# In Defense of Yoshirō Mori, Sort Of

I have six articles and one blog piece in front of me from the internet publication insidethegames.biz, a great website about the politics of sport. All seven deal with one topic, the recent derogatory remarks about women made by 2020 Tokyo Organising Committee President Yoshirō Mori, an 83-year old who used to be Prime Minister of Japan. This chap got all this ink in less than a week's time, six days to be exact. Among the gems that Mori spouted was, "we have about seven women at the Organising Committee but everyone understands their place."

I'm really jealous now. I know about women understanding their place but I only got two write-ups over a time span of about nine months, when I filed a lawsuit in the Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS) to get women admitted to the Tokyo 2020 50K Race Walk event, and when I lost the case. I was trying to tell CAS that a women's place is on the Olympic 50K race walk circuit but I guess I was wrong. Still, I would have loved for insidethegames.biz to write about the controversy every day, just like they did this past week about Mori.

Mori also said that, "women have a strong sense of competition." Wow, he took the words right out of my mouth, or should I say legal brief, because that's what I was trying to tell the CAS Court. I have seen the women 50K race walkers compete, in London, Taicang, Santee and Melbourne. I couldn't agree more. Women do have a strong sense of competition. So much so that they belong in the 50K at Tokyo 2020.

Mori seems to think I'm a woman. He says that women talk too much at board meetings and that you have to regulate their speaking time lest the meetings never finish. Boy, has he been talking to the judges in front of whom I appear, because they are constantly trying to limit my speaking time. Hello there, insidethegames.biz, could you tell Mori that I'm not a woman? Then again, never mind, Mori might think exceptions prove the rule.

I'm even more jealous of the reaction Mori's comments provoked. The current Japanese Prime Minister (male) got in on the act, as did the Governor of Tokyo (female), Mori's wife, his daughter and granddaughter, a former world judo champion (female), more than 136,000 people who signed a petition, a three-time Grand Slam tennis champion (female), and insidethegames.biz's own reporter (female). Where were all these people when the International Olympic Committee (IOC) refused to let women athletes walk the Olympic 50K? I'll tell you where they were. They were nowhere to be seen or heard.

The website's reporter Nancy Gillen wrote this in her 7 February 2020 blog: "If Mori remains in place, would anyone be able to take the IOC's drive for gender equality seriously? The situation is already severely undermining the organisation's pledge to make more women feel accepted and appreciated in sport." Had Gillen studied up on the fight for the women's 50K, she would have known by now that the IOC's gender equality work consisted of driving the women out of the 50K, first by refusing their admittance, then by abolishing the event altogether.

Let's face it, Mori is the most honest Olympic official there is. The IOC is an organisation of sexist pigs, with Thomas Bach and Kit McConnell leading the troops. Mori expressed the true sentiments of Tokyo 2020. The gender equality provisions of the Olympic Charter are a bunch of baloney in the eyes of the Olympic ringmasters. Finally, one of them spoke the truth. All those who are shocked by Mori's comments and who demand action should study what has happened to the women's 50K. The only action that should be demanded is the inclusion of women in Tokyo's 50K. Then Mori can babble on about how much longer the event takes waiting for all those women to finish the race. Or maybe he'll repent and take his wife, daughter and granddaughter to go watch women race the 50K in Sapporo. Now, that would be one heck of an apology.

## WALKER OF THE WEEK

My Walker of the Week is 19 year old South Australian walker **Tristan Camilleri** who recorded a big PB time of **11:54.3** in Adelaide last Saturday, bettering his own U20 state record by 13 seconds.

Tristan was on track to represent Australia in last year's World Athletics U20 Championships in Nairobi. He had won the Oceania U20 10km Championship in Adelaide in February 2020 and was building up for the World U20 Trial, which was to be held at the Australian T&F Championships the following month.

Alas, the Australian Championships were cancelled due to the covid pandemic, and the World U20 Championships also fell foul of covid and were postponed for 12 months (they will now be held in Nairobi in August 2021). That's all well and good, but since Tristan turns 20 this year, he is no longer eligible and has missed out on his opportunity to represent Australia.

Such a huge disappointment might have been a major setback for a lesser athlete, but Tristan is made of stronger stuff and has continued training and racing and is now reaping the rewards.

Well done Tristan. Your opportunity will come.

# OUT AND ABOUT

- COVID-19 and sport crashed into each other a couple of times this week. First, the Australian cricket team pulled out of a three-Test tour to South Africa. A sombre Cricket Australia chief executive Nick Hockley told journalists that despite the protocols put in place for the team, there was simply too much risk that one of the touring party could catch the virulent form of the disease in South Africa. Secondly, a single positive COVID-19 case in Melbourne forced more than 500 tennis players and coaches into isolation, stopping all matches in the Australian Open lead-up events. The Olympic Games will comprise around 10,000 athletes plus another 5,000 or so coaches and officials and several thousand more media flying into Tokyo. It puts the logistical challenge of staging the Olympics into some sort of perspective. See <a href="https://amp.abc.net.au/article/13126944">https://amp.abc.net.au/article/13126944</a>.
- Athletics Australia (AA) has confirmed its commitment to holding the 2021 Australian Track and Field Championships in Sydney. AA acknowledges that the circumstances surrounding health and safety guidelines are evolving, however, the intent is to conduct the Championships in its entirety from April 12 21. - This year's Los Angeles Marathon has been postponed for the second time due to the coronavirus pandemic. The annual event was originally scheduled to be held on March 21 before a decision was taken last November to move it to May 23 providing it received support from city officials and health experts. But with coronavirus cases continuing to rise in the United States, organisers have decided to postpone the race again as it now looks to stage it later this year. #### And now to Olympic news:

