AVSL ROUND 2, AROUND VICTORIA, SATURDAY 12 OCTOBER

The Athletics Victoria Shield League (AVSL) continued last weekend with with 5 venues in action around Victoria (Berwick, Doncaster, Ballarat, Bendigo and Geelong). Once again, AV results were up almost immediately on the AV Results Hub (see https://athsvic.resultshub.com.au/results.html) and it made my reporting job a relatively simple task.

Overall, 87 walkers competed in a mixture of 5000m, 3000m, 2000m and 1500m track walks, with the two metropolitan regions the biggest venues. The results below show both the age group of the walker and the number of points each earned for his/her club. Seven walkers scored in excess of 500 points, with Andrew Jamieson (526), Alanna Peart (526), Heather Carr (523), Kyle Swan (519), Darcey Roberts (517), Rebecca Henderson (510) and Corey Dickson (502) leading the way.

AVSL Round 2, (Yellow vs Red), Tom Kelly Athletics Track, Doncaster

Adam Garganis opened his summer season with a good 13:32.7 to win the 3000m walk at Doncaster, but it was 12 year old **Darcey Roberts** who produced the walk of the day with her huge PB time of 15:13.1. Marcus Wakim won the 1500m with a fast 7:40.7 ahead of Liam McLennan (8:00.2).

- The fallout from the Alberto Salazar banning is underway. Neil Black will leave his role as UK Athletics' performance director at the end of this month after being heavily criticised for backing Salazar. Black had twice refused to rule out resigning in the wake of the World Championships, where his position had been weakened further by falling short of his medal target. But Sportsmail understands there was also an appetite for change at the organisation, which has come in for heavy fire for its handling of a 2015 review into Mo Farah's coaching relationship with Salazar, who was banned for four

- In more fallout from the suspension of athletics coach Alberto Salazar by USADA, The Nike Oregon Project (NOP) has been shut down by Nike. CEO Mark Parker made the announcement on Thursday, Oct. 10 by a memo that was initially shared with Runner's World Magazine. See https://athleticsillustrated.com/nike-oregon-project-shut-down/.
- Wow, this is huge. RUSADA director general Yury Ganus has suggested "thousands" of changes were made to the Moscow Laboratory data before it was handed over to WADA. In an interview with German magazine Der Spiegel, Ganus claimed some of the changes, which included the names of athletes involved, were made as late as December 2018 and January 2019. Ganus' concession appears to strengthen the case for RUSADA to be declared non-compliant a sanction which would trigger a range of punishments, including a ban from sending athletes to Tokyo 2020. - India is another hotbed of potential and real drug use in sport. India's Nirmala Sheoran is to be stripped of the two gold medals (400 metres and 4x400 relay) she won at the 2017 Asian Championships after being banned by the Athletics Integrity Unit (AIU) for four years. The 24-year-old tested positive for steroids drostanolone and metenolone at a competition back in India in June 2018.
