OCEANIA CHAMPIONSHIPS - 10,000 METRES WALK

The six Australian representatives in the 10,000m track walk at next week's Oceania Championships highlight a number of new emerging and talented race walkers in Australia. Our group is headed by our three already selected for the Doha World Championships **Dane Bird-Smith**, **Jemima Montag** and teenager **Katie Hayward**, along with Rio Olympian **Rachel Tallent**. Hayward has been outstanding in 2018/19, as the 18-year-old has broken a number of Australian under-20 records and clocked the third best 20km walk time in Australian history. The other two in the men's race is teenager **Declan Tingay** and **Rhydian Cowley**. Declan, was a brilliant fourth at the World U20 Championships and has also broken Australian junior records in the last year.

Maybe going under the radar has been the great progression of 28-year-old Rhydian Cowley in the last three months. After making eight appearances in the green and gold at the highest levels, including Olympics and world championships, this year Cowley has been in great form with two times of 1:20.19 and 1:21.02. His new PB, which elevated him to number 7 Australian all-time, has not only qualified him for the Doha World Championships, but also the Tokyo Olympics.

Rhydian credits a change in focus, a good period of training and a move to **Brent Vallance**'s squad as key to his recent progression. "It's hard to pinpoint exactly what makes the most difference, but I think my last 12 months training having been some of the most consistent I've managed is probably a factor. I think my change in coaching environment at the end of last year has also made a difference, getting regular training sessions in with a good group of athletes including Jemima Montag, Quentin Rew (NZL) and Kyle Swan. And I've been focusing on having fun and enjoying my athletics a bit more in this last year, which I think also helps."

VRWC 'GUESS YOUR FINISH TIME' ROADWALKS, MIDDLE PARK, SATURDAY 15 JUNE

Our annual 'Guess Your Finish Time' races on Saturday afternoon saw a very healthy 51 walkers in attendance, with the weather perfect - still, sunny and cool. Walkers had to nominate their finish time, then race without the benefit of watches or lapsplits. Prizes were on offer for the closest guesses in each division. So results are given in that order, rather than in the usual fastest times format.

It was great to see international walkers **Kyle Swan, Jemima Montag** and **Quentin Rew** joining us and doing some hard reps as part of the 8km race. Talk about inspiration. Well done to those who were spot on with their guesses – **Glennis McPherson, Hamish Blackwood, Emily Smith, Liam Hutchins, Dee Holohan, Heath Beveridge, Amelia Davison, Pramesh Prasad, Darcey Roberts, Sarah Holmes** and **Eden Morgan** were all within 5 secs of their guesstimates. And a special mention for 8 year old **Ela Uzun** who broke our U9 2km club record by a whopping 2 minutes and 11 secs, doing 11:24.

- The IAAF Doping Review Board has agreed that the applications of 14 Russian athletes have met the exceptional eligibility criteria to compete in international competition as neutral athletes in 2019 while the Russian national federation (RusAF) remains suspended. Always disappointing to see any Russian athletes competing internationally, given the current situation. - One step forward, two steps back. Thirty-three Russian athletes from a range of sports face doping cases for using banned treatments from a doctor, the Russian anti-doping agency said Monday. All of the athletes in the new Russian case are from a sports academy in Chuvashia in central Russia, a region known for its track and field squads.
