

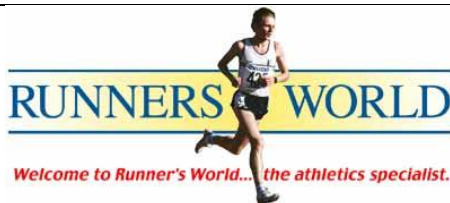

*WORLD ATHS RACE WALKING TEAMS C'SHIPS TO HAVE MASTERS EVENTS

News and information from overseas would normally feature in the 'International News' section. But when you get a scoop, you lead with it ... and, as this news impacts directly (and immediately) upon Master walkers in Australia, it cannot but lead this week's issue. Talk about the winds of change!



MUSCAT (Oman), 9 December – Although *Marcia dal Mondo*, by editorial choice, does not deal with the multiple Master activities in the context of race walking due to time problems, the news that was provided to us with the request for its advertising is a juicy bit of news and we cannot avoid following it up. It marks a turning point in the history of the World Athletics Race Walking Team Championship.

World Masters Athletics (WMA) and **World Athletics** have worked hard over the last few years to develop a closer relationship. World Athletics now invited Masters Athletes to join the World Athletics Race Walking Team Championships held in **Muscat, Oman**. WMA President, **Margit Jungmann** and WMA Vice President **Brian Keaveney** drafted a competition program to attract Masters race walkers. WMA and World Athletics want to offer this new opportunity for Masters Athletes around the world to come together and celebrate their love of race walking and competition. They will join the best race walkers in the world to test themselves. Oman is a beautiful, peaceful country, and Muscat is a scenic city full of things to be discovered.

The World Athletics Race Walking Team Championships in Muscat will be held on 4-5 March 2022, including a mixed 4x2km Masters relay and 10km age group races.

Some tentative details on the Masters races:

1.- The relay team consists of two race walkers made of one woman and one man. Each country can enter any number of teams in the following categories: – Age 35-49, 50-59, 60-69, 70+- Mode: Each athlete will race-walk two 2K loops alternating between a man and a woman. A woman or a man can go first or second but must alternate.

2.- Individual race 10km with team scoring – All 5-year age groups starting at 35-39 can compete. The top three athletes both male and female can medal. Most likely there will be one mixed-sex 10K race. Team scoring for age groups will be used.

The background dates back to March 2021, when World Athletics and WMA had reached an historic agreement that would see official Masters Championships held for the first time alongside the World Athletics Cross Country Championships in Bathurst, Australia in February 2022. Unfortunately, due to the pandemic, World Athletics had to postpone this event to 2023.

For this week’s WOTW, it was hard to go past the NSW All Schools championships, but equally hard not to take SA Interclub into account.

The candidates are:

- **Olivia Sandrey**, who pushed into the upper echelon of speedsters with her first sub-13min 3000m in Adelaide, recording **12:55.13** for a 44sec PB – a huge improvement;
- 14yo **Isaac Beacroft**, whose **13:05.12** in the NSW All Schools 14yrs 3000m was a 29sec PB and illustrated Isaac’s natural speed. He will be one to watch come National championships time;
- 13yo **Kodi Clarkson**, who won this award last week with his 6:22 in Canberra. This time, while competing in the NSW All Schools 13yrs 3000m, Kodi smashed his PB by 25secs to clock **13:07.93**. Like Isaac, Kodi has posted times in the mid-13’s consistently this summer. Both will be exciting to see at the Nationals in 2022.

So, who to pick? In a case like, this it seems better to credit all such fine performances rather than try to split ‘worthiness’ hairs. So – congratulations to **Olivia, Isaac and Kodi**, joint Walkers of the Week!

A.C.T. ACT Masters ‘Shoelace handicap’, 9 December – Woden Park Athletics Park, Woden

Thanks to Mark Roberts for his report on a unique handicap race – one that is a local favourite!

