Dave Moore reports from Tasmania:

Today's walk at Wentworth Park marked ten years since the Tasmanian Masters Road Walk Championships was introduced onto the Winter Road Walk calendar. A small but enthusiastic field turned out for the 5km event held in bright sunshine and light winds. W65 Elizabeth Leitch took an early lead and powered home to keep the rest of the field well behind her. Elizabeth is truly a tough as nails competitor, having already run in Athletics South's Cross Country in the morning. A showdown was again on the cards for M70 Gold between Ron Foster and Wayne Fletcher, as they have already had many a close battle in Walkers Club races so far this winter. But unlike last year, Ron asserted his ascendency from the very first kilometre and kept Wayne at bay for the entire 5km, while Dave Moore did his first 5k since last year and is beginning to regain some form. Joining her fellow Masters Walkers for the first 2km was Teresa Hatten who is still building up her Race Walking fitness after a busy summer of field events and a shorter track races.

MEETING DE LA ROCHE SUR YON, FRANCE, SATURDAY 22 MAY 2021

Emmanuel Tardi reports on a French race -the first in a long time. He says:

As of last Wednesday, the French government is allowing the organisation of small athletics events. One of the first racewalking meets took place on Saturday in La Roche sur Yon, 400km SW of Paris. The 18 starters were able to race in fine and sunny conditions. The overall win went to M47 **Sebastien Delaunay** with 45:49 (the French M45 record is 44:32). The French 10,000m walk championships will take place in Angers at end of June so he has a further chance then to break the record. Note that our super-master **Alexis Jordana** (84 years old - born in February 1937) produced a strong 1:12:06.67 for the 10,000m walk

OUT AND ABOUT

It's all Olympic related news this week. Opinion seems to swinging towards the Games taking place, regardless of the costs. But it's a rocky road.

- Cuba has suspended all national and international sports competitions in the country until July 31 as COVID-19 cases in
 the country continue to rise. The most recent figures show that Cuba had a new daily coronavirus case high of 1,383 as
 cases have gradually been increasing since late December. See https://www.insidethegames.biz/articles/1107976/cuba-coronavirus-sports.
- With the Olympics now only 60 days away, pressure to cancel them continues to grow as Japan fights a fourth wave of the pandemic. See https://www.mamamia.com.au/will-the-olympics-be-cancelled/.
- And here is an example of how hard it is to travel at the moment. Australia's Olympic skateboarding preparations are in disarray after three members of the Australian team, including a 13-year-old skater, tested positive to COVID-19 after travelling to the US for a qualifying event. The group of 11 Australian skaters, as well as staff, flew out from Sydney on May 3 to California before travelling to the Dew Tour in Iowa in an effort to qualify for the Olympics. - In another troubling development, the USA State Department has advised US citizens against traveling to Japan because of the sharp increase in Covid-19 cases. The "Level 4: Do Not Travel" advisory is the highest cautionary level in the department's hierarchy of warnings. Japan now joins Sri Lanka, India, Mexico, Brazil and Turkey as Level 4 No-Go countries. See https://edition.cnn.com/travel/article/japan-olympics-us-covid-travel-advisory/index.html.
- Another probing article the issues are many. Japan itself is struggling to contain a fourth wave, with a seven-day average
 of new cases briefly topping 6,000 earlier this month. The vaccine rollout continues to lag behind most other major
 economies, with just 4% of the population having received one or two doses. Staging the Olympics without spectators will
 result in a US\$23.1 billion loss for Japan. Another concern is the absence of drug testing in the lead-up to the games, due to
