WHAT'S COMING UP

• The AV Shield Final will be held at Lakeside Stadium (with 2000m walks on offer) on Saturday 22nd February. The AVSL Playoff Round (Rd 13, the Final) draft timetable is posted online. Note it is possible for you to enter the AV Shield Final even if your team has not qualified. It works like this:

Entries for the Playoff Round will open as per normal at 2PM on Wed 12th Feb. While the Playoff Round will be open to ALL eligible AV athletes, the priority will be to athletes of Clubs which are competing for a Premiership or a Playoff. From 2PM on Wed 12th until midday on Mon 17th, ONLY athletes from those clubs in contention for a Premiership or Playoff (8th v 3rd) can enter the AVSL Playoff Round – AV staff will DELETE any entry from an athlete who does not fall into that category. Then from 2PM on Mon 17th, the event will be open to all other ELIGIBLE athletes. Make sense?

- Next weekend also sees the **WA State T&F Championships** in Perth, with Open 10,000m and underage 5000m and 3000m walks on offer. All the various State T&F Championships will be coming up around now.

The VRWC Summer Season wound up on Sunday morning, with the annual Victorian Masters 5000m Track Championships at Dolomore Reserve in Mentone. Conditions were pretty good apart from a bit of wind early. With 30 Masters walkers (15 men and 15 women) in action, the meet was well supported and the Masters walkers recorded some good times. The women did especially well, with PBs to Marnie Grace, Dee Holohan and Rozlyn Walker, along with first time 5000m walks by Hsien Chiam and Tracy Colbert. Alas, Kelly Ruddick looked like she had produced the walk of the meet with her finish time of 23:06, some 36 secs under the W45 world record, but she had felt poorly during the race and stepped onto the grass interior to recover before returning to the track to complete her race — an automatic disqualification. Hopefully she will take the record in the Victorian T&F Championship walk at the end of the month.

7TH INDIAN OPEN RACE WALKING CHAMPIONSHIPS, RANCHI, INDIA, 15-16 FEBRUARY

Emmanuel Tardi was in India last weekend, one of the international racewalking judges at their National Roadwalking Championships in Ranchi in NE India. The races were held on a 1km course near the National Field Hockey Centre and, with cooler temperatures than in southern India, conditions were just about perfect for racewalking. The 20km races were held early on Saturday morning, with the men getting underway at 6:30AM and the women at 6:40AM. Sandeep Kumar went straight to the front in the men's race and was 100m in front by the end of the first lap. He kept this advantage till the end of the race, winning with a time of 1:21:34. He was a bit disappointed that despite his best effort, the Olympic qualification standard was still 34 seconds farther from him. "If I am selected for Asian Championships in Japan next month, I will try to improve the time and try to qualify for Tokyo2020," he said. KT Irfan, who was in the bunch trailing Sandeep Kumar by a minute at the halfway stage, pulled out, leaving Rahul (Haryana), Vikash Singh (Delhi) and Ganapathi Krishnan (Tamil Nadu) to fight for the second place. It was in the final 3km that Rahul pulled away from Vikash Singh to be able to claim the runner-up slot

The women's 20km was won by **Bhawana Jat**, one of their younger up and coming walkers, with a previous PB of 1:36:16. Her winning time of 1:29:54 confirms her place in the 2020 Olympics. Her time of 1:29:54.00 not only improved Baby Sowmya's National Record time of 1:31:29.00 set in Delhi two year ago but also was six seconds below the Olympic qualification standard laid down by World Athletics. Uttar Pradesh's **Priyanka Goswami** was 36 seconds shy of the qualification mark. The 23-year-old became the first Indian woman athlete to meet the qualifying standard for the Olympic Games in Tokyo later this year. KT Irfan (men's 20km walk), Avinash Sable (3000m steeplechase) and Neeraj Chopra (javelin throw) are the first three Indians to attain qualifying standards for Tokyo 2020.

103RD JAPANESE NATIONAL 20KM WALK CHAMPIONSHIPS, KOBE, JAPAN, SUNDAY 16 FEBRUARY

The highly anticipated Japanese 20km Roadwalk Championships were held last Sunday in Kobe. It was even more interesting than usual with Swedish Champion and Doha bronze medallist **Perseus Karlstrom** announcing earlier in the week that he was going to have a go at the 20km world record. I know a lot of Australians were glued to the live feed on Sunday morning to see how he went. Alas, it was a good walk but just not sharp enough to beat all the Japanese. Persy fell a bit short of his own high expectations, finishing third with a time of 1:19:34 (still not too shabby in anyone's books).

He commented on social media post event:

I gave it a crack, but conditions was not on my side today, strong winds made it difficult for super fast times. Instead I provided shelter and dragged along some of the best walkers in the world, not great tactics. Realizing the world record was not going to happen, I changed my race plan to race the race after 6km, but after 8km things unfortunately changed fast. Severe breathing problems made the remaining laps a fight with myself to push the limits of my asthma condition and despite disappointed I couldn't challenge World Champion Yamanishi @yamanishi0 for the win, a sub 1h20min performance is not bad! Until the next one.

SHORT PROFILE OF ENGLISH WALKER MARK EASTON

Regular readers of this newsletter will recognise Mark Eastman's name as his photos are regularly featured in many of the English race reports I publish. This short informational piece was published in this month's Enfield Walker newsletter, put out by Ron Wallwork. Great bit of info there Ron!

Many of the photographs used in the Enfield Walker and indeed national magazines like Athletic Weekly are those taken by Mark Easton: https://markeaston.zenfolio.com/. However, before taking up the camera, he was for almost fifteen years one of the country's top walkers. In the years spanning 1985 and 1999 he won 18 national titles and finished in the first three 20 times. He gained 15 international vests including four for Commonwealth Games and one for the European championships.

Mark's best times illustrate his wide range of ability: 3km 11.24, 5km 20.01, 10km 41.14, One Hour 14.158m, 20km 84.04, 30km 2,13,33 50km 4.03.53 along with six other performances under 4.10.00. He also came out of retirement in 2003 to take part in and win the Centenary London to Brighton (53 miles) in 8.06.15 which was the last ever staged.

Still contributing to the sport in which he excelled, Mark is the current Hon Treasurer of the RWA, so whether anyone requires an action photograph or would like to join the RWA 200 Club, Mark Easton is the man to see!
