It was a weekend for speedy youth, with the Little Athletics championships season in full swing around the country. A number of eye-catching efforts resulted, as they will no doubt do next week as other states hold their championships.

This week, WOTW ventures across Bass Strait once more. **Samuel Lindsay**, 15yo, set a new Tasmanian State record of **5:52.53** for 1500m in his final Little Athletics championship. It was also a PB by 34secs, which is impressive at any level. This, following on from his first sub-13min 3000m earlier this year, shows how everything is coming together for this committed young walker. Well done, Sam, and good luck in Brisbane.

#### \*Honourable mentions

- Ela Uzun (VIC) with the LAVic State championships providing the requisite judging panel, Ela made no mistake in taking the U12 Victorian record from Rebecca Henderson as well as the U13 record from Jemima Montag with her time of **6:34.14**.
- Riley Coughlan (VIC) the only U16 boy in the LAVic titles, Riley made onlookers take notice by whipping round the track for a 16sec PB time of 6:03.51.
- **John Ronan (WA)** another PB for John, who lowered his 3000m time again in Athletics West interclub with **12:18.73** ... a 17sec improvement.
- Max Davidson and Daniel Pashutin (VIC) big 1500m PBs (24secs and 25secs) in taking 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> in the U14 title, with **6:49.00** and **6:55.97**.

The Fixture is out. The Winter season of 2023 is there, mapped out in black and white. Many thanks to Mark Donahoo once again for putting it all together. April 29 is the date we begin to implement the program ... to make it all happen.

It was remarked on in the Member Survey, more than once, that with regard to carrying out the Club's activities too much is left to too few. This has been of concern for a number of years now, and the concern has become more pressing as increasing outside demands – as well as Father Time – come calling on our loyal, dedicated yet slowly diminishing team.

Members, parents and supporters: the VRWC needs more helping hands! Helping in small ways (the

usual race day jobs) ... and contributing longer-term in specific, strategic roles, including Committee membership.

If the last point sounds scary, it isn't meant to be. But it's a fact that the present Committee and race-day officials aren't getting any younger, and unless this is addressed now, the VRWC (in its 102<sup>nd</sup> year of existence) faces a bleak future in which its power to provide for aspiring and established race walkers will decrease. It's a scenario we cannot let happen!

### **RACE DAY ROSTER**

The Club's race judges worked successfully to a roster system in 2022, which allowed them to pick and choose days of attendance according to their availability. We are considering a similar roster of race-day helpers and officials in 2023 and beyond, to share the load of maintaining our racing programs for the benefit of our competing members. Details of this arrangement will be announced via 'Heel & Toe', email and Facebook in coming weeks.

Don't feel intimidated by any of the tasks you see carried out week to week. None of the current list of officials or Committee members came to their roles trained in them – they learned on the job, usually with a helpful, experienced mentor handy. We will ensure you have the benefit of similar aid.

#### LONG-TERM

We know that many of our parents have built up skill sets through their children's involvement in Little Athletics, AV clubs or other sports. Many of these skills can be put to effective use in the running of the VRWC's activities, either on race days or in the organization, administration and planning for the Club's future. Come and try your hand alongside an experienced worker. Sit in on a meeting ('Zoom' these days.) Make yourself familiar with what goes into running our Club, week-to-week and long-term. Feel free to question anything you want explaining. Make positive suggestions (which is what the Survey was for.) And if you have a question, feel free to ask at any time.

We urge all supporters, parents and friends of our competing walkers to ask themselves:

- What am I doing for the Club now?
- What can I do?
- What would I like to do, even if I don't have the skills yet?
- · How can I fit such involvement into my life schedule?

How many clubs can boast a record even close to this? ... The VRWC has had its members selected for every Olympics since **1948**. Last year alone saw **nine** of its walkers represent Australia at World Teams, World Championships and Commonwealth Games. *Every one* of those elite walkers benefited from racing programs provided in their developing years by the VRWC. And that's not taking into account successes achieved by our Masters walkers overseas. None of these athletes – or hundreds of others over the decades – could have developed as they did without the dedication and willingness to go the extra yard (okay, metre!) of our valuable teams of workers at all levels.

For the sake of the future of the sport in Victoria and our athletes' prospects, we ask you to join us in making it all happen.

### LAVic State T&F championships, 11/12 March - Lakeside Stadium

Fine, warm weather featured for the biggest fixure on the LAVic calendar – the State T&F championships – and the walking races were intensely competitive. A broad spectrum of abilities and technical skill, as well as speed and fitness, were on show. Many young athletes demonstrated those qualities to the extent that it was hard not to conclude that this is the sport they were born to do, while others showed competence enough to indicate that they at least enjoyed race walking. While many, if not most, engage in team sports and other pursuits in the winter, it's our challenge to get as many as possible to come down and try their hand at the VRWC road races ... and, of course, to sign up.

