Ela Uzun, 11, enjoying her best road season so far, brought it to a close in the best possible way at Mentone on Sunday with a Club record hat-trick – U12, U13 and U14 – to easily win this week's WOTW award.

Ela's 5000m track time of 25:17 not only set an inaugural Club U12 record ... it also wiped out Darcey Roberts's dual U13 and U14 marks by 14 secs. Confining her racing to the 1km to 3km distances (with occasional forays into 5km), Ela has formidable natural speed that she is using the shorter distances to hone to a keen edge. With a summer of track racing approaching, Ela has the potential to make serious inroads on records outside the VRWC's list. As long as she continues to love the sport and keeps learning, that potential can surely be realised.

Congratulations, Ela! An excellent season of racing.

- Havana Ali (VIC) While often in the shadows of older cousin Ela, Havana has been quietly going about her own progression, on this occasion claiming a new U11 5000m record time.

Happy 100th Birthday, VRWC



They came from near and far. Some looked older, some as young as they'd always been. Some looked trim and fit, others carried weight for age. All were smiling, delighted at meeting up with old friends and former club mates once more ... which is what the VRWC Centenary celebration lunch was all about: being in each other's company again for an occasion that – for those present, at least – will not occur again.

Postponed from 2021 (the Club's true centenary year) due to COVID restrictions, the 100th birthday celebration arrived right after presentations for the AA & RWA National Winter Walks championships, held that morning on our home course. It was fitting that the VRWC's 100th birthday was celebrated on a day when the Club was hosting athletes from all over the country. A number of interstate visitors, post-races, joined us for lunch, and no doubt more would have done but for the need to make plane flights home. Those who did stay added to the vibrant atmosphere of fellowship, camaraderie and reconnection.

The 150-plus attendees – including faces not seen for years and even decades, among them Varel Newmark, Allan and Suzanne Minter, Barry Birtchnell, Bill and Deb Dyer, Bruce Conboy, Clarrie Jack, Kellie Wapshott, Kevin Lowden, Willi Sawall and Murray Dickinson - enjoyed a superb and plentiful lunch, provided by Francesca and her Muse Events team, before resuming quizzes on each others' lives, introductions to new family members and tales of past walking feats, mishaps ('that judge always hated me!' etc) and shenanigans on trips.

Of particular delight was the presence of VRWC judging coordinator **Peter Vysma**. Readers will have followed reports on Peter's recovery from a cycling fall last October that resulted in near fatal neural damage. Peter, now wheelchair-bound and cared for by his brother Robin, was unofficial guest of honour, chatting with numerous fellow judges and racing clubmates. In his signature white terry-towelling hat, he looked almost as if he'd never been away!

Many took time out from socializing to peruse the wealth of archival documents provided by Tim Erickson – scrapbooks of press clippings, biographies, old race reports, histories, race walking manuals and other books (most of them irreplaceable), framed photos of early club teams, file copies of 'Heel & Toe' going back to 1934 and its sometime successor, 'VRWC News' – along with letters of good wishes from invitees who couldn't make it.

Highly appreciated was a projected loop of photos Tim had prepared, containing images of individual walkers and teams in chronological order, from the Club's earliest years to the present, then back again. It was fun seeing viewers calling to friends in anticipation of one particular image or another that "should be up after this next one", piquing interest and evoking nostalgia for racing days now gone.

A short series of addresses were given by **Stu Cooper** (reflecting on personages such as Alf Robinson, Norm Goble and Charlie Jacobsen, who ran the club when he'd first joined as a junior), **Bob Gardiner** (courses and racing venues through the years) and **Mark Donahoo**, who, as Club historian, was well placed to comment on the Club's life and what it has meant to him over the years. **Terry O'Neill** and **Varel Newmark** (one of the VAWC's top walkers in the 60s and 70s) added amusing anecdotes alongside their recollections of their best years in the sport and the club. Lastly came a piece-to-camera from Tim himself (who couldn't be at the proceedings owing to a prior commitment), expressing his own feelings about a club and sport that had been such a huge part of his life since 1966.

