- Aso, as the VRWC Financial Year started on 1st October, you can renew your membership on either Wednesday or Sunday. You can also now do it online via a link at https://www.vrwc.org.au/VRWCMembershipApplication.shtml.
- Entries are now open for the Australian 50km meet at Fawkner Park on Sunday 1st December. Enter at https://www.athletics.com.au/events/51744/. Alas, the button which showed current entries has now disappeared and AA is just putting up a weekly summary of entries at the bottom of the link. Note that entries close either tomorrow or Friday (both dates are quoted on the AA event page) so time is quickly running out. It is good to see a healthy number of 50km walkers on the list.

And talking of the 50km at Fawkner Park, this is the main opportunity for Australian walkers to qualify for the 2020 IAAF World Race Walking Team Championships, but Athletics Australia has not yet published the Selection Criteria document for this major event. I have been talking to AA over the past few days and I am assured that it is just about to be published. So check https://www.athletics.com.au/high-performance/national-teams/ in a few days time.

- A further reminder of the Walks Judging Seminar which will be conducted in Melbourne the day before the 50km meet (ie Saturday 30th November). See full details at http://athsvic.org.au/2019/generalnews/walk-judging-seminar/. Download the application form from the AV link.
- AV has informed us that the racewalks have been swapped from AV Shield Round 6 (on 30th November) to AV Shield Round 10 (on Saturday 18th January). The reasoning is that Round 6 clashes with the AA/AV Walk Judging Seminar on that day and that would make it difficult for AV to get walk judges for that day's Shield. I think it's a good idea as it adds another walk at the business end of the season. With that change made, the rest of the AV Shield now reads as follows

Athletics Victoria took a gamble with a Relay Round last Saturday as part of its AV Shield competition. I was at Doncaster and I was impressed by the huge number of athletes in attendance, competing for their clubs in a large variety of relay formats. And of course, it gave clubs a hitout before the Victorian Relay Championships which are to be held at Box Hill on Saturday 23rd November. The good news for the walks fraternity was the inclusion of mixed gender 4x800m walk relays (teams of 2 male and 2 female walkers), with 4 of our 5 venues fielding teams (23 in number, a total of 82 walkers). Craig Barrett, 50km Walk Commonwealth Games silver medallist and three-time Olympian, swapped his walking shoes
for running shoes last week for the 100m solo run in the Taranaki Steelformers Mountain Event at New Plymouth, New
Zealand. He finished a close second behind 2016 winner Oliver Vincent. On the final 25km from Okato to New Plymouth,

Barrett was reducing Vincent's lead with each km, Vincent bravely holding on to cross the line in 16:22:31 and Barrett just over 2 mins behind with 16:25:12. Well done Craig!

- Gene testing could be introduced in time for next year's Olympic Games in Tokyo, IOC President Thomas Bach announced
 last week. It has been hailed as the most significant advance in drug-testing since the athlete biological passport was
 formally introduced in 2002. It could be accompanied by dried blood spot testing (DBS), another significant new weapon

- Teenager Angela Ndungwa Munguti is the latest Kenyan athlete to fail a drugs test and face a doping ban. The 17-year-old
 African Youth Games 800 metres silver medallist tested positive for Norandrosterone, a a metabolite of anabolic steroid

- **Mo Farah** faces having drug-test samples reassessed as part of a new WADA investigation into athletes from Nike's Oregon Project. See https://www.thetimes.co.uk/article/mo-farahs-old-samples-may-be-retested-jjtzxnnql.
- The deep connections between NIKE and USATF and the IAAF go back many years. Consider a few titbits. USATF CEO Max Siegel signed a long-term sponsorship agreement with Nike in 2014, worth a reported \$500 million. The deal would lock NIKE in with USATF until 2040! Over many years, Siegel has been criticised for his spending and leadership style and described as a "polarizing figure" in the track and field community. Who has close ties to Nike none other than IAAF President Seb Coe. Let's not forget that it was only after huge pressure that Coe, after gaining the IAAF Presidency, only reluctantly ditched his controversial £100,000 a year role as a Nike ambassador, maintaining at the same time that it was not a conflict of interest. Finally let's not forget the controversial awarding of the 2021 IAAF World Athletics Championships to Oregon by the IAAF, bypassing the usual formal bidding process. In fact, that was so suspicious that it is being investigated by the FBI and the Criminal Division of America's Internal Revenue Service (IRS). Yes, NIKE has its tentacles everywhere in USA and the global sport of athletics. The question you must ask yourself is should I buy my sports gear from NIKE?
- And here is another Nike bombshell. At 17, **Mary Cain** was already a record-breaking phenom: the fastest girl in a generation, and the youngest American track and field athlete to make a World Championships team. Then, everything changed. This 7 minute video from the New York Times is a MUST WATCH. What a horrendous story! It's the sort of psychological and biological manipulation that we used to hear about in the old East German days. It now seems that Salazar has even more to answer for. If WADA is indeed going to investigate each of his athletes, I wonder how far that investigation will go! See https://apple.news/A001pC XJQdyp12B9Zq5GVw.
- RUSADA director general Yuri Ganus has publicly contradicted claims by his country's Sports Minister Pavel Kolobkov that data from the Moscow Laboratory was not manipulated. Kolobkov, an Olympic fencing gold medallist, claimed last Thursday that Russia had nothing wrong. "Nothing was removed there, our experts insist this didn't happen," Interfax, an independent news agency in Moscow, reported. Ganus, though, attending the fifth World Conference on Doping in Sport, disputed the claims of Kolobkov. He has repeatedly blamed unnamed Russian officials for doctoring the data handed over to WADA.
