Now over the Tasman Sea to New Zealand, where a resident record, some blistering sprint performances, top quality throws and an enthralling battle for the New Zealand 3000m Men's run Championship provided the highlights of an pulsating day of action at the Potts Classic in Hastings. The day's proceedings started at 7AM with mixed 20,000m and 10,000m track walks, with **Alana Barber** the standout, setting New Zealand allcomers, national and resident records (pending ratification) for the 20,000m walk with her time of 1:37:45.0 (the records have stood for nearly three decades after being set by Linn Murphy from Wellington in 1993). Alana said that she was using the event as a time trial for the Oceania championships in Adelaide on Sunday 14th February. The omens are good.