This week, all the walking action was on Thursday evening at Masters. With a forecast of 30 to 50 mm of rain predicted, the big question was, “Will the event go ahead?”

The 10,000m Shoelace handicap got off to a great start in rainy conditions. The steady rain eased as the walk began in earnest.

Over the years, a tradition has formed that the lead walkers must stop to retie their shoelaces and tonight the tradition continued. 1,200m into the race, young **Darcey Roberts** stopped and took 17 seconds to tie her shoelace, which could be a new PB for her. In the next lap, **Mitch Baker's** turn with a blistering 7 second stop to retie his shoelace. With the traditional tying of the shoelace complete, the event continued smoothly.

A brilliant walk by Mitch had him cross the line at **42:01**, looking stronger than ever. He was followed closely by **Tim Fraser** at 42:31. **Hannah Manning** walked superbly, achieving an U20 AA National qualifier. **Darcey Roberts** was the first female across the line with a time of **55:05**. Congratulations to **Julia Grocott** for completing her first 10,000m walk and the other walkers who completed in extremely wet and cold conditions.

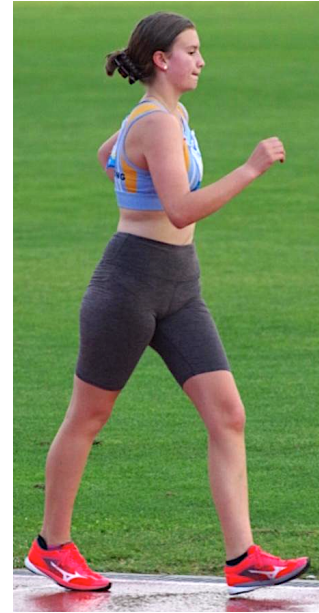

NEW SOUTH WALES All Schools c'ships, Thurs 9 December – Sydney Olympic Park, Homebush

Once again, thanks to Frank Overton for this informative report. As always, NSW schools results show some impressive depth amongst their junior walkers. One can only hope that many of them aim to pursue the sport into the senior ranks and will do so.

The NSW State All Schools Championships were held at SOP Homebush NSW on Thursday 9th December 2021.

The **Girls 12,13,14,15 years 3000m walk** was a combined event resulting in 27 starters. What a good overall race! The first 600 metres was quick with girls going out fast then settling down, the lead girls being **Milly Boughton**, **Sienna Pitcher** and **Zoe Woods**. There were continuous challenges for Milly and she was able to respond on each occasion until 2 laps to go, when **Sienna** applied pressure and was able to go on crossing the line in a time of **14:21.16** with Zoe Woods 14.45.53 next then Milly 14.57.45.

The **Boys 12,13,14,15 years 3000m walk** was another great event, with **Isaac Beacroft** and **Kodi Clarkson** going straight to a lead which changed numerous times for the entire race. **Isaac** eventually got the upper hand, going on to win crossing the line in **13.05.12** with Kodi close behind with 13.07.93.

Next event was the combined **Boys/Girls 5000m**. A very tactical race with **Jack Robson**, **Raven Pyda**, **Tara Laytham** and **Ryan Bonham** the lead pack. Jack led until Tara decided to pass the boys and establish a 15-metre break until Raven and Ryan picked her up with Jack close behind. The four regrouped until Ryan took the lead closely followed by Raven and Tara. Tara fell slightly further behind, and Raven and Ryan had it to themselves. Tactics was the order of the day as the pace was not that fast. **Ryan 26.36.80** and Raven 26.36.85 were the first two to cross the line with Tara, 26.55.29, third to finish.

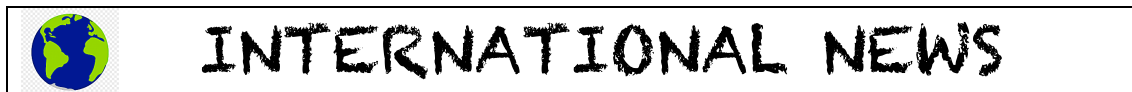
