
This issue's WOTW award is shared once again, this time between two of the country's most exciting young up-and-comers.

Last Saturday, Ela Uzun (VIC, 11yo), racing in the Northern Metro Region Little Athletics titles, sped through 1500m in 6:30.54. This set new U12 records for both NMR and Victorian Little Athletics, and would have been a National record had it been done in a State championship race.

Needless to say, Ela also rewrote the VRWC record book, with her time eclipsing the Club U12, U13 (formerly Bec Henderson's) and U14 (formerly Jemima Montag's) marks.

The second recipient has earned it less on speed than on the size of her improvement. Kaytee Bogaers (WA), having progressed steadily in WARWC and Athletics West competition during 2022, put it all together in Perth interclub last Friday night to improve by nearly 11/2 minutes, clocking 25:57.13 for 5000m. With this result, Kaytee steps up to another level and should approach the coming national T&F titles in Brisbane with confidence.

Congratulations Ela and Kaytee. Wonderful results!

Following a stellar month of 10km racing, **Marcus Wakim** put on a speed clinic in the 3000m to slash his PB by 27secs to record **12:04.0**, easily the fastest 3000m in the country in any age group so far this year. Marcus is entered for the U18 5000m at the AV track titles next week, so on this display he could be adding another record to his growing tally.

The improving **Kate Siviour** was another in PB form, recording **14:24.7**, while **Char Hay** showed she'd rebounded well after her first 20km race last Sunday with **14:57.6** ... not far off her own PB.

UNITED KINGDOM: British Athletics Indoor c'ships, 18-19 February - Birmingham

Thanks to **Mark Wall** (who judged in these championships) for sending through the results and the report by British Athletics:

In the Men's walk final, **Callum Wilkins**on was in impressive form over 3000m as he clocked that world lead of **11:00.98**. He powered his way around the fresh new Birmingham track to win by almost over a minute ahead of **Chris Snook** (Andi Drake; Aldershot Farnham & District) in second while **Luc Legon** (Noel Carmody; Bexley) was another 47 seconds behind in third.

Wilkinson said: "It's my first indoor title, I have missed the last few through injury so it's a great achievement to come here and get the win. I spoke to my coach about the times I want to achieve, but the main thing is to stay injury free as currently I'm in great shape and feel like I can achieve a lot this season."

In the women's 3000m walk, **Abigail Jennings** (Verity Snook; Aldershot Farnham & District) posted a career best of **13:40.33** to take the win. She said afterwards, "I'm feeling so good right now, it feels great to be UK champion once again. I just tried to stay out of trouble as best as I could and then when the final 1km came up, I knew it was time to push. The personal best was a great surprise."


