### TIM'S WALKER OF THE WEEK

44 year old VRWC walker **Mark Blackwood** is my Walker of the Week this time around. Walking in the Victorian 30km roadwalk championship at Middle Park on Sunday morning, he won with a time of **2:38:39**.

Mark came back to the club in 2017 after a break of nearly 20 years. He had his comeback race with us on 29<sup>th</sup> April 2017, recording 25:13 for 5km, and he has been improving year by year since then. But more recent members may not know that Mark was one of our top junior walkers in the 1990s. I rummaged through my records and found a number of National and State medals that he won in Open and Underage competition between 1992 and 1998, when he retired.

His best performances for 3000m (12:00.0, 1997, aged 19) and 20km (1:29:51, 1996 aged 18) still rank in our all-time lists.

This was his first 30km walk and he completed it in fine style. Well done, mate.

#### VICTORIAN ROADWALK CHAMPIONSHIPS, MIDDLE PARK, SUNDAY 1ST AUGUST 2021

We did not find out until mid week whether our Victorian covid restrictions would be eased sufficiently to allow the Victorian Roadwalk Championships to take place on Sunday morning. The news was good so our walkers had to quickly decide whether to enter before entries closed. Perhaps unsurprisingly, we only saw 40 walkers turn out to race in what was our smallest championship meet field for quite some time. Covid-19 is certainly taking its toll on us all. Well done to those who did turn out and brave the cold conditions.

The long walks were first off, at 8:30AM, with **Mark Blackwood** leading them out. He finished as the fastest in the AMA 20km postal walk (1:45:44) and then continued on to win the Victorian 30km Championship (his first time over 30km since returning to walking in 2017) with 2:38:39. **Sarah Brennan** was the only woman in the field and she finished the Masters 20km with 1:55:47, only 1 minute outside her PB.

# ATHLETICS TASMANIA ROADWALK CHAMPIONSHIPS, SEVEN MILE BEACH, SATURDAY 31 JULY 2021

With Covid-19 lockdowns in Queensland, NSW and SA, the results from interstate are pretty sparse. Firtly, off to Tasmania where Thanks to Dave Moore reports:

Very mild conditions greeted our walkers for the Athletics Tasmania Road Walk Championships at Seven Mile Beach today.

Competing in the first event of the day the O/40 10km were two of our walking stalwarts, **Ron Foster** and **Wayne Fletcher**. Ron built an unassailable lead by the six-kilometre mark to add another State Title to his trophy cabinet.

Our younger age groups did themselves proud. Many of them walked much longer distances than they normally compete at and did PB's across their respective race splits.

In the 2km Events, **Macy Devine** for her U12 event put in a strong performance to lead the rest of the 2km field home. Macy averaged just under 6 minutes per kilometre pace and is well on the way to faster times.

The race for the Gold in the U11 Boys was tight tussle between **Max Kull** and **Mitchell Hall**. With 500m to go it was anybody's race. At the finish line, Max took home the Gold by a mere second.

Amelia Watson took out the U11 Girls 2km event and impressed coaches and judges with her stylish Walking.

The Girls U14 3km, pitted Kingborough Little Athletics Club teammates **Emily Kull** and **Lily Carr** against each other. At the halfway mark there was not much in it, but Emily surged ahead in the  $2^{nd}$  half of the race for a solid win.

The U16 5km saw **Samuel Lindsay** take off at a cracking pace was rewarded with PBs for 1.5km (7:17) and 3km (15:13) and fell one second short of a PB for the 5k, a solid performance from a very good young walker. In the U16 5km, **Hannah Kull**'s performance was the bravest of the day. Hannah in her first 5km was in great discomfort with 2km to go but gritted her teeth and kept going. Those of us looking on never doubted she would finish – Well done Hannah!

Alas for her, a third red card on the last lap meant the jury had to add 30 secs to her time, meaning that French walker **Agathe Mille** was declared the winner, with a time of 14:24.60.

- The Isle of Man's great distance walker Dereck Harrison died in mid July. British readers in particular will remember Dereck for his many fine ultra-distance walks at home, in the UK and in Europe. He also made the I.O.M. Commonwealth Games team and must be among the best ever athletes the Isle of Man has seen (and that is quite a group when you add John Cannell, Graham Young and Murray Lambden etc.). - The CEO of the US Anti-Doping Agency, Travis Tygart, has dismissed the punishment handed down for Russia's state sponsored doping program as a "farce". WADA has banned official Russian teams from Tokyo 2020, the 2022 Winter Olympics and the 2022 World Cup as a punishment for covering up a massive state-sponsored doping programme. The country's flag and anthem are banned too. However, Russian athletes can still compete as neutrals in both individual and team events if they have not been banned for doping. The WADA ban was originally four years before it was halved by the court of arbitration for sport last year. I agree it's a joke. - The World Athletics Council announced at its meeting in Tokyo last week that the 2022 World Athletics Race Walking Team Championships will be held in Muscat. Brilliant move by WA to take the event away from a repressive European country (Belarus) and give it to an oppressive Middle Eastern country (Oman). Yet another indication that human rights abuses do not really factor in WA decisions.

I am told that it is to be scheduled in March. Did WA bother to check the temperatures in Oman in that time of the year? The average daily max temps for March and April are 30°C and 35°C respectively. Wonderful! Have they learnt nothing from the 2019 World Championships in Doha. It only confirms to me what they really think of racewalking - an uncomfortable boil on the bottom that needs to be continually excised.