There was one more commitment before cutting the birthday cake (prepared with wonderful professionalism by **Margaret Hay**). On a signal, all attendees were herded outside onto the course for a short 'cake walk', with all finishers receiving a mini-certificate that served as their ticket to a slice of Margaret's delicious creation. Bob Gardiner did the cutting honours, the eager throng waiting with only slowly diminishing impatience for their piece. Eventually, everyone left, taking with them a special commemorative coffee mug, full tummies and smiling, happy faces.

The five men – Frank O'Rourke, Bill Murray, Rex Merrick, Fred O'Grady and Bert Gardiner – who, in 1921, met at Hooker's Café in Swanston St to revive the disbanded Victorian Amateur Walkers and Field Games Club, would scarcely have entertained any notion of the re-booted club lasting 100 years. Not all sporting clubs make it to a Centenary. That our Club has done it, despite the niche nature of our sport and the incessant assaults upon it, is testament to the enduring vision of those who, over a century, have held the reins

at the VRWC. It is a commentary on the competitive and social structures built up and maintained by dedicated generations of hard-working officials and helpers, loyal and enthusiastic walkers of all standards and, of course, high-achieving athletes who've represented us and their country with distinction on the world stage. (As Mark Donahoo reminded us, if there is one particular crowning achievement among the international accolades our Club has earned, it may well be this ... that the VAWC/VRWC has had an Olympic representative *in every Olympics* since London 1948! If that's not a selling point, what is?)

VRWC VMA 5000m track c'ships & Club events, 18 September - Mentone

A cold northerly wind greeted the 19 walkers who gathered at Dolomore Reserve track in Mentone for the Vic Masters 5000m championships and Club races - our final winter fixture for 2022. Despite the small fields - which led to the men's and women's races being amalgamated into one – the Masters who attended were hard at it in the conditions and their results were well-earned.

Kylie Irshad and **Kevin Cassidy** easily took fastest times to win their divisions with **29:20** and **27:43** respectively. It was also good to see **Clyde Riddoch** back on the track after overcoming health issues, clocking **39:23**. **Heather Carr**, **32:11**, showed good form in the W70-74 and is no doubt gearing up for another successful track season.

The Club events saw some fast performances, none more eye-catching than that of 11yo **Ela Uzun** who stepped up to 5000m and claimed 3 club records (U12, U13 and U14) with an excellent **25:17**. Cousin **Havana Ali** inaugurated an U11 club record with her speedy **29:24** over a challenging distance against the strong wind. Alejandro Stephens, having built a solid condition base over the winter and now working on his speed, smashed his 5km PB with 24:29 with Grace Louey just sneaking in under the 30min barrier.

In the 3000m, **Maddison Nash's 16:45** was a creditable time that will come down considerably as she rebuilds her fitness over summer. **Kylie Irshad** doubled up after the Masters and her **16:52** shows she's in good form. **Riley Coughlan** was in sight of a 3000m PB for much of the way, in the end falling short by only 3secs with **13:09** although it would no doubt be his fastest track time to date.

FRANCE: 69th 28 Heures de Roubaix, 17/18 September - Roubaix

The start in Roubaix: Despite the clouds, Emmanuel enjoys his 'moment au soleil'

The northern French industrial city of Roubaix has been the site of athletic challenges for decades – witness the famed (and feared) Paris-Roubaix pro cycling classic, for one. Roubaix has also been a longtime host of endurance race walking, with the esteemed 28 Hour ultra walking race attracting walkers from all over Europe (and beyond), keen to test their mettle. Here, **Emmanuel Tardi** reports on the latest edition of this classic race.

This weekend I was in Roubaix for the 69th **28 Heures de Roubaix**. The race was held in perfect conditions on a 2km lap in the Parc Barbieux. Start was Saturday at 11am.

The meet also included the French 100km Walk Championship. **Florian Letourneau** and **Fabien Deparday** (winner in 2019-2020-2021) walked together till 20km, then Deparday decelerated. Letourneau reached the 50k in 4h56, but reduced his speed after 60k. He won the 100k in **10h53.50**.

In the women 100km, **Morgane Ausello** (2018 50k champion and 2021 24h champion) easily won the race in a very good time (**11h46.40**).

When the 100k was finished, there were only the 28-hour walkers on the road. Local walkers **David Vandercoilden** and **Yves-Michel Kerlau** finished 1 and 2. In the women's 28 hours, **Sylvie Maison** walked more than 200km and finished 2nd in mixed ranking and won easily in women's ranking.
