**** WALKER OF THE WEEK ****

Breaking a long-standing national record leaves you with not too much else to do to win WOTW, an honour shared this time around by **Declan Tingay** (WA) and **Marcus Wakim** (VIC).

As described in detail in the race report below, Declan consigned David Smith's 38yo 10,000m record to history with a formidable display, clocking **38:03.78** to win the second Supernova 10 at the AIS in Canberra last Thursday.

Marcus, relishing the intensity of a high-altitude training camp, then exalted competitive company on the AIS track, pushed himself to the limit to eclipse Doug Connolly's 1999 U18 record of 42:40.54 by 19secs, posting a new mark of **42:21.92**.

Congratulations to Dec and Marcus. The year is yet young,

and we wish you both all the best in attaining your goals.

An impressive turnout of 31 walkers, spread almost evenly among the two distances, produced some standout results at Mt Evelyn. Conditions were humid after heavy overnight and morning rain, but the cooler temperatures agreed with most competitors.

In the 1500m young **Jaime Hvalica** took charge from the gun, winning by nearly a minute with a new PB time of **7:19.1**. Jaime's Diamond valley clubmate **Lucy Johns**, racing in AVSL for the first time, made an excellent debut over the distance, and both look set for good performances in the upcoming LAVic Region and State championships. **Lewis McLennan**, too, was in speedy form as was **Bob Gardiner**, whose **11:47.4** sundered the VRWC M85 record set by Bob's Collingwood clubmate (and fellow Olympian) George Knott back in 1995.

AROUND THE COUNTRY

A.C.T. Supernova #2 (WA Race Walking Tour 2023 Silver meet), Thursday 2 February – AIS, Canberra

After the Supernova #1 race in January and the subsequent altitude training camp at Perisher Valley – not to mention the metabolic research into the effects on female walkers of low energy levels at altitude – anticipation was high of something special at last Thursday's Race #2. With elite competitors from 14 nations attending, two superb contests, at the very least, were expected. Neither disappointed. Nine local walkers recorded PBs, most by emphatic margins, and the 'Oz v. the World' match-ups made the races all the more engrossing as they progressed.

At the apex was **Declan Tingay's** National record-breaking **38:03.78**, a result that places him 9th on the WA All-time best performances for the 10,000m track walk. The previous record, set by David Smith in 1985, had withstood challenges from the cream of Australia's walkers for 38 years. But as fields of depth and speed have grown in recent decades – with the added stimulus of Supernova intensity – its days were clearly numbered, although, as the 17sec margin indicates, it didn't go without a fight. **Perseus Karlstrom**, who missed the first race through illness, made up for it here by pushing Tingay hard until 6km. His reward was to be the only competitor not lapped by the West Australian!

Behind Declan, **Marcus Wakim** claimed an Australian record of his own to break the U18 mark. At age 16, Marcus has plenty of time to lower the record further. Seeing the young talent among his peers on the track, race walking fans have every reason to be optimistic about the future.

Not breaking records but still dominating, **Jemima Montag** put her opposition on the rack after the 4km mark in what was virtually a rerun of Supernova #1, winning in **43:46.01** from dual European champion **Antigoni Ntrismpioti**. Over four weeks including an intense altitude training camp, a total of only 13secs separated these two champions. A number of women were laboring under the effects of low-energy diets from the study and, as expected, were a little down on their best, but the competition was still hot as each strove to wring from their legs every drop of gain from their return to sea level.

By far the best U20 women's result came from the ever-improving **Allanah Pitcher**, whose **46:39.37** was a huge stride forward. Allanah is entered for the AA 20km at Fawkner Park and looks set to eclipse her 1:42:36 previous best.

TINGAY MARCHES INTO HISTORY AS RECORDS TUMBLE AT SUPERNOVA 2

Australian race walking stars **Declan Tingay** and **Jemima Montag** made it back-to-back wins in the World Athletics Race Walking Tour with dominant performances at Supernova 2, led by Tingay's stunning Australian record of **38:03.78** over 10,000m and an Under 18 record by **Marcus Wakim**.

Shattering David Smith's national record of 38:20.9 set in 1985, Tingay marched into history as Australia's fastest ever race walker over 10,000m – showing the world-class field at the Australian Institute of Sport a clean pair of heels on Thursday night.