The highlight of the day was **Ela Uzun's** winning time of **6:34.14**, which sundered the U12 Victorian and Australian best Performances. It also surpassed Jemima Montag's U13 and Eliza Clarke's U14 best times, although since Ela is outside those age groups their marks may still stand. For his part, **Riley Coughlan** – the only U16 boys' entrant – came to within less than a second of Nicola Mandic's age group record with his **6:03.51**.

# TASMANIA Little Athletics Tasmania T&F c'ships, 12 March – St Leonards

Thanks to David Moore for forwarding this report by Rosemary Coleman on the Tasmanian LA's titles:

A wonderful display of Race Walkers was on show today at the Tasmanian Little Athletics State Championships. Nearly 60 walkers from the State walked in perfect conditions in the North of the State.

Our small band of TRWC walkers were impressive, with all recording personal bests and claiming top three placings. A brilliant walk by **Sam Lindsey** saw him taking the U15 1500mW State Record in \*5.52.53 in his last LA race. Special mention to both **Macy Devine** 7.55.34 and **Eva Parker** 8.05.46 who achieved well deserved spots in the State Little Athletics team to contest the National Little Athletic Championships. Both girls walked personal best times for 1500m to finish 1st and 2nd.

Not to be outdone by the girls, young **Jacob Wass** also has a spot in team.

Jacob, who has only just started walking, won the U13 event in a new 1500mW pb 9.09.05.

Lani Broad had a great walk achieved a pb and winning the U15 event in 8.28.32. Lily Carr walked strongly to win the U14 event just shy of her pb. Lily is also off with a group of U14 athletes to a Melbourne training camp to further her walking.

Next up was **Lucas Carr**, who also picked up silver in a new pb in the U12 1500W event in **10.07.22**. **Cacia Charles** walked a great race in winning the U12 event in a new pb for 1500W in **8.26.43**. A wonderful young talent.

In the U11 age group **Adele Woodward** walked a very courageous race recoding a huge personal best and the Gold in U11 1100mW event with a time of **6.31.26**. Not to be outdone, club mate **Isla Direen** picking up a very creditable silver in the U10 girls 1100mW in a new pb. **7.38.06** and arguably the best technique on the day.

Last but not least, our youngest walker, Elsie Woodward, albeit with a smile the whole way, won the silver in the U9 700mW event Another huge pb, 4.38.68

As a coach and judge I was super proud of all the walkers.

Thanks to all our judges and assistants on the day with special mention to Will Bottle who filled in a spot at the last minute.

# INTERNATIONAL NEWS

### VALE RICHARD DOUGLAS 'DICK' FOSBURY 1947 - 2023

**Dick Fosbury** – the man who took the high jump and turned it into a whole new event – has died, aged 76.

There have been many athletes who have taken their events to levels unheard of – think Jesse Owens, Emil Zatopek, Al Oerter and Usain Bolt, to name just four – but nobody, surely, has had such a revolutionary, transformative effect on an event as Fosbury had on the high jump, breaking it free from the restrictive 'straddle' with a looping, backward leap which must have had orthopaedists reaching for tranquilisers. ('You can't teach children *that!*') Today, visit Little Athletics clubs all over the country and see them training for high jump, using Fosbury's 'flop' without a thought for the fears of yesterday.

Unable to coordinate his limbs sufficiently in high school to succeed at the straddle, Fosbury began experimenting with alternatives. "I knew I had to change my body position," he recalled, "and that's what started first the revolution, and over the next two years, the evolution." It was not easy, considering the uninviting landing surfaces provided in those days which were best suited to jumpers landing on their

feet or all-fours. The advent of foam pits opened the gates, however, and by the time the 1968 Olympics arrived Fosbury had his technique down pat. He won the gold in Mexico, largely because he cleared every height on the first attempt and nobody else could. The high jumping world had witnessed an exhilarating technical *coup d'etat*, and there was no going back.

It may seem strange to be writing a tribute to a high jumper in a race walking publication – the two events' relationships with the ground being diametrically opposed (well, supposedly). But many of us in *Heel & Toe's* readership are athletics fans

Among the right ones must be Bob Beamon's 29ft. long jump, Christoph Hohne's 10min margin in the 50km walk, Kip Keino's dominance of Jim Ryun in the 1500m ... and the day a gangly college student from Oregon changed the high jump forever.