- Is it little wonder that the Japanese Olympic Games Organising Committee has not seen fit to push for the women's 50km. According to Yoshiro Mori, president of the Tokyo Olympic Organizing Committee, said last Wednesday that women have an "annoying" tendency to make meetings run unnecessarily long. And the comments got worse as he warmed up. The home of paternalism and sexism! - For the record, Mori has apologised for his "inappropriate" remarks about women but refused to resign from his position, despite the outrage triggered by his comments. - His apology not placate Tokyo Governor Yuriko Koike, who subsequently described Yoshiro Mori's comments about women as a "major issue" for the Olympic and Paralympic Games. "I myself was struck speechless by his comments, which should not have been made." Japan has faced criticism for its gender equality efforts as it ranks 121 out of 153 nations surveyed in the 2020 global gender gap report of the World Economic Forum. Perhaps we now see why this is so. - A day later, more than 110,000 people had already signed a petition calling for action to be taken against Mori. There is a lot more to come here. See https://www.insidethegames.biz/articles/1103899/petition-tokyo-2020-president-mori-row.
- This is just one of many challenges facing the Olympics organisers. There are fears Tokyo 2020 organisers could face a shortage of medical professionals able to lend a hand during the Olympic Games as they continue their fight against coronavirus. Satoru Arai, director of the Tokyo Medical Association, told Reuters it was "impossible" to envisage doctors and nurses volunteering at the rescheduled Games during the global health crisis. - And in more bad news for the Olympic LOC, according to the latest poll conducted by NHK, approximately 80 per cent of Japanese people think Tokyo 2020 should be postponed or cancelled. But it's actually worse than that, with nearly 40 per cent of those surveyed advocating for the complete cancellation of Tokyo 2020, rather than postponing the event until it can be safely held. ## Ballina's race walking champion honoured By David Lowe, January 18, 2021

Kerry Saxby-Junna returned to her old home of Ballina on Friday for the unveiling of a new tribute and tourist attraction in her honour.

An enthusiastic crowd of friends, family and supporters were there for the unveiling by Mayor David Wright of the new interpretive signage display, beside the Richmond River, near the Ballina War Memorial Pool. The new aluminium display is over two metres high and details Ms Saxby-Junna's extraordinary athletic achievements, which include 32 world records, three Olympics and 27 national titles.

The podium is made from sandstone, and will provide a great photo opportunity and rest location for people using the re-vamped Kerry Saxby Walkway, which now goes all the way from Captain Cook Park to the end of North Wall. The total length is close to the 5km distance for which Kerry Saxby-Junna held the race walking world record for almost two decades.

Mayor David Wright said the new signage aimed to inspire both the local community and visitors. 'It acknowledges Kerry's outstanding contribution to international athletics and her important connection to Ballina,' he said.

Although Ms Saxby-Junna was born in Young NSW, her family moved to Ballina in her early teens. Describing herself as a 'normal country girl', Kerry joined the local athletics club and achieved state level success in swimming and middle distance running before switching to race walking at 21.

Kerry Saxby-Junna told Echonetdaily she'd planned to return for the opening in July 2020, but COVID caused the ceremony to be delayed. 'It's always great to come back to Ballina, especially at the moment when we can go swimming, and the weather's good. My dream of going to the Olympics all started here,' she said. 'In those days Ballina never had the walking paths, but now we're getting more and more coming through, which is fabulous. This has to be one of the most picturesesque places I've seen around the world to go for a walk.'

When she and her sister did training runs out to the bar in the early days, it was 'a very very rough track'.

After Ms Saxby-Junna was invited to go to the Australian Institute of Sport in Canberra by coach Craig Hilliard, she won multiple gold medals for race walking. She also met her husband, soccer coach Ray Junna, at the AIS. Ms Saxby-Junna won her first international gold medal at the 1986 Goodwill Games in Moscow. She was awarded a Member of the Order of Australia (AM) in 1992.

On Friday she told Echonetdaily she's happy that people remember her career on the track, although 'it's just so long ago!

Ms Saxby-Junna retired from race walking in 2001. These days, she lives in Canberra, where she works with kids who have disabilities. She still enjoys running, walking and riding her bike.

To attend the Ballina ceremony, she drove all the way north with her husband, and was struck by the improvements along the highway. 'There's only a couple of traffic lights between here and Canberra at the moment. It's like a super highway now! I reckon there'll be more and more people moving here, it's so easy to get anywhere now.'
