The latest winner of the WOTW award comes from November 12, Round 5 of the ANSW Treloar Shield, where 15yo Isaac Beacroft turned on a scorching display to take the U18 3000m in 11:47.34 – a PB of 0:53. (He had walked 12:40 on two previous occasions this year.)

Although it's unlikely, unfortunately, that his time will be considered for a record owing to the presence of only three judges, Isaac has made a huge statement along with huge progress, and it's clear that the record is there for the taking if all conditions are met. It's interesting that Isaac's father, David, was also a top junior 24 years ago. Indeed, one of Isaac's 12:40s came in September at the NSW All Schools – the same meet at which his dad also broke walking records in the 90s.

#### \*Honourable mentions

Elizabeth McMillen (NSW) – a 45sec PB for 5000m in the same Treloar Shield meet, clocking in at an excellent 22:41.66. A hard winter's racing is paying off!

Well done, Isaac! We will watch your progress over the summer with great interest.

- Marcus Wakim (VIC) Marcus's 5km road time of 21:22.1 last Sunday will be new AA U16 and U18 records if ratified. Oh, and a PB for 3000m at AVSL the previous day for good
- Jaime Hvalica (VIC, U14) a near-2min PB at any distance is impressive, more so over 3000m in your first AVSL season!
- Will Thompson (VIC) an 18sec PB for 10km on Sunday, recording 40:42 after an injuryaffected year.
- Sophie Polkinghorne (NSW, 12yo) Smashed her 3000m PB by 35secs at the Treloar meeting, recording 14:16.91
- Nellie Langford, Sam Findlay, Sebastian Richards (SA) and Oliver Morgan (TAS) all recorded strong PBs in their respective Interclub comps at the weekend.

# CLUB NEWS and RESULTS

#### VRWC 2022-23 Summer championships, 20 November - Middle Park

Between the overnight deluge and the midday squalls, a window of reasonable (if chilly) weather permitted us to hold the Summer championships unimpeded. After a delayed start owing to the need to clear a flooded stretch of the course (thanks Madeleine and Gerard for your broom work), events got underway for the 24 starters without further hitches.

Sarah Brennan and Alejandro Stephens took out the two Senior titles – the Heather Carr and Gus Theobald championships – with strong performances of 56:40 (10km) and 1:57:42 (20km) respectively. Marcus Wakim backed up after his 3000m PB effort at Meadowglen the previous day by posting his best 5km road time of 21:22.2 which, if ratified, will set new Australian U16 and U18 records. Riley Coughlan took advantage of Marcus's company to slingshot away for the U16 3km title in 12:38, while 12yo Matilda Read, walking 3km for the first time, clocked a good first-up 18:48 in the Girls U16 race.

In winning the U12 1.5km championship with 7:10, Ela Uzun seized the last two Club records for the distance she had yet to break. (The next is held by Heather Carr in the W65+ age group, and I think Heather has little to fear for a while.) Levi Robertson claimed the Boys title with a 9sec PB of 8:02, while the U10 1km championships went to Haris Ali in 7:22, and Jaida Robertson in 6:10.

Finally, we were pleased to welcome newcomer **Mackenzie Davis**, who made the long trip from Shepparton to try out with us and went home with a 1.5km bronze medal. We hope to see Mackenzie at Middle Park again before long.

Meadowglen, notorious for its north winds at the best of times, turned on a doozie last Saturday – much to the frustration of the officials struggling valiantly to keep paperwork and equipment from ending up on the M80 Ring road. That said, many of the walkers seemed to appreciate having something to push against, with several PBs resulting on a day not ideal for them.

Of these, **Jaime Hvalica's** was the walk of the day, his **15:57.5** for 3000m an enormous 1:53 improvement over a distance he'd walked only once before, in October. **Marcus Wakim** and **Jade Chitty** also defied the gale to produce their best 3000 results. Marcus's **12:31.3** would be the first leg of an impressive weekend double, completed the following morning at Middle Park. **Char Hay** produced her usual attacking effort to dip under 15mins for 2<sup>nd</sup>.

Riley Coughlan again won clearly, this time over 1500m. Behind him, Mya McClure impressed in her first AVSL race with a 4 sec PB time of 7:47.4.

## INTERNATIONAL NEWS

### UNITED KINGDOM: Bernie Hercock & 95th Enfield Open 7, 13 November - Enfield

Thanks to **Ron Wallwork** for this latest report on a key fixture on the ERWL program. A race lasting for 95 editions indicates some status, and one can imagine many of the luminaries of UK walking who'd have contested the event over many decades.

In near perfect conditions Daniel Saunders (Bernie Hercock's grandson) sent the twenty-six walkers

on their way. **George Wilkinson** and **Dave Annetts** sped ahead of the main field passing the mile marker in 7.43 with two-time Olympian **Neringa Masilioneon** (nee' Aidietyte), the RWA Long distance champion **Jonathan Hobbs, Jacqueline Benson** and Masters' champion **Ian Richards** a quarter of a minute behind. Wilkinson pulled away over the last mile and a half to join his brother **Callum** as a winner of this event.
