VRWC TRACK RACES, MENTONE ATHLETICS TRACK, MENTONE, WEDNESDAY 13 NOVEMBER

The VRWC Summer Season continued last Wednesday evening, with 20 walkers contesting track events at Dolomore Reserve, Mentone. Conditions were cool with occasional windy bursts but were not too bad overall.

The 10,000m walk was the first event to kick off at 6:30PM and it was 20 year old **Kyle Swan** who went straight to the lead, recording an impressive solo time of 42:27. 17 year old **Corey Dickson** also walked well to finish with 49:39, while 12 year old **Darcey Roberts** continued her stellar form, walking her first ever 10,000m and setting a new VRWC U13 club record of 56:42 (the previous record of 58:10 had been set by Bec Henderson in 2014.

MEETING D'AUTOMNE, NOGENT-SUR-MARNE, PARIS, SATURDAY 9 NOVEMBER

Emmanuel Tardi was in Berlin last week for the 30th anniversary of the fall of Berlin wall (he was there in 1989 when the wall fell) so this week sees a catchup on what has been a busy couple of weeks in the world of French racewalking. I continue to be impressed by the huge numbers of walking enthusiasts across France, along with the number of race organisers who put on their own races.

First to Saturday November 9th, which saw the 4th edition of the Grand prix de Nogent-sur-Marne, held in that southern suburb of Paris. Organizers were very happy with the large number of starters for what is classed as a winter race. The main races (10km and 20km) started at 2:30PM and were contested over a 1km loop which was clallenging, with roots and dead leaves on the road. **Marine Quennehen** (French National team member) won the 20km race with 1:43:19. while the 10km was won by junior walker **Aymeric Hue** with 47:48.

43RD GRAND PRIX DE LA VOIE SACRÉE, VERDUN TO BAR LE DUC, FRANCE, SUNDAY 11 NOVEMBER

November 11th is a public holiday in France because it marks the end of the First World War. Two walking races have been organised on this date for many years. The first is the Grand Prix de la voie Sacrée which is a race between Bar le Duc and Verdun. The race has been held each year since 1980. In even years, it goes from Bar le Duc to Verdun and in odd years, it goes from Verdun to Bar le Duc.

The road used is a memorial road. It is the only road in France who don:t have number, it:s only named "La Voie Sacrée". It was along this road that some one million soldiers travelled to the famous Battle of Verdun in 1916. Most of them never came back. Memorial milestones, each with a soldier:s helmet on it, are placed every kilometre.

This year, the race length was 55.1km and the winners were **Sandrine Eichholtzer** and **Florian Letourneau** (who also won in 2018).

ASCENSION DU MONT SAINTE ODILE, KLINGENTHAL, FRANCE, SUNDAY 11 NOVEMBER

And that is not the only French race held each Armistice Day. Every November 11th, there is also a walking race in Klingenthal in Alsace, in the east of France. In fact, this is the oldest racewalking event in France, having been held since 1935. The goal is to climb to the summit of Mont Sainte-Odile, a peak in the Vosges Mountains, where there is a convent. The race is only 8.55km long, but it is a hard walk, with the starting altitude at 280m and the finishing altitude at 750m. The field size is restricted to 100 and there are divisions for racewalkers and for nordic walkers, with separate rankings.

This year the men:s race was won by **Florian Mayer**, the 2018 50km national champion and defending champion, in a time of 49:53, well outside the 1981 race record of 45:37, set by Gérard Goujon from Belgium in 1981, while **Alejandra Ramirez Gomez** won the women:s race.
