**** WALKER OF THE WEEK ****



It was a weekend of high-end walking performances in many places around the country, making selection of this week's WOTW a challenge. The 10,000m/10km distance attracted the most impressive results, with many PBs set and several qualifying times for international competition recorded. And it's hard to improve on a performance that beats the tough AA qualifying standard and earns you a place in the Australian team for the Commonwealth Games.

Therefore, our WOTW winners for this week are **Jemima Montag** (VIC) and **Declan Tingay** (WA), following their winning efforts at the Supernova 10,000m track walk at the AIS in Canberra. Jemima clocked **43:05.7** for her qualifier. While Declan dipped under the men's standard with **39:26.1**. Well done, Jemima and Dec!



*Honourable mentions:

- Kyle Swan (VIC) ... first time under 40:00 for 10km, not far off a CG qualifier himself.
- Fraser Saunder (VIC) and Olivia Sandery (SA) ... earning PBs of well over 1:00 for 10km.
- Kodi Clarkson (ACT) ... not yet 14, Kodi joined the elite walkers in the Supernova 10km, recording **48:07** despite never having raced over 10km before. What a future!

VRWC 2021-22 Summer races #4, Sunday 16 January – Middle Park



MARCUS AND FRASER ... DUEL IN THE SUN

While most of Australia's walking elite did battle at the AIS Supernova meet in Canberra, onlookers at Middle Park were not to be dudded as a small but eager entry of 34 walkers hit the course on a warm, humid morning, returning six PBs and several first-time efforts.

Highlight of the morning was the 10km tussle between **Marcus Wakim** and **Fraser Saunder**. The tall Ballaratian set a hot pace from the gun with Marcus working to stay in touch. Eventually the Collingwood walker eased to the front with Fraser hard on his heels, Marcus pulling away in a fast finish to win by 5secs. Both boys smashed their PBs with times of **46:25** and **46:30** respectively, and their future duels are keenly anticipated.

It was pleasing to see **Jasmin Hass** returning to the club with a creditable **58:41**, while newcomer **Geromi Tucker** also gave a good account of himself in his first 10km.

Madeleine Feain and Ariana Pashutina were the only ones to test themselves in the heat over the longer distances, walking together until Ariana stopped with her first 15km time logged. Madeleine, as ever, mocked the hot conditions to finish the 20km in fine style.

In the 5km event, **Kate Siviour** found conditions to her liking, producing a massive 2:49 PB of **26:43**, while **Jade Chitty** also lowered her previous best, continuing the steady improvement she's shown in AVSL this summer. Speedy cousins **Ela Uzun (15:37)** and **Havana Ali (17:18)** quinella'd in the 3km, and we were pleased to welcome **Alejandro Stephens** in his first walk with us for a good first-up **19:18**.

Kelsey Loudon (2km) and Violet Froon (1km) were impressive in winning their races, with Matilda Read and Aydin Uzun having good PB performances.

Saturday was the first of two Supernova 10,000m walks. Many of the athletes were awoken at 1am as Canberra was witness to a spectacular show of lightning and thunder, which resulted in many homes losing power.

Athletes arrived at 7am eager to start warming up. The famous AIS ducks sent a welcome committee for Australia's best walkers coming together on one track.





Due to COVID reducing the number of international walkers taking part this year, ACT walkers who have a 60min or better time for 10,000m were invited to compete. Kodi Clarkson and Owen Toyne *(left)* were very excited to have the opportunity to walk with their champions. Everyone was getting into the spirit. Even our judges were warming up expecting a fast walk.

Every lap was within one second of the previous lap for the lead walkers.

Everyone walked well and many PBs were achieved. Special mention goes to **Declan Tingay** (39:26.1) and **Jemima Montag** (43:05.7) for leading the male and female walkers across the line with Commonwealth Selection times.

Olivia Sandery (45:24.1) and **Alanna Peart** (48:42.7) earned u20 World juniors qualifier times (<50:40). Olivia's time would have won given her a bronze medal at the 2018 u20 world walks. Fantastic effort! **Kodi Clarkson** (48:07.4), at the age of 13, was the youngest walker who broke 50 minutes and looked comfortable on the track. Congratulations!

