** WALKER OF THE WEEK **



The multitude that assembled at Middle Park last Sunday for the Australian Winter Walks titles were treated to a feast of high-calibre performances, so much so that picking a single WOTW was impossible. It's rare that four walkers get it, but it's hard to argue against this week's selection of **Samantha Findlay** (SA), **Marcus Wakim** (VIC), **Will Bottle** (TAS) and **Bailey Housden** (QLD).

Sam has built a solid foundation of condition over the winter, and her 2:27 PB of **1:47:19** over 20km is a fine culmination of hard training and focused racing. We'd seen evidence of her stamina in Canberra and her walk on Sunday confirmed it. The prospect of Sam taking on the 35km is compelling – if that's in her plans we're sure she'd do well at it.

We at Middle Park have watched **Marcus's** performances throughout the winter and anticipated something special in these championships. He delivered, big time, with a 51sec PB of **44:22**, and he is now knocking on the door of the elite.

No less impressive is **Will**, whose consistently fast results over 5 and 10km with the TRWC have been attained virtually as solo time trials and who leapt at the opportunity to match himself against Marcus. Coached now by Jared Tallent, Will succeeded with a big 56 sec PB for silver in **45:52**. An international future beckons.

Bailey was another to make the most of the competition on offer, this time in the 'marquee' event, the U16 Boys 5km, taking bronze in 21:56 – an enormous improvement of 1:36 which has catapulted him to a new level. Obviously another star of the future.

Well done to Sam, Marcus, Will and Bailey. All thoroughly deserving WsOTW!

*Honourable mentions (Gosh, where do you start?)

- Sienna Pitcher (NSW) a dominant performance in the U16 5km with a PB time of 24:41.
- Ela Uzun (VIC) you can't do much better than out-distance your opposition by over a minute in a 2km race!
- Elizabeth McMillen (NSW) equally dominant, her new 10km PB time of **48:13** rounds off a highly successful season of racing.

- Nicholas Christian (ACT) a 1:34 PB time of 14:48 in the U14 3km, followed up immediately by his first-ever 5km to assist ACT in the Teams competition.
- Anika Clarke (QLD) A PB of 0:59 for a time of 26:32, which almost got her a medal.
- Lily Bowkett (VIC) and Isla Banks (NSW) both scored big improvements in the 1km, Lily by 1:28 and Isla by 0:58, which won her 3rd place.
- Damian Baldy (VIC) a huge 0:49 PB to break through the 15:00 barrier with 14:59 in the U14 3km.
- Taylah Morris (QLD) another to benefit from the occasion and the competition with a PB of 0:54 in the U16 5km.
- Katica Borsic (WA) a PB by over a minute in a 3km race is always noteworthy. Katica was impressive in cutting her time by 1:04 to 16:21.

NATIONAL WINTER WALKS C'SHIPS, Sunday 11 September - Melbourne



After two pandemic-driven postponements, the nation's race walkers were able finally to assemble for the Australian Winter Walks championships, 2022 edition. The VRWC's Middle Park headquarters buzzed with the enthusiasm of over 120 walkers of all ages, resplendent in State uniforms and keen to try themselves out against quality opposition. Their efforts would produce 45 personal best results, most of them substantial, and numerous tight, hard-fought contests.

Melbourne's weather – always the joker in the pack when the best-laid plans are in place – treated us kindly on this occasion. A chilly wind presented the only challenge and an incentive to move fast!

** EVENT 1 OPEN MEN 20KM

Declan Tingay predictably won this race in a leisurely **1:31:36**, no doubt relishing release from the pressures of a hard international season and enjoying the company around him. **Dylan Richardson** kept him honest at the end, finishing only 2 secs adrift for silver, with a determined **Kim Mottrom** throwing everything he had at them and taking a clear 3rd. The Northern Territory's sole rep, Masters walker **Mario Vicente**, scored an impressive PB, with **Geromi Tucker** recording **1:50:35** in an impressive 20km debut.

Toyne, equaling his PB, had a mere 6 sec margin over Coughlan at the end, with Housden taking a huge step up as all three finished in under 22mins. That fine sub-23min times by **John Ronan** and **Kodi Clarkson** weren't enough to earn them medals indicates the high standard in this age group.

Genuine talent was also evident in the rest of the field, and it's to be hoped that the boys will have every opportunity and incentive to develop their full potential as they progress towards the senior ranks.

And a pat on the back to **Nicholas Christian** who backed up without a break after his U14 3km win to help his ACT side take the Teams award, despite never having raced 5km before.