Beating home three-time World Championships medallist **Perseus Karlstrom** of Sweden and Canadian Olympic medallist **Evan Dunfee**, the 23-year-old coached by Brent Vallance was dominant in clinching the win and record on home soil – even surprising himself.

"There was something on the cards tonight! The plan was never to pace it that aggressively but I just committed to it early and followed through with it, unrelenting pressure was the theme of today. I wasn't expecting to hold it together but we built a substantial buffer," Tingay said.

"Each lap I was looking at the judging board and following what the judges are thinking and if the judges are happy, I keep up the pace, and if they are not then I reconsider," Tingay said.

Carving 39-seconds off his previous personal best of 38:42.33 set when winning silver at the 2022 Birmingham Commonwealth Games, Tingay reaped the rewards of a four week training block at altitude in the Perisher Valley as part of the Supernova initiative.

"I just love it. I always say that no one comes out of a Supernova camp worse off than when they went in, and that held up as the truth this month. Having Perseus and Rhydian breathing down my neck is pretty motivating, it gets you going faster," Tingay said.

The brilliance of 16-year-old **Marcus Wakim** (Adam Garganis) was on display with an national record of his own, becoming the fastest Under 18 Australian race walker over 10,000m with his performance of **42:21.92**, eclipsing Doug Connolly's 1999 mark of 42:40.54.

Jemima Montag (Brent Vallance) sailed to her second win of the Supernova series with a punishing burst over the closing kilometres, stretching away from some of the world's premier women to win in a time of 43:46.01.

Montag finished ahead of Greece's double European champion Antigoni Ntrismpioti and Spain's Raquel Gonzalez, also defeating training partner and Olympic silver medallist Sandra Lorena Arenas of Colombia. The Commonwealth champion flexed her early season form after a strong training block in the Perisher Valley, where she trained alongside 20 of the world's best race walkers as part of an Australian led study into the impact of nutrition on adaptation to altitude training for women.

The Australian race walking fraternity will now turn its attention to the Australian 20km Championships at Melbourne's Fawkner Park on Sunday February 12, and while many of the internationals are extending their stay down under to race, Tingay plans to continue his dominance.

"I am always confident. The national 20km is a chance for me to punch the clock, show up and get it done. This result definitely sets me up for some good potential over 20km, I think I will give the 35km another crack but the focus for me is Budapest this year," Tingay said.

AUSTRALIA & OCEANIA 20KM ROAD WALK C'SHIPS Fawkner Park, Melbourne – Sunday 12 February PREVIEW

Uplifting as the Supernova races were, they were of course an appetizer. The main course will be served at Fawkner Park next Sunday – the first international meeting of major players over 20km for 2023. Two class fields will do battle, with the outcome in no way certain for either ... the way it should be.

With **Declan Tingay** in the form of his life and **Percy Karlstrom** not far off his, the men's race looks like a two-man duel on paper. But discount **Rhydian Cowley, Evan Dunfee, Kyle Swan** and **Marius Ziukas** at your peril – any of that bunch will be ready to pounce should Tingay or Karlstrom falter.

The two Supernova '10s' showed, amongst other things, just how little separates **Jemima Montag** and her closest rival, **Antigoni Ntrismpioti** in class. Montag has the edge in youthful speed and can destroy a field with a lethal surge – Ntrismpioti has both speed and the power to grind down her opposition as the distance gets longer. Throw in **Raquel Gonzalez** and **Sandra Lorena Arenas**, and the odds of a much closer contest than in the Supernovas shorten considerably. That Jemima will launch an attack – bar anything untoward – is certain; whether her rivals will allow any gap to stick or grow over 20km is the tantalizing question for fans.

Marcus Wakim will carry his record-breaking form into the U20 10km, while the battle behind him between Will Bottle, Fraser Saunder and Magnus Graesli (Norway) should be an absorbing contest. Nellie Langford, with her Supernova experience, looks hard to beat in the women's U20 10km.

Owen Toyne, Scott Peart and **Samuel Lindsay** will fight out the men's U18 5km placings, with Toyne a clear favourite, while not much may separate **Grace Beck** and **Maddison Nash** in the women's race.

All in all, there is probably little else on the sporting front that offers such contests of class – free of charge – for the casual spectator as well as the hardened athletic fan on a quiet Sunday morning in Melbourne. We can hardly wait!
