68TH TOKYO WALKING CHAMPIONSHIPS, TOKYO, WEDNESDAY 1 JANUARY 2020

Japan and Hong Kong always kick off our international racewalking year with their New Year's Day walks. I think both carnivals start at the same time but, as Japan is 1 hour ahead of Hong Kong, it can probably claim the title of the Year Opener. For Japan, the occasion was the 68th Tokyo Walk Championshihps, which were held in that city on a bright sunny Wednesday morning.

Thanks to marciadalmondo (see http://www.marciadalmondo.com/eng/dettagli news.aspx?id=3673) for their prompt report.

The 20km men's race, with over 100 starters and 83 finishers, saw a great battle between 20km world record holder **Yusuke Suzuki** and 20 year old newcomer **Motofumi Sawa**. Sawa kept up with Suzuke for most of the race and only fell behind in the final section, finishing 48 secs in arrears with a big PB of 1:20:49. Third placed **Tomohiro Noda** (1:21.24) and fourth placed **Yutaro Murayama** (1:21:58) also broke 1:22:00. The good news continued for Japan with 19 year old **Hiroto Jushu** finishing fifth with 1:22:55.

THE FIRST WALK 2020, HONG KONG, WEDNESDAY 1 JANUARY 2020

The Hong Kong carnival, called "The First Walk", took place on the new Pan Shek Kok Promenade course in that city, with the following races:

50km open (men and women):	8:30 AM
20km open (men and women):	9:00 AM
6 hours relay (3 athletes per team):	9:30 AM
10km U20 open (men):	10:30 AM

ANOTHER SUCCESSFUL FIRST WALK 50K IN HONG KONG By Paul F. DeMeester (Photos by Lam Man-biu)

The Hong Kong Race Walking Association has not been afraid to offer 50K races for both genders as part of their First Walk competition to start the new year. First launched in 2016, the fifth edition drew the largest 50K field yet, with 12 competitors taking the start, and delivering its greatest number of finishers at 9. Both numbers look small in absolute terms but loom large for a local race in an event as difficult as the 50K. Think of how many athletes would show for a local event such as pole vaulting, or gymnasts for a locally organized meet involving rings, the pommel horse, a balance beam and a vault. The winning times have been coming down over the years, from 6:03:48 in the men's race in 2016 won by Walker Wong Kai-chung to this year's winning time of 4:39:15 by **Edward Tse Chun-hung**. On the women's side, **Billie Kwok Chik-ha** won the inaugural race in 6:19:23 and won her fourth First Walk 50K in 2020 in a new national record of 5:40:51, missing the top step of the podium only once in 2019.

The men's 2020 winning time also established a new national record, besting the previous record set exactly one year before at the same race, when Chin Man Kit won in 4:54:26, breaking the Hong Kong 5-hour barrier for the first time and toppling the 2-year old national record set by **Ken Cheung Wai-tak** at this race in 2017, when his 5:03:23 broke a record that had endured since 1964, when Kam-Tong So had walked a 5:07:54 at the first Tokyo Olympics. Cheung had a part in this year's record breaking. He and Tse walked together for the first half of the race, when red card trouble sent Cheung to the pit box for five minutes. The cooling off period also cooled off the leader's pace, as the dueling duo were now separated. Once back in the race, Cheung did not give up and finished second a little over eight minutes behind the winner. They were joined on the podium by **Walker Wong**, who made it five for five podium trips in this race since his inaugural win in 2016. Wong improved his 50K time to 5:47:41.

The women's race was as spirited as the men's. Kwok was joined by Alex Lo Po-man and Daisy Ng Chui-Yi for the first part of the race. The eventual winner slowly pulled away at first, then showed her staying power in the second half of the race by keeping a consistent pace. She looks forward to another 50K soon. Her New Year's Day national record may not last long.

Wong, Edmund Chan Wai-on and Kwok are the only three walkers to have raced in all five First Walk 50K editions and pounded the pavement of all three race courses that have been used on New Year's Day. The first three editions were held at Stonecutters Island, providing the participants with spectacular views of giant container ships sailing into harbour, while walking directly underneath the span of Stonecutters Bridge, the cable-stayed link between the Kowloon Peninsula and Tsing Yi Island on the way to Hong Kong's airport. Last year's edition was held at Sunny Bay, near the airport, when on a blustery morning, the 20K companion race was highlighted by Olympic and World Champion Liu Hong returning to competition after her maternity leave. This year's venue was not the first time the Association conducted a meet at the Pak Shek Kok Promenade in the New Territories next to the campus of the Chinese University of Hong Kong, but a first nevertheless for its 50K race. Conditions were perfect for the long distance march: cool and overcast, with the sun breaking through only twice for just a few minutes each. The circuit consisted of two 500 meter segments that were gently curved next to the waterfront. The turn point just past the start-finish line and drinks tables used the plaza area to render the turn nice and wide. The opposite turn point was a bit tighter but was no bother at all. The promenade tiles made for easy walking. A special treat were the views of the distant mountains, high rises and coves in either direction along the promenade.

It was my second visit to the Hong Kong 50K after having been to Stonecutters Island back in 2018. Once again, I cannot lavish enough praise on **Echo Yeung** and the **Hong Kong Race Walking Association**. Among the other races on offer was a six-hour relay format, giving a lot of walkers who shy away from long distances a taste of the long game as part of a three-member team. The Association conducts training sessions four days a week in different parts of Hong Kong, all accessible by way of the local train system; maintains a website; puts on mountain hikes and socials. If only World Athletics (the Artists Formerly Known as IAAF) would do for the 50K world-wide what Echo and her group have done for the 50K in a small corner of the world, the 50K would be a booming event.

VALE KEITH KNOX: 1950-2020

NSW walking identity Keith Knox, born 15th September 1950, has died, aged 69. Keith was a proud member of Sutherland District Athletics Club and well known to all us older walkers.

He walked with distinction, representing NSW on many occasions, and representing Australia in the 1981 Lugano Cup. I raced against him myself on many occasions and have fond memories of our times together as competitors and fellow racewalkers. NSW had a very strong team in those days, shearheaded by Keith, Michael Woods and Rod Huxley, with John Smith thrown in for good measure.

Keith won many NSW titles including the 1980 NSW 50km, in which he recorded a PB of 4.26.21.

As mentioned above, he represented Australia in the 1981 Lugano Cup, coming 41st in the 20km walk with a time of 1:37:42. But his path to selection was not a straight-forward one as he was disqualified in the official trial, held in Adelaide in July 1981. Luckily for Keith, he had his times already on the board and was still selected.

1981 marked the start of what was an excellent period of racing for him. He won medals in the next 3 Australian Roadwalk Championships as follows

and he was a regular medalist in the various AFORWC Championships contested during that timeframe. A quick perusal shows the following 3 medal performances (time precludes a more thorough analysis at this stage).

He finished third in the 1984 Olympic 50 km trial, which was held in conjunction with the Australian 50km championship in March of that year, in a PB 4:21:27 but did not gain Olympic selection A standard of 4:15:00 had been set and, although not far outside it, he was on the wrong side of the numbers.

He continued to race nationally for many years after that and still holds six Sunderland Athletics Club walk records, set between 1983 and 1988, over distances of 3, 5, 10, 15, 20 and 50kms.

He also raced occasionally in the Masters scene, including in the World Masters Games in 2002 in Melbourne.

My last recorded race for Keith was in a NSWRWC club roadrace in May 2012, when he completed 8km in 1:05:23.
