### TIM'S WALKER OF THE WEEK

My Walker of the Week this time around is 15 year old Melbourne based walker **Marcus Wakim**. Marcus has been producing a steady stream of PBs of late and last weekend was no exception, as he walked to a new best time of 23:20 in the VRWC U16 5km walk at Middle Park.

Marcus started racewalking in January 2018 and has improved steadily over the last 3+ years. Alas, like all Victorians, he lost the entire winter season in 2020 as we went into an extended covid lockdown, but he hit the ground running once restrictions were lifted, and now has an impressive set of PBs: 2000m (9:03), 3000m (13:36) and 5km (23:27). In April, he took silver in the U16 3000m walk at the Australian T&F Championships in Sydney, an indication of his high status within his age group Australia wide. The sky's the limit for this talented young walker.

# WHAT'S COMING UP

• Next Saturday sees us back at Middle Park for our annual VRWC Intervals Race Day. It's an exciting and tough day's work if you decide to go for multiple intervals. Here is the timetable:

In the Intervals Race, walkers choose to walk either 6km, 8km or 10km in 2km intervals. To walk in this event, you must be able to complete each leg in less than 17 minutes. If, for example, you walk 11.30min for the 1st leg, you have 5.30min rest before starting the next leg. If a walker fails to finish any leg in the allowable 17 minutes, he/she will not be allowed to continue in the next leg. The start times for the 2km legs are as follows:

# VMA/RWA/VRWC ROADWALKS, MIDDLE PARK, SATURDAY 10 JULY 2021

Saturday afternoon saw one of our biggest meets for the winter, with the Victorian Masters 10km Championships held alongside the Victorian leg of the annual Racewalking Australia State Challenge and our own VRWC races. We had a number of entrants who did not make it to Middle Park but we still had 51 competitors, our biggest number of the winter. The other great news is that we had finishers in EVERY RWA Challenge division, so big thanks to all our walkers who came along and supported the club.

The 10km and 8km walkers were the first to head off. **Heather Carr** (1:07:43, W71) and **Andrew Jamieson** (1:00:26, M75) took maximum age graded points in the RWA Challenge. They were amongst the 15 walkers who contested the annual VMA Roadwalk Championship. Fastest masters times went to **Mark Blackwood** (46:22, M44) and **Carolyn Rosenbrock** (W59 1:01:23). 2021 Olympic walker **Kyle Swan** was fastest overall with a very comfortable 44:18. **Fraser Saunder** excelled in the U18 8km (a huge PB of 37:15). I can hardly wait to see him take on his first 10km in a few weeks time. And special mention to 83 year old **Gunther Ilgoutz**, the oldest competitor, who completed his 10km in 1:22:14.

### GREEK U20 TRACK CHAMPIONSHIPS, TESALONIKI, GREECE, 3-4 JULY 2021

Thanks to Zoe Gkini for her report and photos from the Greek U20 walk champs. It came just too late for last week's newsletter so doing a catchup this week.

The Greek National U20 Championships were held in Tesaloniki, the capital city of northern Greece, on the weekend of 3-4 July. The 10,000m walks were held on the Saturday morning at 8AM and opened the meet. Men's winner **Andreas Elefterios Mpachos** won his first ever Greek title, his time of 45:33.72 earning him a trip to Talin next weekend for the European U20 Championships. Second placed **Alexandros Mortzakis** (45:34.11) also bettered the standard for Talin. Both athletes walked side by side during the race, a strategy which ensured they both achieved the required time. The unluckiest walker was the female winner **Zafiria Papadimitriou** who missed the Talin standard of 46:00 by only 26 secs, in an event which she walked almost alone out in front.
