUROPEAN RACE WALKING CUPS

Big news on the European front, with the Czech city of Podebrady being awarded the next 3 European Race Walking Cups (2021, 2023 and 2025). I note the abovr article talks about a 50km being held in 1894 and that's true. The first 50 km race walking competition from Karlín (in Prague) to Podebrady was indeed held in 1894, two years before the first modern Olympic Games. But this was just a once off, with the Poderady 50km not starting regularly until 1929. The 50km walk had been announced for the 1932 Olympic Games and the Czech Federation was keen to prepare its walkers for the gruelling new event.

With the exception of four years during WWII, the Podebrady race has been held every year since 1929. Events for women were added in 1982 (5km initially, then 10km and now 20km). In the early 1990s, because of safety concerns, the event was moved to a 1km long town circuit in the Spa Park. Since then the meet has continued to grow and now includes international matches for Junior and Youth walkers.

The Podebrady 50km has produced its fair share of walking milestones.

- In the 1930s, Jaroslav Stork-Žofka of AC Sparta was a five-time winner, whose best time of 4:40 lasted until 1946.
- The legendary Josef Doležal finally bettered the time with 4:23:40 in 1946, the first of his three world records that he set in Podebrady. He reduced the record to 4:16:06 in 1954 and earned an unequalled 7 wins from 1949 to 1955.
- The four-hour barrier lasted for nearly a quarter of a century until the Mexican Raúl González won in 1978 with 3:41:20.
- In April 1997, Podebrady hosted the 18th edition of the IAAF Race Walking World Cup and the race walkers performed excellently, Jefferson Perez of Ecuador winnig the 20km walk with 1:18:24 and Jesús Ángel García of Spain winning the 50km in 3:39:54.