Saturday 15th January saw the staging of the NSW State 10,000m track walk championship. The events were held at The Ridge Athletics Track at Illawong, Sydney.

Six of NSW top athletes were at the Supernova race walk camp in Canberra. They competed in the 10,000m walk there and did not contest the State Championship.

The afternoon was hot and dry even though a storm was threatening. Luckily it passed but left the conditions hot and humid.

There were several walks prior to the 10,000m championship. The 10,000m championship was restricted to athletes 15 and above by 31 December, 2022.

Many athletes found the going tough but the competitors of note in the 10km were Emma Blanch 52m27.55s, Zoe Woods 57m34.02s and Sienna Pitcher 58m43.26s.

INTERNATIONAL NEWS

ITALY: Italian 35km Race walk championships, Monday 17 January – Pescara Reprinted from Marcia dal Mondo

First titles of the year for athletics. In Pescara, in the Italian 35 km walk championships, **Matteo Giupponi** and **Federica Curiazzi**, both from Bergamo, won the victories.

<u>35km men</u>

Immediately in the lead, Matteo Giupponi and Stefano Chiesa passed the 5km in 22:03. Giorgio Rubino followed them in 24:33.

A small group made up of Riccardo Orsoni, Aldo Andrei, Teodorico Caporaso passed in 22:40

At 10km Giupponi was alone in the lead (43:28), Chiesa follows (43:42) and the other three in 44:42.

Rubino and Chiesa had already received two red cards, while Caporaso and Giupponi had only one. For Giupponi it would remain the only one for the whole race.

Giupponi's passage at 20km took place in 1:26:10.

Then followed in 1:28:40 Orsoni, Andrei, Caporaso.

Rubino after an hour of competition was stopped in the penalty area from which he exited after 3:30. He would do two more laps but then he will be permanently disqualified.

Even Chiesa had to deal with the technical decisions of the jury and between 18km and 19km he is stopped in the penalty area. He would then move on to 20km in 1:30:33.

Between 20km and 30km also Caporaso and Ettore Grillo would have to deal with the same penalty area, but while Caporaso was then able to finish the race Ettore Grillo would share the disqualification with Rubino. At 30km the order of passage was as follows: Giupponi (2:09:01), Orsoni (2:12:03), Andrei (2:12:17), Chiesa (2:13:59), Caporaso 2:15:27.

Giupponi covered the last 5km in 24:44 and went on to win his fourth Italian championship in **2:33:45**. The battle between Andrei in Orsoni became heated. Riccardo Orsoni checked in at 2:34:42 Third - Aldo Andrei in 2:34.46 Fourth - Stefano Chiesa in 2:36:42 Fifth - Theodoric Caporaso in 2:37:56

<u>35km women</u>

Immediately in the lead **Federica Curiazzi** and Nicole Colombi who passed together at 5km (24:45) At 10km Nicole Colombi drove on Federica Curiazzi in (49:16), followed by Sara Vitiello (52:04) who showed a spectacular march to the public and the quartet of Vittoria Giordani, Simona Bertini, Rosetta La Delfa and Annalisa Russo (53:06).

The technical decisions of the jury hit Beatrice Foresti who after the stop in the penalty area was disqualified. At 20km, in order: Colombi (1:38:03), Curiazzi (1:38:36), Vitiello (1:42:55), La Delfa (1.45: 01) and Giordani (1:45:39)

Between 20km and 30km in particular at km 26 Nicole Colombi was stopped in the penalty area, giving the green light to Federica Curiazzi for the victory.

The passage to 30km was: Curiazzi (2:27:21), Colombi (2:29:43), Vitiello (2:34:01), Giordani (2:37:56)

Victory to Federica Curiazzi in **2:52:24** Second place - Nicole Colombi in 2:54:32 Third place - Sara Vitiello in 3:00:12 Fourth place - Vittoria Giordani in 3:04:42 who wins in the U23 category
