# \* COVID ALERT \*

#### To all members,

Today I was informed that a person who attended last Saturday's races at Middle Park tested positive for COVID-19 later that evening. While there is no guarantee that this person contracted the virus at the Club, they may well have done so, and might have spread it.

If you are experiencing COVID-like symptoms (visit <a href="https://www.health.gov.au/health-alerts/covid-19/symptoms">https://www.health.gov.au/health-alerts/covid-19/symptoms</a> for details), we urge you to take a Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) immediately, followed by a second two days later (if negative).

If your first or second RAT is **positive**, you must report it and isolate for 7 days, then re-test. Follow the guidelines at https://www.health.gov.au/health-alerts/covid-19/testing#if-you-test-positive. Consult your doctor for further advice.

If you have no symptoms yourself but are concerned (for an at-risk family member, for example), take a RAT as described above, or arrange a PCR test at a testing facility.

As much as we'll miss seeing you there, if you test positive, do not return to the Club unless you've completed 7 days isolation from the time of your positive test, and returned two negative RATs, two days apart.

Surprisingly fine, spring-like weather greeted the 30 walkers for our final Points day at Middle Park on Saturday, with the rain forecast for 'the afternoon' thankfully sparing us while giving the northern suburbs a drenching.

The incentive of gaining more points before the closure – plus it being a handicap prizes day – resulted in several PB's, including a 'monster' of 7:44 for **29:19** over 6km by **Eden Morgan**. Another to cut a decent slab from his previous best was **Marcus Wakim**, whose **36:15** for 8km was an improvement of nearly 90secs. Pushing him hard early was **Riley Coughlan** whose **38:08** was a very respectable 8km debut. **Grace Louey** was another big improver, earning the handicap prize for 6km with her **35:14**, while **Heather Carr** had a nice present of a handicap win – and a prize – on her birthday.

We were pleased to welcome a guest from Queensland, **Destinee Pickvance-Yee**, who had her first-ever 4km race and scored the fastest women's time on the day. We hope to see Destinee in Melbourne again for the RWA road championships on 11 September.

# TOM BOSWORTH WITHDRAWS FROM EURO CHAMPS IN MUNICH

It appears that Britain's **Tom Bosworth** has decided to called time early on his international career, after pulling out of the European Athletics championships that have just commenced in Munich, Germany.

"It's with a very heavy heart I've decided to withdraw from the European Championships in Munich," he announced today on Facebook. "This was due to be my final major championships. Throughout my career I have treated competing for my country an absolute honour, and one not to be taken for granted."

"Despite a lot of hard work, from both myself and my team, to get me race fit, I still feel a very long way from my best and putting my body through a 20km will just be a challenge in itself."

"I wish everyone involved in the team the best of luck and to enjoy a championships that will no doubt be brilliant!"

"I'll hopefully see lots of you on August 29th in Tonbridge for my farewell race, where it all began."

Bosworth, who has struggled to rebound from illness this year and had what, for him, was a disappointing result in last week's Commonwealth 10,000m in

Birmingham, had already announced that he will walk his last race on his home track at Tonbridge Harriers at the end of

Birmingham, had already announced that he will walk his last race on his home track at Tonbridge Harriers at the end of the month. But he would have wanted to wear the Union Jack one more time in a major international, and to do well in it. Clearly, however, the signs were not good. It was an unfortunate way to end a distinguished international career that included one of the most enthralling contests of the 2018 Gold Coast Commonwealth Games ... the 20km shootout between Bosworth and Australia's Dane Bird-Smith, undecided until the Birdman's last 200m surge.

As a new life direction, including marriage and a career path outside athletics, approaches, we congratulate Tom on his achievements and for being a such a fine ambassador for the sport, at home and abroad – and we wish him all the best for the future.

Walkers were joined by Sparkhill Harrier race walker **Hilary Mann** who finished third overall in 10.35.

Kevin Le Noury, ahead of Mick Le Sauvage in second and Stuart Le Noury in third, won the Jubilee Tankard for the handicap section of the series.


