This squad, while certainly high-calibre, is pretty light-on for numbers with many events (the younger age groups in particular) having no Victorian presence at all.

There's still a window open for entries until **5pm tomorrow**, and as mentioned above there is no longer a late fee. So, if you're undecided and it's still a feasible proposition for you, take the opportunity to enter now and wear the VRWC colours at Stromlo Forest Park, to bolster our Brennan Shield campaign!

A total of 31 starters took advantage of another beautiful autumn afternoon to race on the 2km course for the first time this season. Most walkers appreciated the opportunity to stretch out on the longer northern loop sections and some excellent times resulted.

Paris Olympian **Kyle Swan** made one of his (these days) infrequent trips to Middle Park to contest the 8km, a distance he hasn't raced since 2022. His 2:04 PB of **31:55** was no surprise as he would have done faster *en route* to some of his quickest 10km times. **Alejandro Stephens** bounced back well from his 35km debut last week for a PB of his own, by 41secs for **40:28**.

Mark Blackwood's white fibres were firing quickly, giving him a snappy **28:30** win over 6km. **Max Davidson's** first outing on the 2km course saw him clock an impressive 4km time of **19:30** ahead of **Angus Shuttleworth** whose **20:57** smashed his PB by over a minute. **Ariana Pashutina** has made a positive start to the season and on this occasion took the female 4km points convincingly with **21:16**.

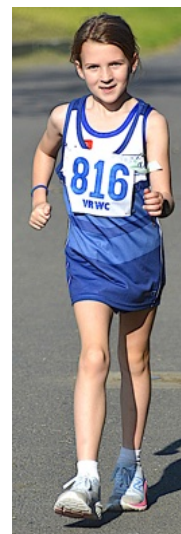
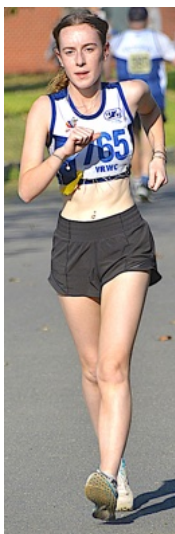

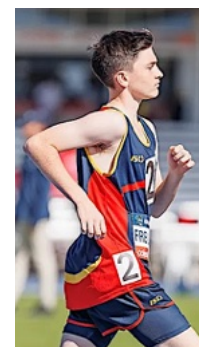
AROUND THE COUNTRY

** WALKER OF THE WEEK **

When somebody rips over 7 minutes from a PB at any distance, that's a measure of improvement to make anyone sit up and take notice; it is usually only achievable through hard work. Such must be the case with South Australia's **Liam Freundt**, who clocked **29:10** – a PB by 7:34! – to win the U16 State title in the SA Road Walk championships last weekend. Liam's performance earns him the SARWC's second WOTW in succession.

First attracting notice in the ASA T&F championships, winning the U16 3000m title, and later the Australian U16 3000m in which he took bronze, Liam was a consistent racer throughout the SA interclub season and improved steadily. Now that he is increasing his distances and showing promise there, he will be a walker to watch as he gains in strength and experience.

Well done, Liam. Keep it up, and have a great season.

SLOVAKIA: Zahoracka Dvadsiatka (WA Tour Silver), 25 May – Borsky Mikulas

Linke and Ramos prevail in Slovak Silver meeting

(report reprinted from sport.sk ... 26 May)

The winners of Saturday's Záhórac 20s walking race in Borský Mikuláš were the German **Christopher Linke** with a time of **1:19:55** min and the Mexican **Sofia Ramosová** (Ramos Rodrigues) with a performance of **1:31:32** min. **Ema Hačundová** took 8th place with a time of **1:36:37** and gained important points for the World Athletics rankings.

The event had a World Athletics Tour Silver status and this attracted pedestrians from all over the world to Záhorie.

"It was definitely the best race in the history of the event. From the point of view of collecting points for the ranking, I am most satisfied with Ema's performance. According to our calculations, she will advance to the European Championships in Rome. She managed it excellently," expressed the satisfaction of the Head Coach of the Slovak Athletics Association (SAZ) Roman Benčík according to *atletika.sk*.

In addition to the Olympic twenties, Borský Mikuláš also hosted a decathlon, in which national titles were also awarded.

UNITED KINGDOM: 9th Cecil Gittins Memorial Walks (inc. ERWL) 27 May - Gravesend

Veterans AC were pleased to host the ninth running of this event on a dedicated cycle circuit which is designed like a large Scalextric set, with many gradients and bends.

In all there were 22 paid entries which was about average, with 18 on the line. The weather was ideal, with a mixture of sun and cloud cover, the predicted rain in the end never happened.

There was a new winner of the ladies 5k, **Sheila Leavy** (N Herts RR), and the men's 5k was won for the 3rd year running by the present RWA President, **Chris Hobbs** (Ashford AC).
