Walkers intending to walk in the VRWC 35km Championship and 6 Hour Open Walk must also pre-enter via our VRWC online portal at https://vrwc.org.aUwp1/ (35km and 6H entries close on Sat 14th Sept).

All VRWC entrants in the 50km and 6 Hour events are automatically entered in the VRWC 35km club championship. It is also possible to enter this event as a standalone event.

 Then it's time for break for our Australian walkers. For Victorians, our summer season will not kick off until AV Shield Round 1 on Saturday 5th October.

WALKERS OF THE WEEK

It's hard to zoom in and choose one standout performance from the many last week. Consider

- 28 year old 2016 Olympian **Rhydian Cowley** (PB 1:20:19) was an easy winner in Sunday's Australian men's 20km Roadwalk Championship, breaking away early and walking on his own to a final time of 1:26:28. After 5 silvers and 5 bronzes in Australian 20km roadwalk championships and after 4 silvers and a bronze in Australian 10,000m track walk championships, he has finally broken through to win his first Senior Australian racewalk championship. Now that is what I call a milestone hard earned.
- Our trio of young stars from Ballarat all won gold medals in Sunday's Australian Roadwalk Championships in Adelaide Jemma Peart (U20 10km 53:09), Alanna Peart (U18 5km 24:43), Fraser Saunder (U16 10km 24:11). The dominant walkers in their respective age groups, they each cap off what has been a great winter season of excellence.
- 70 year old Heather Carr continued on her winning ways in the Oceania Masters Championships in Mackay, Queensland. Last week, I reported on her win in the 10km road walk. This week, she completed the triple crown with wins in the W70 5000m track walk and in the W70 3000m track walk. And what walks they were! Her 5000m walk time of 32:00.85 set a new VRWC W70 record and her 3000m walk time of 18:01.06 broke the W70 World Record by 4 secs! The previous record of 18:05 had been held by Sweden's Britta Tibbling since 1989!
- And talking of club records, 11 year old Darcey Roberts walked a fine 4th place in the U18 5km at the Australian Roadwalk Championships in Adelaide on Sunday, her time of 26:45.08 over 3 minutes better than her current VRWC U12 5km club record of 29:19 and in fact only 4 secs over Jemima Montag's VRWC U13 club record of 26:41 and Darcey has another 12 months up her sleeve to chase that one. As an added bonus, her 4th place ensured that she and her team mates Alanna Peart and Charlotte Hay won the Teams Race in that age group.

But you know the story...I have to choose someone. Now Heather has won the award twice in the last month and Rhydian won it in late July for his wonderful Victorian 30km win. So I have decided to focus on our younger walkers this week and am jointly awarding it to **Jemma, Alanna, Fraser and Darcey**. These youngsters are our champions of the future and deserve our accolades and recognition. Well done troops!

AUSTRALIAN ROADWALK CHAMPIONSHIPS, ADELAIDE, SUNDAY 8 SEPTEMBER

The Australian Roadwalk Championships were contested in the Adelaide Parklands, Adelaide, on the morning of Sunday 8th August. The venue was the same one used for the Australian Summer Roadwalk Championships each February, but the course was shortened from 2km to 1km, thus avoiding a hilly section at one end. The weather was not kind to the walkers, with strong winds throughout the morning and with rain setting in after the first few races. The slower than normal times are perhaps a reflection of the conditions.

The Open 20km championships were the first events underway at 8:30AM. 28 year old 2016 Olympian **Rhydian Cowley** (PB 1:20:19) was an easy winner in the men's race, breaking away early and walking on his own to a final time of 1:26:28. After 5 silvers and 5 bronzes in Australian 20km roadwalk championships and after 4 silvers and a bronze in Australian 10,000m track walk championships, he has finally broken through for a win! 20 year old **Kyle Swan** (6th 2018 World Junior Champs 41:44) walked a 4 minute PB to take silver with 1:31:41, while 21 year old **Adam Garganis** made it a clean sweep for Victoria with the bronze in 1:32:12, a good time considering he has trained or raced little over the last 12 months.

38 year old **Claire Woods** (3rd 2018 World Team Championships 50km 4:09:33) was untroubled to win the women's title with 1:44:55 in a very small field but she was very nearly a non starter: "I was seriously under the weather last night, my two year old (Harvey) passed on a nice little bug to me, which had me up most of last night – so I'm happy to have been out here. Last night when I went to bed I wasn't coming, but luckily we live about 2km from here, so I woke up this morning and got a couple of bits of dry toast into me and fronted up."

Claire and Rhydian are both in the Australian team for the 2019 World Championships and will be in action again in Doha. Most of the remainder of the walks team are already in Europe and have had to miss this particular championship, due to the timing.

The junior (U20) 10km titles went to **Mitchell Baker** (44:59) and **Jemma Peart** (53:09) while the U18 titles went to **Gwyllym Young** (45:59) and **Alanna Peart** (24:43). Titles were also contested for U16 (5km), U14 (3km) and U12 (2km).

Well done to the Victorians - only a small group of 13 but everyone of them comes home with at least 1 medal. In total, they earned 3x3 team golds, 4 individual golds, 3 individual silvers and 2 individual bronzes. And to top it off, they won the Brennen Shield, as the top RWA club for the year on points. And finally, a new U12 5km club record to Darcey Roberts who raced well above her age for the team and came 4th in the U18 5km. Big congrats everyone.
